HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY



It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was

ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for most other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both game ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team has always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League will not be continuing with an Under 23 (Development) Section at all. Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 (and also winners of the League's Colwyn Cup competition) and 2009/10. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former

professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an Adult League is not without its problems.

The foundations are in place for an eventual assault on the title to secure a National League place for the men's senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic prospect as we pursue our ambition to achieve promotion to the National League should be within the capabilities of our talented squad. The facilities and structures are in place for all the Club's teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF CHELMSFORD CITY FC



In 1938, it was decided that a professional club should be formed in Chelmsford to join the Southern League. Having seen how Colchester Town had fared so badly after the formation of the professional Colchester United, it was decided to close down the existing club and to reform as 'Chelmsford City', despite the fact that Chelmsford itself would not be granted city status until 2012.

The new club continued playing at New Writtle Street and were accepted into the Southern League. On 27 August 1938, Chelmsford City played their first game, drawing 3–3 against Bristol Rovers Reserves. They made an immediate impact in the FA Cup, reaching the fourth round in their first season.

After beating fellow non-League club Kidderminster Harriers 4–0 in the first round, they defeated Division Three North Darlington 3–1 in the second round Second Division Southampton 4–1 in home matches with attendances in excess of 10,000. In the fourth round, they lost 6–0 at Birmingham City.

At the end of the season, the club applied to join the Football League, but received only one vote. In the 1939/40 season, the Southern League was split into Eastern and Western Divisions; City were Eastern Division champions and were declared joint overall champions after drawing a play-off with Lovells Athletic 3–3.

The club were the Southern League's first champions when football resumed after World War Two, also winning the Southern League Cup that season. They applied for Football League membership in 1947, 1948, 1950 and 1951 and 1956 but were unsuccessful on each occasion; their eight votes in 1950 put them second amongst the unsuccessful clubs and marked their highest-ever vote total.

Chelmsford won the Southern League Cup again in 1959/60 and the league title in 1967/68 and 1971/72. They continued to apply to join the Football League, making bids in 1960, 1961, 1962, and every year between 1967 and 1971 and again from 1973 until 1976, but were unsuccessful; In total the club had 17 unsuccessful attempts at election into the Football League between 1947 and 1976.

They remained in the top division of the Southern League until 1976–77, when they were relegated to Division One South. In 1977, City were one of six clubs to represent England in the Anglo-Italian Cup.

After the formation of the Alliance Premier League, they regained their top division status in the Southern League. The club were relegated again in 1987/88 but made an immediate return to the Premier Division after winning Division One South the following season.

Another relegation was experienced in 1996/97 and after an issue with the seating at the ground meant they were refused promotion in 1997/98, they did not return to the Premier Division until 2001.

City also had to move out of their New Writtle Street home in 1997 and ground shared at both Maldon and Billericay until 2006 where they moved to their current home, the Melbourne Stadium, currently named the EMG Inspire Stadium.

In 2004, Chelmsford transferred to the Premier Division of the Isthmian League and were champions in 2007/08, earning promotion to the Conference South. They reached the play-offs in the following season but lost to Hampton & Richmond in the play-off semi-finals.

The club qualified for the play-offs again in 2009/10 and 2010/11 but lost in the semi-finals on both occasions. They reached the second round of FA Cup in 2010/11, losing 3–1 at Wycombe Wanderers. In the following season, Chelmsford reached the second round again, taking Macclesfield Town to a replay after drawing at home, however they lost 1–0 in the replay at Moss Rose.

During the 2012/13 season, the club reached the second round for the third year in a row, defeating along the way Essex rivals Colchester United 3–1 at Melbourne Park. At the end of the season the club qualified for the play-offs for the fourth time in five years but lost in the semi-finals to Salisbury City.

After a period of mid-table finishes, Chelmsford qualified for the play-offs again in 2016/17 after finishing fourth in the renamed National League South. After beating Dartford 2–1 on aggregate in the semi-finals, they lost 2–1 to Ebbsfleet United in the final.

A third place finish the following season led to another play-off campaign, but the club were beaten 1–0 by Hampton & Richmond Borough in the semi-finals. In the 2018/19 season, Chelmsford finished fourth, however lost 3–2 in the play-offs away to Welling United; their ninth play-off campaign in total. In the 2019/20 season after losing to then bottom Hungerford Town when chasing the playoffs manager Rod


Stringer was sacked and player Robbie Simpson was appointed as manager just before the start of the Covid-19 pandemic. A Covid-19 disrupted 2020/21 season was cut short and in 2021/22 the club finished 19th in its first full season since 2018/19.

2022/23 saw Chelmsford finish 5th on the final day, only being away from 3rd place on goal difference. St Albans were the visitors to the Melbourne Community Stadium and a Shaun Jeffers strike 5 minutes into Extra Time saw the Saints succumb the Clarets to a 0-1 defeat in their tenth play-off campaign.

Couple of historical figures:

Harry FERRIER (Manager): Harry Ferrier was born in Ratho, a village just outside of Edinburgh in 1920. As a player he won back-to-back top-flight titles with Portsmouth in 1949 and 1950 and then managed Gloucester City before managing Chelmsford City on two occasions. In his first spell with the Clarets, he won the Southern League Cup and in his second spell City won the Southern League for the first time in 22 years when he pipped Wimbledon to the title in 1968. He later worked for Essex County Cricket Club and became a successful bowls player. He died in 2002.

Some other famous players to play and manage us:

- Peter Shreeve (sometimes called Shreeves) (played for City 1966-69, then managed Tottenham between 1984 and 1986)
 - Paul Parker (ex-England international with 19 caps also played for Manchester United managed City between 2001 and 2003.)
 - Nigel Spink (goalkeeper who signed for Aston Villa in 1977 after only 10 league appearances for Chelmsford, famously came on as a sub for Jimmy Rimmer in the European Cup final in 1982 in only his second appearance for the club but kept a clean sheet as Villa beat Bayern 1-0. Went on to make 460 appearances for the Villains and played for England once.)
 - Jimmy Greaves (Legendary ex England, Tottenham, Chelsea and West Ham striker played for Chelmsford in the 1976-77 season at the age of 36. He still showed his class on the pitch despite his time at the club being marred by Greaves' off-the-field problems)
 - Alan Brazil (Glaswegian born ex Scotland international who also played for Tottenham, Ipswich and Man United played 7 times for Chelmsford in 1988 before leaving for Switzerland. Now a well-known sports personality currently presenting the breakfast show on talkSPORT)

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

Last season "The Clarets" came within a whisker of becoming a National League top Division side as they finished 5th In the Southern Division but could not quite make it through the Play-Offs.

Likewise we extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials who are Tommy Breen in the middle assisted by Andreas Anastasiou and Alan Steward. Whatever the outcome we hope that all spectators will leave having watched an entertaining match and that both Managers will find it a useful test of their squads.

For a League match between the Clubs it is necessary to go back more than a century; to 1912 in fact when both Clubs (we were then known as Tufnell Park) were founder members of the Athenian League and played each other for 2 seasons before the First World War caused suspension of the League. In 1913/14 Tufnell Park were the League champions. When games resumed in 1919/20 Chelmsford continued as Athenian members until 1922 but Tufnell Park left to join the Isthmians.

Release of the Isthmian League Fixtures was made last Thursday and they are shown later in this programme and are also on our .com and .net websites, We start on 12th August with a visit to Canvey Island and will be at home to Wingate & Finchley on Tuesday 15th.

The Under 23s who will be competing in the Senior (highest) Division of the Essex Alliance League are expected to commence fixtures on Saturday 12th August (if away) or Friday 11th if at home as all their home games will be played on Friday evenings,

Disappointingly Bishop's Stortford have pulled out of their visit on 22nd July and steps were taken to find a replacement opponent and very pleasingly AFC SUDBURY (now of the Southern League Premier Division but familiar through earlier Isthmian games with them) have agreed to replace them.

FIRST GAME OF NEW SEASON A SUCCESS *(report by Nick Hoare)*

Haringey Borough 1 – Harrow Borough 0 – 8th July 2023

A 35th minute deflected shot from Bobson Bawling which hit a defender and left the goalkeeper flat-footed, settled a game of few chances. In fact, I don't remember Harrow having a single shot on goal throughout the 90 minutes, and certainly Max and Alex will not have many easier 45 minutes this season.

There were promising games from two of the new players on show, the number 2 Ebenezer Adoo got forward at every opportunity and defended well when he needed to and the number 11, Kasim Aidoo, who changed shirts at half time to one without a number, had a few tricks in front of the stand, when attacking the car park end in the 2nd half.

One other mention goes to Dexter Peter, who looks incredibly strong and composed, holding off the Harrow strikers without any fuss. There will be tougher battles for Dexter but he looks like a player that we will enjoy watching.

All in all, a good run out in front of a good crowd and nice to be back at Coles Park watching a game.
