# HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating ia year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan



League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager - the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for most other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the guarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both game ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger.

The foundations are in place for an eventual assault on the title to secure a National League place for the men's senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic prospect as we pursue our ambition to achieve promotion to the National League which should be within the capabilities of our talented squad. The facilities and structures are in place for all the Club's teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team has always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 (and also winners of the League's Colwyn Cup competition) and 2009/10. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former

professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football .Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury.



# HISTORY OF POTTERS BAR TOWN FC

The foundations for the Mount Grace Old Scholars (Potters Bar) Football Association were laid in spring 1960.

The school's first team were having a good season, but many of the boys were due to leave at Easter. It was then that Ken Barrett; the P.E. Master of Mount Grace School asked them and old 'Scholars' to support him in raising a team.



Bert Wright, the school's Caretaker and Sven Hammarling and then Bill Venneear. Reserve, 3rd and 4th Teams were added in the following seasons.

In 1965, the Barnet & District and Finchley & District Leagues merged to form the North London Combination. By 1967/68 we had won the Premier Division and the Reserves the Division 1 title and were admitted to Division 2 of the Herts County League.

In 1976 Bill Venneear and Clive Cavalier stepped down and Peter Waller, then the 3rd Team manager, was 'persuaded' to take over.

In 1978 many recommended the closure of the Club. But we continued and our three sides were relegated. But from the experience grew a desire never to repeat the mistakes again. Micky Holson became Manager and in 1981/82 we were in the Premier Division, as Division One Champions.

Clive Cavalier rejoined in 1979 and with Peter Waller planned the new Clubhouse and changing rooms. Construction started in July 1982 and in six months, with Frank Bentley's considerable involvement and help from members, the clubhouse opened on the 9th January 1983.

In 1990/91, we reached the FA Vase 3rd round, before we came back from a 24 point deficit to win the Herts Senior County League Premier Division and the Aubrey Cup.

We accepted promotion to the South Midlands League and changed our playing name to Potters Bar Town FC, to reflect the growing stature of the club and promote the Town. Don Newman stood down as Chairman after 11 years.

We installed the Floodlight system in 1993, the Youth section was reformed in 1993/94 and FA Cup football came in 1995/96. At the end of that season, Peter Waller stepped down as Secretary, after twenty years, to become Chairman.

In 1996/97, the South Midlands Premier Division title was won, but we knew there was too much work to do to apply to the Isthmian League.

The following season, 1997/98, the club reached the guarter final of the FA Vase, going down 2-0 to Kidsgrove Athletic, only conceding in the second period of extra time. We were Runners-up in the league, but won the Challenge Trophy and the South Midlands Floodlight Cup. The Reserves went one better, winning Reserve Division One.

In 1998, Peter Waller and Eddie Harvey, secured a new 21-year lease on the ground, whilst on the site the old school was demolished, replaced by a new Ladbrooke School, Care Home, new car park and Watkins Rise. Sadly, we lost Bill Venneear in November 2000, a victim of cancer. The 150 Seater Main Stand was added in May 2001.

For Season 2001/02, Steve Smart became Manager and by 2002/03, with Paul Surridge, we achieved 3rd place in the league and won the Herts Charity Shield. The Potters Bar Charity Cup followed in 2003/04, but 2004/05 was the most successful of his 3 year reign, winning four trophies; the Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division and the Premier Division Cup, Herts Charity Shield and Potters Bar Charity Cup.

The club went on to take the title by sixteen points, remaining unbeaten in the final 19 league matches, including sixteen victories.

Off the pitch, in 6 weeks Club members and Players carried out major improvements and we passed the FA Ground grading and earned promotion to the Southern League Division 1 East for season 2005/06.

Steve Smart stepped down; Kevin Lucas was appointed, and then replaced by Andy Milne. Though we were bottom for six months, we would not give up. Andy Leese agreed to join us in February 2006 and with new players our fortunes changed and we survived relegation, finishing 16th. The club was devastated that season by the death of Ken Woodward, who had spearheaded the ground improvements.

For 2006/07, we were moved to the Ryman League Division 1 North. We enjoyed a most successful FA Cup run, losing away by 3-2 to full-time Woking, of the Conference National, in the 4th qualifying round, after wins against Waltham Abbey, Wealdstone, Maldon Town and Margate by 2-1 away. But we won the Herts FA Charity Cup, for the first time, but lost Kevin Wilmot, as Secretary. Andy Leese left in May 2007 and we



appointed Steve Browne, though he resigned in December 2008.

In the summer of 2007, a spectators covered area was added and a turnstile block. All four turnstiles have a unique history, as they were all in use at the old Wembley Stadium, until it closed in 2000. Adam Lee was appointed in 2008 and for 5 years served the Club with great distinction and commitment, always improving our league position and reached the Herts Senior Cup Final in 2012/13 for the only time.

In May 2010, to celebrate our 50th year, many former players returned, including 9 who had played in the very first match in September 1960! Bert Wright, one of our 'founders', received the FA 50 years service Award. To commemorate the occasion, the Club reverted to Maroon shirts, the same colours that we wore in June 1960. In January 2012, Bert Wright died at the age of 93, having given the club 52 years of service. In his honour, we renamed the Main stand after him.

For 2013/14 we were back in the Southern League. In late 2013, Adam Lee stepped down, succeeded by Jack Friend, then in early 2015, by Steve Ringrose. Our Free Season Ticket Offer was launched for 2014/15 and made the national press. Sadly, we lost Eddie Harvey.

In 2015/16 we reached the semi-final of the League Cup, and then in 2016/17 we made the 4th qualifying round of the F.A. Cup for the second time, including a replay win at Bath City on penalties (our best result against a team from a higher level).

In Summer 2017 the Clubroom was totally refurbished and in August 2018, after raising £100,000 ourselves and 3 years work by John Gibbs, our new Changing Room complex was opened.

For 2017/18 we were back in the Isthmian League Division 1 North. In September 2017, Peter Waller, celebrated 50 years of service to the Club and received an FA Award. Steve Ringrose 'promoted' James Duncan to Head Coach and several experienced players arrived.

We started with another successful run in the FA Cup, losing to National South Play Off Finalists Hampton & Richmond Borough, whilst in the FA Trophy we fell to Southern League Premier Division Champions, Hereford, both after replays. We then targeted the Play offs, being 8th in January.

However, in our remaining 22 fixtures, we won 15 and drew 5 and came through to take 2nd spot and promotion, with a win on the final day. As a result, we proudly started 2018/19 in the Premier Division. The 2018/19 season was to present two challenges:

One: Make the necessary ground improvements to reach the next level ground grading requirements which meant the addition of two new stands - one a 100-seater and the other a 100 standing - this was achieved on time - thanks to the hard work of club members and supporters and fund-raising and grants.

Two: Establish ourselves at step three. This we did - finishing 16th in the in the Bostik Premier League despite the departure of our management team in the season, but we again promoted from within with Lee O'Leary stepping up to player/manager and being joined by Scott Cousins as joint manager. It was another season of significant progress.

The shortened 2019/20 season was another successful one as the club solidified its position at Step three and gained national interest as we took Barnet to a replay in the FA Cup Fourth Round Qualifying, whilst the home game being shown on the BBC with a crowd Of 2011 in attendance.

The 2020/21 season was also curtailed, with the last game being played in October, a 3-1 loss against Leatherhead. The season's termination did not prevent us from continuing to make progress on and off the pitch however, as on the pitch we were able to enjoy 3-0 wins against both Cheshunt and Cray Wanderers, the latter ending our opponent's 17 game unbeaten run.

Off the pitch, further improvements were made to the renamed LA Construction Stadium, as a state-of-theart sprinkler system, a perimeter barrier around the pitch and a new draining system were all installed, whilst the main grandstand was changed to a maroon and white colour with new seats and a repaint in order to match the new club colours.

The 2021/22 season saw a return to playing football and a complete season completed. We went out of the FA Cup in the first qualifying round away to Stowmarket Town but enjoyed our best run to date in the FA Trophy before losing 3-1 away to Braintree Town of the National League South in the second round proper. With an unprecedented wet winter the club was hampered by having a number of home game postponed due to a continuing water logged pitch which put us behind in league fixtures -a lot of mid season work was put into the pitch to aid its recovery. Also Lee O'Leary resigned as manager but the club appointed the experienced Sammy Moore which saw a change in the team's performances and the club achieved a final position of 13th with 53 points – their best yet at step three...

We look forward with confidence to the new season 2022/23...

# THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

This afternoon it is our pleasure to welcome the players, officials and supporters of POTTERS BAR TOWN FC to the CVS Van Hire Stadium; likewise, of course, our match officials who are Mark Pond with the whistle assisted by George Barker and Joseph Gray. Our visitors arrive holding third place in the Premier Division having occupied top spot for a few days following their 1-0 home win over Bowers & Pitsea before being overtaken by the Tuesdays wins of Aveley and Hornchiurch.

This will be their fifth visit for an Isthmian League fixture. "The Scholars" won the first of them 2-1 in season 2017/18 and we won by1-0 in 2018/19. In 2019/20 it was one of the few games early in 2020 which got played before the Covid shut down rendered our 3-2 win irrelevant. Our first 2 away League games have resulted in a 2-1 win for Potters Bar in 2017/18 and a goalless draw in 2018/19. Our 2019/20 visit never took place and neither home or away matches were fitted in before the early termination of the following season. Last season a 2-2 draw at Coles Park in September was followed by a 1-0 Town home win in February. So recent League encounters have been fairly even as our record is P7 W2 D2 L3 For 8 Against 9 and no match has been settled by more tham a one goal margin. There was also an FA Cup game in September 2015 when our interest in the competition came to an early end at Potters Bar who cruised to a 3-0 win. That was our first season back as an Isthmian Club so we were in Division 1 and our hosts were Premier Division. Last season they eliminated us in the first FA Trophy Round involving Step 3 Clubs also at their ground by 2-0. Between 1998 and 2004 League meetings in the Spartan South Midlands League went very much in favour of Potters Bar as we won only 2 of 16 games (inclusive of two League Cup meetings), with one draw and 13 defeats. Goals were quite plentiful in those games - 65 having been scored but unfortunately only 19 of them were by us.

What a difference a month can make in football! A month ago we were looking nervously over our shoulder to see if the Clubs looking like drop zone candidates had picked up any points. No such interest now. As the

Bell End Boys sing UP, UP, UP is where we now confidently expect to be going and it will be a disappointed club at the end of April if we are not at least in the play-offs. Why the sudden change? The long running injury sequence which has been dogging us has eased and coupled with judicious recruitment we have now reached the vital condition of "strength in depth". Just look at the alternative team we could have selected against Kingstonian from those not in the starting line up and still have expected a victory. Alphabetical by surname it included Johnny who would have started but for traffic delays; Daniel Boateng, a vastly experienced ex-Arsenal central defender recently added to our ranks; Lewis; Sam (Cook); Kwame; Christos - finally ready to return after his serious long term lay off; Micheal (Awaah); William; Chaynie; Andronicos; Stefanos; Mekhi; Max; Sam (Owusu); Rakim. That's 15 most of whom are now free from injury, or will be soon, so add the 11 starters and that gives Tom a squad of at least 26 to select from. Easy to lose one's starting place in such talented company, but not so easy to get it back. As the cliché goes it will give him a selection headache as he tries to maintain everyone's interest and in that regard he may be helped by the up to 8 matches, additional to the remaining 26 League games, which would take place if we were to go through to the finals of the two knock out Competitions we are still in, currently both at the last 16 stage – The Velocity Cup and the London Senior Cup. We start with a tough tie at home to Enfield Town in the Velocity Cup this coming Tuesday. If there is a disappointing aspect it is perhaps that only one of the 26 is a player who has come up through the ranks of our Under 18s and 23s.

The preceding remarks were penned before the game last Saturday at Hastings United and on return my finger hovered over the delete button on the assumption that the sparkling demolition of Kingstonian the previous Tuesday had been a dream. It beggars belief that a team which had produced such an outstanding and convincing performance just a few days earlier could then offer up something so lacklustre. The more so as the starting line-up incorporated just one change with Kaylen Hinds injury making room for Johnny Ashman, who is hardly an emergency makeweight and in fact it was he who scored our only goal. Sadly a few moments thought reveals that this result is a continuation of a depressing trend which has seen second half leads surrendered with a quick-fire flurry of goals against us quite late in the match. Think Bishops Stortford on the first day of the season when 2 goals were conceded, another 2 at Margate, 3 at Hornchurch and now 4 at Hastings. Clearly digging in is not our forte!. 12 points almost within our grasp and all but 2 lost. Those 10 points would have seen us return from Hastings as joint table toppers on 31 points with this afternoons visitors. I would like to be able to finish this article with a list of matches where we have snatched victory from the jaws of defeat with a brace or more of late goals but I can't because there have not been any. The best that can be offered is the stoppage time equaliser at Hashtag United leading to our penalty shoot out victory. But to finish with a positive thought, even after the Hastings damp squib we are still only 8 points away from the last play off spot.

## Tuesday 8th November 2022 HARINGEY BOROUGH v KINGSTONIAN (Pitching In Isthmian League – Premier Division)

If the previous Saturdays win over Folkestone Invicta was in the "bread & butter" category nothing could be further from the truth as regards this match. As our late Queen famously said in her put down of all put downs "recollections may vary" and not everyone will agree with my assertion that this was our best performance of the season. There will doubtless be many champions of the match at Carshalton Athletic but my "vote" is swayed by the memory of our having rode our luck in that match whereas there was nothing remotely fortunate about the demolition of Kingstonian. In a start very reminiscent of the previous Saturday's game Anthony Mendy set up an early first goal with a classy assist which put Kaylen Hinds through to screw the ball into the net from a very tight angle. At 4 minutes it had taken Anthony an extra minute more than on Saturday to wreak havoc in the visitors defence. Ten minutes later Georgios Aresti doubled the lead from just outside the penalty area with a beautifully flighted effort that curved its way into the top corner to the 'keepers right and it would have needed a sensational save for it to be repelled, but none such was forthcoming. Had the Bell End Boys not been making such a din we would probably have been able to hear Zeus and his Godly comrades celebrating his strike on Mount Olympus! Twelve minutes later Anthony decided that anything Georgios could do he could do as well or better as from around the same spot he launched a rocket that entered the net in the same top corner as the earlier effort. Both efforts will be contenders for "goal of the season". Kingstonian had posed little threat and had seemed somewhat lethargic but rarely have Borough pounded the opposition so relentlessly for a full half. Kingstonian were a different proposition after the interval and had they played with the determination then showed for both halves a very close result might have been the outcome. But the irresistible Borough brought their total up to 5 with two more outstanding goals. Firstly through substitute Chaynie who had only been on the field for ten minutes when given the opportunity to add the fourth with a cheeky back-heel. Two minutes later Kaylen put the result beyond doubt finishing with a fierce shot into the net via the inside of a post from the edge of the area. At that point there seemed to be every possibility that we might better our match record of 5 goals in an Isthmian Premier Division match but had to settle for equalling it. In fact it was two young Kingstonian substitutes who found our net twice – and fine efforts they were too - but whether they would have penetrated our defence so easily had we not already been home and dry is a matter of conjecture. A real shame that it was in front of our lowest home crowd of the season (222) that we put on such a scintillating display. I don't usually record the full line up but all those who participated in this match deserve a mention. ### Saturday 12th November 2022 HASTINGS UNITED v HARINGEY BOROUGH (Pitching In Isthmian League – Premier Division)

After last Tuesday's brilliant display hopes were high when we visited Hastings United four days later. Most of the 912 spectators returned home happy but sadly our relatively small contingent were not among them although they certainly deserved a better reward for making their long journey. The first half was dominated from start to finish by United and it was very much against the run of play that we were ahead at the interval when on one of the few occasions we did threaten their goal a header by Johnny in the 34th minute looped up and finished over the line via the underside of the crossbar. Little relief had been provided for our hard pressed defence. It was reasonable to hope that the second half might follow a less one sided pattern and unreasonable to expect that our overworked defence could hold out for another 45 minutes. It took only 10 for Hastings to find our net when a low arrowed free kick a few yards outside the penalty area by-passed the wall to nestle in the corner and great was the relief when the referee disallowed it as he had not blown the whistle and was still in discussion with a player. But there was no reprieve 2 minutes later when a corner sparked a goal mouth melee in which the ref spotted an infringement and pointed to the spot. And three minutes later the lead had turned into a deficit thanks to another penalty the award of which was noncontroversial as Jorge tripped a striker who had a lot still to do before being able to unleash a telling effort. Two open play successes from Hastings then followed and there never looked to be any serious likelihood of a Borough comeback. The introduction of Chaynie has caused problems for other opponents and he has scored early on as a substitute several times but although he put himself about with his customary enthusiasm nothing came right for him this time. The recently signed Danny Boateng came on to make his Club debut but introducing a central defender, however experienced, is obviously not a substitution normally expected to turn looming defeat into success nor did it look like doing so. It was pleasing to see Christos on the bench after being kept out for so long by his serious injury but he must have been glad not to be called on to resume his career in the tail end of such a depressing event.

### KNOCK OUT COMPETITIONS FOR THE FIRST TEAM

Our early exit from both FA Competitions leaves us depending upon the Velocity (ie League) Cup and the London Senior Cup for some knock out excitement at the end of the season. Maybe there is a hopeful precedent from last season when we went through to the Semi-Finals of both Cups, albeit aided by some opponents withdrawals. We have reached the last 16 of the Velocity Cup and will be playing Enfield Town at Coles Park this coming Tuesday. In the London Senior Cup we had a bye in the First Round and will play at

home to Glebe FC of the South Counties East League Premier Division on Tuesday 6th December. If victory ensues we will be away in the quarter final to the survivor from Dartford, Metropolitan Police and Hilltop FC.

**The Under 23s** A disappointing result last time out as Bury Town Under 23s visited Coles Park on 7th November and left having inflicted a 5-0 drubbing on us. That completed an undesirable hat-trick of games in which we have failed to score. Their next match, also at home, is this coming Monday when Felixstowe & Walton United visit Coles Park.

THEY'RE paid the big bucks because they make the big contributions. Top strikers are worth their weight in gold.

Whether it's turning possession into points when his team is playing well to getting his manager out of jail when they're not, the value of an in-form number nine simply can not be underestimated.

Take Charnock Richard FC for example. Back in 2009, they took a punt on a young 24-year-old forward called Carl Grimshaw, who had only previously tasted action at Bolton Lads and Girls club and Eagley FC - and that to simply help with a player shortage.

Now, just over 13 years on, dairy farmer Grimshaw, at the age of 38, has etched his name in club folklore by notching up an incredible 501 goals, reaching his latest milestone during the North West Counties League Premier Division club's recent defeat to Squires Gate.

Indeed, in 12 out of 13 seasons at Charnock Richard he has scored over 25 goals with his record tally being a sensational 50-goal season in 2012-2013.

Naturally, his success in front of goal has brought silverware too. His goals have helped take the Mossie Park clubs from Step 7 to Step 5, collecting no fewer than four West Lancashire League Premier Division championship Winners' medals and two runner-ups.

While Grimshaw will be humble enough to admit that the club's success was not solely down to his efforts, having a centre forward averaging 38 goals a season is a pretty solid platform in which to build a legacy. Another prolific veteran on a hot streak right now is Brett Pitman.

Having forged a glittering career for himself in the Football League with the likes of AFC Bournemouth, Bristol City, Ipswich Town, Portsmouth and Swindon Town, Pitman is now enjoying a new lease of life at his local club AFC Portchester in the Wessex League.

In fact, that's something of an understatement as Pitman is currently the leading marksman in the top nine tiers of English football. His four goal blast for the Royals against Alresford Town last weekend took his tally to 28 in just 18 league and cup starts in 2022-23.

In all, his 14 Wessex League appearances have yielded 22 goals, scoring in ever game but one, while 14 goals have come in his last six.

Naturally, it's a tally which is sparking a right Royal waltz at the top of the Wessex Premier with the Royals having collected 40 out of a possible 42 points to lead by eight going into this week's round of matches.

Frighteningly, Pitman is still only 34 years old and given that he's never really modelled his game on blistering pace and power, he may well be still at his peak.

"He's never going to run in behind defences, his movement in the box is brilliant, that's what he does," says Royals boss Dave Carter. "His movement to pull away from defenders is fantastic.

"It's not all about Brett, a lot of other lads are playing well. A lot pf Brett's goals are put on a plate for him, but what he does is score goals at important times."

The value of having a top striker is not lost on Ashton United it seems.

The NPL Premier Division side audaciously attempted to lure goal machine Erling Haaland from Manchester City with Norway not in World Cup action.

A PR stunt, a stroke of genius or the height of ridiculousness, we'll let you decide but the point remains valid, the importance of having a top-class number nine in your ranks should never be undervalued.

# HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2021-22

**GEORGIOS ARESTI** – Cypriot International midfielder who numbers AEK Athens among his previous Clubs; 2017/18 deadline day signing and near automatic selection last season.

**JOHNNY ASHMAN** – close season signing from East Thurrock United. A wide midfielder who scored ten goals in 46 appearances for "the Rocks" last season (including one against us). Has also appeared fpr Aveley, Barking, Witham Town, Clapton and Cheshunt.

**DANIEL BOATENG** – much travelled former Arsenal defender just signed by us. Last Club was National League South Welling United. Clubs in Romania, Sweden. Scotland and Bosnia & Herzegovina among his previous berths. **CHAYNIE BURGIN** – tall rangy striker signed in the close season after a year with three Essex Clubs - Woodford Town, Maldon & Tiptree and National league Braintree Town.

**LEWIS BYRNE-HEWITT** – a well travelled forward signed in the close season; made debut in friendly with Chelmsford City and scored within 5 minutes. With Coggeshall Town at the end of last season and before that with Brightlingsea Regent, Witham Town, Bishop's Stortford, Ware, VCD Athletic, Whyteleafe, Billericay Town, Norwich City Under 18s and Arsenal Under 18s.

**SAMUEL COOK** – tall strong central defender making a challenge for a first team starting berth having just returned from a spell with German Clubs. Has made several starts after a number of substitute appearances.

**KWAME DANSO** – tall, commanding central defender signed in the close season. As a youth player had spells with West Ham United and Crystal Palace and is still ujnder 20. Was with Hackney Wick last season.

**CHRISTOS DJAMAS** – Cypriot Under 21 International signed in October 2020. Midfielder who was most recently on contract at Othello Athienoy and previously with Apoel Nicosia and Agia Napa.

**JORGE DJASSI-SAMBU** – midfield powerhouse now in 7th season with Club; opponents know when they have been tackled by this non-stop box to box player. Dangerous in opponents box at set piece situations.

**MICHEAL AWAAH DOME-BEMWIN** – defensive midfielder with experience in Spanish, Cypriot and Swedish football. Lewes, Whitehawk, Enfield Town and Braintree Town are among the English Clubs he has played for – all but Lewes after his last spell abroad.

WILLIAM DUPRAY – tall, strong defensive midfielder in his second spell at Borough. Signed in the close season having been with Ware last season. A much travelled player who has had spells at Northwood, Corinthian Casuals, Bracknell Town, Harlow Town, Wingate & Finchley, Welwyn Garden City, Chalfont St. Peter, Cambridge City and Scunthorpe United.

**SCOTT DUROJAIYE** – a familiar name who re-joined us this season. "Olu" is a very experienced and widely travelled midfielder with experience at several National League sides including Hungerford Town, Welling United, Braintree Town, Maidstone United, Woking, Dartford and most recently Peterborough Sports for which Club he played two games earlier this season and is now dual registered.

ANDRONICOS GEORGIOU – mid season signing; a forward who graduated from Stevenage Academy and played in their EFL team. Last season was with Wycombe Wanderers. Has also been loaned to Kings Langley, St. Albans City and Middlesbrough Under 23s.

**STEFANOS GEORGIOU** – younger brother of Andronicos signed from St. Margaretsbury a few days before the Registration deadline; a right sided midfielder who immediately looked at home at this higher level of the game.

**KAYLEN HINDS** – dangerous striker who moved on from Arsenal Under 23s and a loan to Stevenage to play in Germany for VFL Wolfsburg and Greuther Furth. Returned to England in August 2019 firstly with Watford and then Aldershot Town, Welling United and finally in January this year with Hayes & Yeading United.

**CALLUM ISMAIL** – skilful young full back previously with Bowers and Pitsea who joined us in September 2018 and after establishing himself in the Under 23s and on the bench made his first start in December 2019.

ALPHANSO KENNEDY – Goalscoring winger signed in close season. Was with Wingate & Finchley last season and also played for FC Romania; played against us when we lost 1-0 at Wingate & Finchley on August Bank Holiday Monday 2019.



**NATHAN KPEMOU** – tall powerful central defender or wide midfielder who has come through our Under 18 and 23 ranks and patiently awaited his opportunity; when injuries gave him his chance he seized it and he will not easily relinquish his starting place status.

**MEKHI LEACOCK-McLEOD** – wide attacking midfielder who has just re-joined us from Farnborough; also numbers Halifax Town, Accrington Stanley, Eastleigh and Romford among his previous berths and Fulham, Wolverhampton Wanderers and Glasgow Rangers at Under 23 level.



**EMMANUEL AGBOOLA** - joins the side having previously played for Corinthian Casuals, meaning he does have experience in the Isthmian Premier League. The 23-year-old has also had spells at Oxford United where he was signed professionally, Billericay Town and a loan spell at Staines Town. A product of Reading's academy, Agboola will undoubtedly bring quality to the side for the upcoming season.
