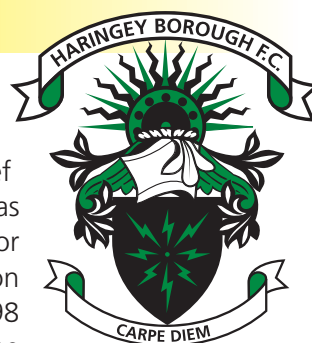

HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY



It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. After a period of instability and a year in the wilderness away from senior football they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th. in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division in 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. The Women's Team, formed in 1999 were promoted to the top Division for 2002/03 of the Eastern Region Women's League where they have had notable success over the years. In 2005/06 they were losing League Cup finalists by the odd goal of seven in a thrilling contest with Norwich City Canaries.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat to Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute.

2018/19 was to be the Club's best ever season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round

Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat disappointing that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semifinal in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval.

Last season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for most other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team was always near the top of the table.

In the 2017/18 season the Club also entered an Under 18's Youth side into the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League which will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The team won its Divisional Championship in its debut season. The Women over the years have steadily improved and were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2013/14 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. Last season, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double. The best ever season for the Women and a fitting lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome.

The foundations are in place for an eventual assault on the title to secure a National League place for the men's senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which the ability to go one better and obtain promotion to the National League at the second attempt should be within the capabilities of our talented squad, The facilities and structures are in place for all the Club's teams to improve and enhance on recent successes

2000-2001: Relegated to the third tier of English football.

2001-2002: Ian Holloway replaces Gerry Francis as Manager.

2002-2003: Losing Division Two Play-Off finalists to Cardiff City at the Millennium Stadium.

2003-2004: Runners-up in Division Two - promoted to Championship. Gianni Paladini joins the Club as Chairman.

2007-2008: Bernie Ecclestone and Flavio Briatore buy the Club, later joined by Lakshmi Mittal.

2009-2010: Neil Warnock appointed Manager.

2010-2011: Championship Champions - promoted back to the Premier League.

2011-2012: Malaysian entrepreneur Tony Fernandes buys a majority stake in the Club, along with Kamarudin Bin Meranun and Ruben Emir Gnanalingam. Mark Hughes replaces Neil Warnock as manager.

2012-2013: Harry Redknapp appointed as manager - QPR relegated to the Championship.

2013-2014: QPR win the Championship Play-Off Final. QPR promoted back to the Premier League.

2014-2015: Harry Redknapp resigns as Manager. Chris Ramsey appointed Caretaker Manager. QPR relegated to the Championship.

2015-2016: Chris Ramsey appointed Head Coach. Chris Ramsey sacked. Neil Warnock appointed Interim Head Coach. Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink appointed Manager.

2016-2017: Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink sacked. Ian Holloway returns for his second spell as Manager.

2017-2018: Ian Holloway guides QPR to a 16th placed finish in the Championship before being replaced by Steve McClaren following the conclusion of the season.

2018-19: The R's enjoy a great autumn, which sees them flirt near the play-offs, but a bad run of results sees Steve McClaren leave the club in April 2019. John Eustace takes charge for the rest of the season before Mark Warburton is appointed as Manager in May 2019.

1975-1999

1975-1976: Runners-up in Division One - Rangers qualify for UEFA Cup. Five players in the England squad, including Gerry Francis as Captain.

1978-1979: Relegated to Division Two.

1980-1981: Terry Venables appointed Manager.

1981-1982: Artificial pitch installed at Loftus Road (first in UK). QPR reach the FA Cup Final losing to Tottenham Hotspur in a replay.

1982-1983: Division Two Champions - promoted to Division One.

1983-1984: Guinness first shirt sponsors. Fifth in Division One - Club qualify for the UEFA Cup.

1985-1986: Jim Smith appointed manager. Runners-up to Oxford United in Milk (League) Cup Final at Wembley.

1986-1987: Jim Gregory sells Club to David Bulstrode. Merger with Fulham to form Fulham Park Rangers proposed and rejected.

1988-1989: Death of Bulstrode - Richard Thompson becomes Chairman.

1991-1992: Gerry Francis appointed Manager.

1992-1993: Members of the Premier League in its inaugural season.

1994-1995: Ray Wilkins appointed Player/Manager.

1995-1996: Les Ferdinand joins Newcastle United for a record fee of £6million. Club relegated to second tier.

1996-1997: Chris Wright buys club from Richard Thompson - Loftus Road PLC formed.

1998-1999: Gerry Francis reappointed Manager.

1950-1975

1950-1951: Reg Allen transfers to Manchester United for £10,000 (then a record fee for a goalkeeper).

Rangers' all-time record appearance holder Tony Ingham signs from Leeds United.

1951-1952: Relegated to Division Three (South).

1952-1953: Jack Taylor replaces Mangnall as Manager.

1953-1954: Kit colours change to all white.

1958-1959: Members of Division Three after regionalised divisions are scrapped.

1959-1960: Alec Stock replaces Taylor as Manager.

1960-1961: QPR revert back to blue and white hoops. Record 9-2 victory v Tranmere Rovers.

1961-1962: Most league goals scored in a season (111).

1962-1963: The R's move back to the White City Stadium.

1963-1964: And then back to Loftus Road just a year later!

1964-1965: Jim Gregory elected as Chairman of the Club.

1966-1967: Division Three Champions. Winners of first ever League Cup Final to be played at Wembley Stadium (QPR 3, West Bromwich Albion 2)

1967-1968: Division Two Runners-up - promoted to Division One.

1968-1969: Tommy Docherty arrives as Manager and leaves after a month. Relegated to Division Two with only 18 points (a record low at the time).

1970-1971: Gordon Jago appointed Manager.

1971-1972: Rodney Marsh capped by England.

1972-1973: Division Two Runners-up - promoted to Division One.

1973-1974: Record home league attendance of 35,353 v Leeds United.

1974-1975: Dave Sexton appointed Manager.

1931-1948

1931-1932: Rangers move to the White City Stadium. Record home gate of 41,097 v Leeds United (FA Cup).

1932-1933: First experimental floodlight match held.

1933-1934: The Club move back to Loftus Road.

1938-1939: New 'Loft' terrace opened by Herbert Morrison. Ted Vizzard appointed Manager.

1943-1944: Dave Mangnall replaces Vizzard as Manager.

1946-1947: Division Three (South) Runners-up.

1947-1948: Division Three (South) Champions - Promoted to Division Two.

1904-1927

1904-1905: QPR move to Park Royal and Neil Murphy is the Club's first international player (Republic of Ireland).

1907-1908: The R's are crowned Southern League Champions and Evelyn Lintott is QPR's first England international. QPR are also runners up in the first ever Charity Shield.

1911-1912: Rangers crowned Southern League Champions and also come runners-up in the Charity Shield.

1917-1918: The R's move to Loftus Road.

1920-1921: QPR join the Football League.

1926-1927: Club colours are changed to blue and white hoops. QPR's all-time record goalscorer George Goddard signs.

1882-1900

1882-1886: Queens Park Rangers founded after a merger of Christchurch Rangers (1882) and St. Jude's Institute (1884).

1892-1893: Green and White Hoops introduced and first trophy is won, the West London Observer Cup.

1895-1896: Rangers enter the English FA Cup for the first time.

1899-1900: Club turn professional and join the Southern League.

I have to say a huge thank you to those who have volunteered for the last couple of games, I am proud of each and every one of you who answered the call to help out when we first heard that fans would be allowed back into grounds. Without such help we really would struggle to comply with the rules placed upon us by the FA and the government. We are small in number and there are a lot of roles that need to be fulfilled on a matchday which perhaps is not easily visible to all. By way of a small example is the far side turnstiles, entry, snack bar etc all of which need to be manned now that away fans and away teams will be told that is the way in and out in these times. In the past that side of the ground was only utilised on big match days and now it will be every game. Whilst every club has been hit hard financially and slowly tries to get back to some sort of normality this new Sponsorship deal I am sure will benefit all in the long run and for the first time seems to be from a Company that does not expect a commercial gain in return and that can only be applauded. I have to say that this has been a strange build up for a new season and it does not appear to me to have been as intense as previous seasons, primarily due to the uncertainty as to when we were actually going to start and therefore the difficulty in knowing when to properly start the usual heavy pre season routine. I have previously made mention of the difficulty with recruiting players as well when there was no start date in sight. We were told unofficially that early October looked likely and we were caught a little short when that was brought forward a couple of weeks. Although we will have played less games this season that in the past many of the boys have been in attendance throughout the week and trained in small groups themselves and I have no doubt that the squad will be ready when we start. The games are going to come thick and fast, particularly with our Monday night home matches and this season more than ever sides will need more players in their squads. That has a knock on effect into training and pre season matches as everyone needs game time so to juggle with over 22 players has been difficult. You will have seen the matches where I have been effectively forced to change 11 players at half time. I'm not particularly in favour of such a ploy however needs must. The players were not ready to play more than 45 minutes and I had so many players to cater for as well. That will now change as we get closer to the start and I expect to retain more of what I feel will be my starting eleven well into the second half of matches. I will be changing players for the sake of changing formation and watching how players integrate into the team and how players gel with each

other and create that understanding that is so necessary when changes are made. I am always mindful of protecting players from injury and with Saturday games followed by Monday or Tuesday midweek games I expect to rotate a few players to keep them fresh and not to expose them to injury that will hurt us. I am on the whole very pleased with the squad I have and I hope you too will enjoy the brand of football we intend to play this season and get behind the team as you always do. Tonight I thank QPR for once again sending a team to across London to us. I know it will be tough. These boys are all on professional contracts and it will be a good test for us and will show me where we are at this stage of our preparations. Get behind the boys as usual and enjoy the game.

Following on from our superb performance against Aldershot Town the following Saturdays game with Hanwell Town did not quite live up to expectations. At Kings Langley last Saturday Borough were somewhat unlucky not to get a draw. A rather soft early goal saw Kings Langley ahead at half time and Borough, who had the better of the second half were only denied a deserved equaliser by the crossbar. The home side doubled their lead with a fine solo goal before Daniel Akindayini again bundled in a close range opportunity for our late consolation.

It was the Under 18s who played the Club's first Competitive fixture of the season yesterday evening when they visited Chelmsford City in the FA Youth Cup. Unfortunately their hoped for Cup run came to an early end as City ran out 4-0 winners.

The First Team start with an away trip to Corinthian Casuals on Saturday 19th September. The following Saturday will see Bognor Regis Town at Coles Park and in between we will have started our FA Cup campaign - the draw for our Round will not be made until Monday 14th.

The Women wrapped up their pre-season with a fine 2-1 win away to Stevenage FC Womens Development team last Sunday coming back from a goal down at half-time. They start with a long trip to St. Ives Town (the Cambridgeshire one, not Cornwall) on Sunday 13th September. Their first Home match will be a week later when they face a tough challenge in the 1st Qualifying Round of the WFA Cup as Fulham will be the visitors.

The Under 23s do not get seriously under way until Wednesday 7th October when they will visit Brentwood Town but last Saturday enjoyed a 4-3 victory at Coles Park over the First Team of Spartan South Midland League London Colney.
