HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating ia year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan



League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for most other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both game ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger.

The foundations are in place for an eventual assault on the title to secure a National League place for the men's senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic prospect as we pursue our ambition to achieve promotion to the National League which should be within the capabilities of our talented squad. The facilities and structures are in place for all the Club's teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team has always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 (and also winners of the League's Colwyn Cup competition) and 2009/10. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former

professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football .Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury.

HISTORY OF BRIGHTLINGSEA REGENT FC

Brightlingsea Regent, previously Brightlingsea United, have completed around 100 years of competitive football. Firstly, in the Border league, between 1908/1909 to 1970 when they joined The Essex Senior league for 20 years having much success, before going on to join the then Jewson League in 1990 and then back to the Border league in 2001/2002. Brightlingsea United FC and Regent Park Rangers FC amalgamated at the start of 2005/2006 season to become Brightlingsea Regent Football Club. During this time, the squad and club have continued to grow and develop, having success in the Border league Division 1 and cup.

In 2009/2010 new Management team James Webster and Mark Gridley guided Regent to a 4th place finish and followed up the following season in 2010/2011 by winning the Kent Blaxill Essex and Suffolk Border Premier League in a superb season by playing 34, winning 31, drawing 2 and losing just 1 game.

In season 2011/2012, James Webster added Tom Rothery to the Management team in September and they finished their first season back at Step 6 with a creditable 5th place finish. They also reached the quarter-finals of the Essex Senior Cup before losing to League 2 side Dagenham & Redbridge. The 2012/2013 season was successful for many reasons. Firstly, an FA Vase cup run, which was the longest in the clubs history before bowing out in round 3 (last 64). The club gained promotion back to step 5 and the Premier Division with a third-place finish which included a 22-game unbeaten run during the season. In the final game of the season the team won the First Division KO Cup final with a 1-0 victory over Gt Yarmouth.

The **2013/2014** season in the Eastern Counties Premier Division again proved to be successful for Brightlingsea, gaining promotion after finishing Runners-up to Hadleigh Utd, losing out on the final day by goal difference. The club also reached the last 16 of the FA Vase and in doing so again created more history.

The **2016/2017** season saw Brightlingsea Regent crowned as champions of the Isthmian North Division, notching up an impressive 103 points and finishing 12 points ahead of their closest rivals, ensuring an historic promotion to the Isthmian Premier League.

In October 2017 long-standing manager James Webster left the club to be replaced by former assistant manager and coach Tom Rothery, assisted by Pip Boyland, who maintained the R's Isthmian Premier league standing and won the Essex FA's Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup.

2018/2019 saw the Regent achieve their highest ever finish in the non-league pyramid, along with their best ever FA Cup and FA Trophy runs. They also retained the Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup with a 1-0 victory at Maldon & Tiptree.

After Tom Rothery stepped down from the manager's position in September 2019, Colchester United legend Kem Izzet took the hot seat and avoided relegation in his first season in charge, In a season that was cut short in February due to Covid-19.

2020/2021 A later than usual start to the season saw Regent make an early management change as Kem Izzet departed the club in October, replaced with the management duo of Tom Austin and Ryan Salter, arriving from FC Clacton. The season was then curtailed in December and no more football was played.

2021/2022 Tom Austin and Ryan Salter resigned from their positions at the Beginning of November with the club positioned within the relegation places. The R's appointed Brett Munyard and his team of Mark Healy, Ricky Stubbs and Dave Limber who dramatically saved the club from relegation on the penultimate game of the season with a 3-0 victory over Haringey Borough to secure Step 3 football for the 6th season.

171 - our lowest home League attendance. Can't blame the weather. Maybe Valentines Day had something to do with it. Maybe that lot just down the road being on tele had an effect. Or maybe the absentee hordes just had a premonition that it would not be a night to look back on fondly. And they were right. Certainly a contender for poorest performance of the season. What is particularly annoying is that the two goals we conceded were both of a type for which I would be able to find too many precedents among previous match reports this season. After only four minutes yet another opponent found himself obligingly free of any attention some eight yards from goal with plenty of time to bring down and control a short lobbed pass and drive it hard and low past Josh. Charlie Edwards was the beneficiary of our largesse on this occasion. Equally as familiar was the winning goal on 62 minutes when yet another corner was neither caught, punched nor headed emphatically clear and the goalmouth scramble which ensued was ended by Bradley Sachs – briefly a Borough player several years ago – who smashed the loose ball into the top corner. That was particularly disappointing for in what was one of our few moments of quality Josiah Bridgeman just 10 minutes earlier had raced in from the left to slide home at the far post a hard driven low cross fired over from near the corner

flag by Ben Allen; we were then looking as if we might go on to at least cement our point or even grab the other two. Plenty of time left to respond but onslaught came there none. Canvey 'keeper Bobby Mason may well be a brilliant stopper but we don't know as in 90 minutes we failed to give him any opportunity to prove it and fired nothing at him which would not have been easy pickings for any Step 3 custodian, and probably those at lower levels too. By the end of the first half we were lucky not to be three down as Canvey had wasted two gilt edged chances to increase their lead. Nothing "gilt - like" about the few chances we created. The win left "The Gulls" well placed – 7th - in the fight for a play-off spot or better although they did not really suggest that they would be able to make their mark in the National League. But then why should they put on a special performance when the points were so easily picked up without shedding too much sweat. What a difference five months make for in mid-September we had visited their Park Lane Stadium and played our part in a real 90 minute end to end thriller which rather surprisingly, given the number of chances both teams created, finished one a-piece. As for us, in 15th place after this game, mention of Haringey Borough and play-offs in the same sentence now would really be a cause for mirth. More pertinently we are only 12 points off the 19th spot which means relegation for its holder and all but two of the 7 teams below us have one or more games in hand on us and we have meetings to come with 5 of them, starting today.

Saturday 18th February 2023 BILLERICAY TOWN v HARINGEY BOROUGH (Pitching In Isthmian League Premier Division)

Another disappointing result but at least the performance was somewhat better. Inevitably, it was a corner which undid us after just 10 minutes although on this occasion it was not a failure to catch or head clear as a short corner routine worked in from the left eventually created a familiar scramble in our goalmouth and it was Billericay' Captain Michael Chambers who blasted it home. We had plenty of possession in the first half but again never really tested the mettle of the opponent's 'keeper as a shot stopper. After 37 minutes we found ourselves 2 down and can rightly complain about bad luck for a clearance by Rakim hit Scott Mitchell and rebounded back to a striker, Kareem Isiaka, standing yards offside which would have led to his simple finish being ruled out had the rebound been from one of his own team. We had a mountain to climb once Billericay had scored their third goal just three minutes into the second half as when we had a corner which was cleared we were undone by a swift breakaway which we were too short at the back to deal with successfully and Bradley Stevenson produced a fine controlled drive low into the far corner as he raced in from the left to meet a long diagonal cross. Our chance to set ourselves on the road to recovery arrived 8 minutes later as Ben Allen who had spent much of the first half chasing lost causes was able to latch on to a loose ball and the only way Billericay could stop him was to bring him down from behind and the player who did so was rather lucky to escape with a yellow card as Ben was clean through. Olu took the kick and the 'keeper guessed correctly and dived to his right to push it out. However, we had our bit of luck when an Assistant referee advised the Referee that an offence had been committed, presumably encroachment, and it was Ben who slammed the re-take low to the 'keepers right but this time right into the corner and with too much power to give him a hope of reaching it. We did press forward after that and inevitably that left us somewhat open at the back and from a speedy breakaway it was Scott Mitchell's turn to unfairly halt a clean through player and he too was yellow carded. That was after 73 minutes but Josh made a great save of what was a well struck penalty as he threw himself to his left and punched it away. We continued to press and were extremely fortunate when another late breakaway left Josh with no option but to rush well out of his goal and although the striker side stepped him he then drove it just wide of the gaping goal. It would be difficult to maintain that the better team did not win but 3-1 was a fair reflection of their superiority and had the margin been two goals greater, which it would have been but for the penalty save and the open goal miss, that would have been harsh on Borough.

KNOCK OUT COMPETITIONS FOR THE FIRST TEAM

Our early exit from both FA Competitions left us depending upon the Velocity (ie League) Cup and the London Senior Cup for some knock out excitement at the end of the season. On Tuesday 7th one of the two possibilities was extinguished as our second visit to Potters Bar Town in the space of 4 days saw us produce an uninspiring display which inevitably resulted in our quarter final exit from the Velocity Cup. So only the London Senior Cup now offers the prospect of some end of season excitement. Following a bye in the First Round we progressed to the third round, none too convincingly by 3-1, when Step 5 Glebe FC of the Southern Counties East League Premier Division visited Coles Park early in December. We now face formidable opponents in the next round – Dartford flying high in the National League South - who will doubtless be

determined to avenge our wonderful FA Trophy win at their ground behind closed doors in December 2020. We will be the visiting them this coming Tuesday, 28th February, and if we perform as unconvincingly as we have in our last few games even bothering to turn up will likely be a waste of time.

NEWS OF OUR OTHER TEAMS

The Under 23s. Last Mondays win at Felixstowe & Walton United put us back on top of the table but with 4 of the 6 teams in the Division still in with a chance of the title we are probably not favourites as the other 3 all have games in hand on us and it's a very tight contest. At present its Borough P13 points 24; Heybridge Swifts P12 points 23; Brentwood Town P11 points 22; Bury Town P10 points 15 Our maximum haul is 30 and obviously the other teams must take points from each other so we can but hope there are a lot of drawn games among them and that the points are well shared. In our favour is that although our two remaining matches are away from home the last is with the rock bottom team.

Following the withdrawal of two Clubs reducing the complement to 6 Clubs there was a move to increase the number of times each Club would meet the other 5 from 3 times to 4 but after a "ballot" resulted in a 3-3 draw the League cast its deciding vote for the status quo of 3 times.

The Under 18s. A mid-table finish looks to be on the cards – even if they won all 6 of their remaining games runners up would be the best they could hope for. Their most recent game was last Wednesday when they visited bottom Club Hilltop FC and ran out easy 4-0 winners and their next action will be this coming Monday when leaders Potters Bar Town visit Coles Park.

Our Womens Team. Last Sunday they tested themselves against a team from the National League South, the top echelon of the game below the professional Womens League, when London Bees (in reality Barnet FC) visited Coles Park for a Capital Women's Cup quarter final match. It may seem odd to be eulogising over a 3-5 defeat and, football being a matter of opinions, not everyone will agree with my assertion that this was their best performance of the season and probably their best ever. No one watching and without knowledge of the Womens game would have thought that there were 2 steps in the Pyramid between the competing Clubs. Had the visitor's 'keeper not have done her job so well in the first quarter of an hour it would have seen Borough well in the lead by then. Nothing spectacular but she did what she had to do as we closed in time and time again and as her blocks never fell conveniently for our eager attackers it would not be unfair to say that luck favoured her. Of course, the visitors eventually cottoned on that it was not a "just turn up and victory will be certain" game but it was terribly harsh on Borough that they were three goals down at the interval.- again nothing spectacular but the more experienced visitors wasted nothing when they worked their way into our danger zone. When a fourth close range goal was netted minutes into the second half thoughts of an embarrassing scoreline came to mind but far from surrendering Borough grabbed the initiative and it was Shakira Roberts whose speed and close control had bothered "The Bees" throughout (as it does all opponents) so great was the relief when she outpaced everyone on a straight down the middle race and supplied a confident finish which at the least would have shown that we had not just been there to make up the numbers. But she and the team were far from finished and a few minutes later her speed enabled her to intercept a back pass which the 'keeper had gone out wide to collect and somehow Shakira managed to screw the ball goalwards from what looked like an impossible angle and it trickled into the net in slow motion. Game on. Shakira had not finished tormenting the visitors yet and with an effort not dis-similar to her first made it 3-4 as she completed her hat-trick. With ten minutes to go serious thoughts of a penalty shoot out or even better surfaced but it was not to be as almost immediately "The Bees" restored their two goal cushion with another simple goal – whether it was a close range nod in or an o.g may be debatable but either way it left Borough with a mountain to climb. Try they did but the nearest they came was a close range effort towards the near post into the side netting. The girls did the Club, themselves and their coaches proud and can legitimately boast that, although it counted for nothing in the overall scheme of things, they beat a top tier team 3-2 with their second half comeback. Another statistic of interest is that no opponents have prevented them from scoring at least once in every game. But they have only recorded two clean sheets. The youthful team has shown enough for optimism to abound as regards next season's campaign and for the Quarter Final of the League Cup they will visit AFC Sudbury next Sunday which which makes three fixtures yet to come against that Club – one of the hardest draws possible. It is no surprise that on a goals scored per game League table our 42 from 12 games puts us top. Unfortunately only three teams in the 11 team Division have conceded more. But defensive improvement will inevitably come with experience and then "the sky's the limit" The afternoons heroines were:- Tida Yokomoto (goalkeeper 1st Half) Maisie Swann (goalkeeper 2nd half), Megan Peters, Lola Shack, Lexi Wade, Amber Leighton, Chloe Ions, Emily Pickard,

Victoria Campbell, Kylie Manktelow, Caitlen Star, Shakira Robers, Amy Haynes, Louise Askey, Sandeep Tak, Sarah McDermott. 5 subs allowed so all played.

Harlow Town have withdrawn from the League so that's goodbye to 3 points and the +3 goal difference we secured when they visited Coles Park in August. The proceeds of the 50/50 draws are passed on to the Womens team to help with its running costs, which are quite considerable for a League which embraces Clubs as far apart as the North Norfolk coast and the Thames Estuary and is much appreciated.

SOMETHING very special is unfolding right before our eyes in the National League – and it's likely to raise the bar for many years to come.

For the last few weeks at NLP Towers, we've cautiously held off talking about a "two-horse race" for the title but gripping late drama on Saturday felt like a decisive moment.

The first twist in the tale came at Huish Park where, held 1-1 by Yeovil Town, Notts County appeared to be struggling in pursuit of a sixth straight National League victory.

But, with five minutes to go, the ruthless league leaders managed to find a way through, courtesy of Ruben Rodrigues, and then clicked through the gears in stoppage-time with top scorer Macaulay Langstaff adding two more to complete a rather comfortable – if not flattering - 4-1 victory.

It was the same also at Aldershot Town's EBB Stadium where Notts' title rivals Wrexham were similarly not having things their own way.

Two-nil and 3-1 leads were quickly cancelled out by the stubborn Shots but the Hollywood finish was pure box office - a 96th-minute winner from substitute Sam Dalby helping the Red Dragons to a dramatic 4-3 victory.

Defeat for Woking at Altrincham and Chesterfield's failure to beat Solihull Moors meant that the gap between second and third was extended to a mind-boggling 17 points and, given the form of these two big guns, it would take a huge turnaround in order for that deficit to be clawed back.

Saturday's finale also put the National League statisticians on red alert.

As it stands, no fewer than FOUR long-lasting league records could potentially be broken this season – and maybe even by a team who could still be playing Non-League football next year!

With only one automatic place up for grabs, it is still very much all to play for. Failure to finish on top of the summit will not only mean that the runners-up will have a psychological setback to recover from, but also a gruelling two-legged play-off semi-final and final to overcome if they are to, at long last, fulfil their promotion aspirations.

The first major National League record in sight of the top two is for Most Points in a Season.

Crawley Town's best of 105, set in 2010-11, is in grave danger of being surpassed by both Notts and Wrexham, who are closing on three figures with a quarter of the season still left to play.

As it stands, County led the way with 83 points from 34 matches, while Wrexham trail by five with two games more to play.

They are still a way off but on current points-per-game ratio both would end the season on 112 points.

The last time the top two ended on the same points was way back in 1991-92, while no two teams have ever finished the season with 100+ points. History may well be beckoning.

Another long-standing record under serious threat is most Wins in a Season.

With the total of 31, first achieved by Aldershot Town in 2007-08, has stood for 15 years. Crawley, in 2010-11 and Fleetwood, in 2011-12, both took a share, but it has never been surpassed.

County, currently with 25, need just seven wins from 12 games to take the record outright, while Wrexham need eight from 14.

With wins and points come goals – and that is another area which separates these two from the rest.

A hat-trick at Huish Park on Saturday and two more against Southend United on Tuesday night, took Langstaff's tally for the season to 32 – an incredible feat for a striker enjoying his first season in the top-flight since joining from Gateshead in National League North in the summer.

Closest rival Paul Mullin followed up his brace for Wrexham at Aldershot on Saturday with two more against Scunthorpe United on Tuesday night, taking his league tally for the season to 26, although the 28-year-old former Cambridge United hitman has bagged eight more in the FA Cup.

Both are in pursuit of Ricky Miller's incredible total of 40 for Dover Athletic back in 2016/17. Langstaff needs eight goals from 12 games, Mullin a goal a game from Wrexham's remaining 14.

With these two hitman, and others, on fire, it's no surprise to see both Notts County and Wrexham chasing the team goal totals too.

This is the record which stands longest of all with no one able to topple the total of 103 set by Barnet in 1990-91 and equalled by Hereford in 2003-04.

However, with Notts County currently on 88 and Wrexham on 83, this the one mark most likely to be toppled. It's been almost a decade since any side hit the 100-goal mark but, at the current goals-per-game ratio, both Notts and Wrexham would bag 119!

It's fair to say both of these big guns have given the National League plenty in the way of entertainment this season – but their lasting legacy to the Non-League game may offer English football's fifth tier a whole new dimension for the future.

The EFL chief executive Rick Parry revealed this week they are finally considering introducing a third promotion spot for National League clubs.

These ridiculous numbers can only help strengthen that argument.
