HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.



The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was

ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for most other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both game ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team has always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League will not be continuing with an Under 23 (Development) Section at all. Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 (and also winners of the League's Colwyn Cup competition) and 2009/10. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former

professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an Adult League is not without its problems.

The foundations are in place for an eventual assault on the title to secure a National League place for the men's senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic prospect as we pursue our ambition to achieve promotion to the National League should be within the capabilities of our talented squad. The facilities and structures are in place for all the Club's teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

HISTORY OF ST. ALBANS CITY FC



League History

Following the formation of the club in April 1908 St Albans City were granted use of the council owned Clarence Park ground and entered the Spartan and Herts County leagues. Both were won prior to the Great War. After the war City joined the Athenian League. Winning that twice in three years was an achievement that paved the way to joining the Isthmian League in 1923. Within a year City were crowned champions of that league too. St Albans were the first club to win the Spartan, Athenian, and Isthmian League championships. By the end of the decade the club had won the Isthmian title on two further occasions. The 1920s could be seen as St Albans City's golden days with three Amateur Cup semi-final appearances also being made and a whole host of players gaining representative honours, including the record goalscorer Wilfred 'Billy' Minter (365 games, 356 goals), who gained three Amateur England caps.

City achieved just two more top two finishes before, along with Corinthian Casuals, being the first club to be relegated within the newly expanded Isthmian League in 1974. A second relegation was endured nine years later but it proved to be the spark for an upturn in fortunes. City turned to one of their former players John Mitchell – his semi-final goals took Fulham to the 1975 FA Cup Final – to be their new manager and with two promotions in three years the club was back in the Premier Division of the Isthmian League. City, again under Mitchell, were denied promotion to the Conference in 1993 after finishing second to Chesham United. The Football Conference took exception to a 140-year-old oak tree situated within the terrace. The diseased tree was felled in 1998, clearing the way for City to join the Conference South as founder members in 2004 following a 5-4 play-off victory over Bedford Town.

Having battled against relegation for much of that first season, 2004-05, the Saints, now managed by Colin Lippiatt, gained promotion a year later with victory in the play-off final over Histon. After just one season in the Conference National St Albans were relegated back to Conference South but went down with the highest points total of any side to finish bottom of the Conference since the league added two extra Divisions. Life back in Conference South was far from easy and in 2011, following a deduction of ten points and a fine of £9,500 for financial irregularities, City were relegated to the Southern League.

After just three seasons, Graham Golds and Jimmy Gray led City back into Conference South with a play-off victory at Chesham United. Facing relegation in 2016, City turned to Ian Allinson with the former Arsenal player not only guiding the club to safety but settling in for a six-year stint at Clarence Park. Allinson left the Saints in October 2022 with his replacement, former City player David Noble, leading the club straight into the play-offs. Victories over Chelmsford City & Dartford took City through to the promotion final where a dominant Oxford City side were triumphant, leaving the Saints to settle for another promotion pushing season in the National League South.

Cup History


In addition to winning ten league championships, St Albans City have enjoyed success in 49 cup finals. The Herts Senior Cup has been won 13 times and the Herts Charity Cup 25 times. Possibly the most prestigious cup won was the London Senior Cup in 1971, a year after being beaten finalists, and the London Challenge Cup in 1995. City also hold a most unwanted record as the side to have made more Amateur Cup semi-final appearances, four, than any other club without ever going on to play in the final. In 1999 the FA Trophy was added to the list with a semi final defeat to Forest Green Rovers. The club has also lifted silverware on foreign fields winning the Victory Cup in the Channel Islands in 1926 and 1928, and in 1927 the Liege Cup was won in Belgium. St Albans have also played matches in France, Germany and Italy. The club has reached the 2nd Round of the FA Cup on six occasions and defeated two Football League clubs; Brentford in 1924 (attendance 8,825) and Forest Green Rovers in front of the BBC cameras in 2021. The record attendance at Clarence Park was for a quarter final Amateur Cup tie with Ferryhill Athletic in February 1926 that City won 4-1 in front of 9,757 spectators.

Famous Saints

Prior to the abolition of the Amateur England side in 1974, five St Albans players were capped by England; Barrie King (5 caps), Wilfred Minter (3), Ernest Grimsdell (2), Fred Fayers (1) and H.E. (Ted) Miller (1). Other

international caps have been gained by Paddy Roche (Northern Ireland, 1), Geoff Anthony (Wales, 3), Lee Clarke (Northern Ireland U21, 1), Dave Webb (England Youth, 3), James Comley (England C (1) and Montserrat (2)), and Anton Blackwood (Antigua & Barbuda, 1).

City's all time leading appearance maker is Phil Wood who played in 900 games between 1962-84. In addition to being City's highest goal scorer, Wilfred Minter also holds the record for scoring most goals (7) in an F.A. Cup tie and finishing on the losing side as City went down 8-7 at Dulwich Hamlet on 22nd November 1922. Seventy-two years later Steve Clark, City's second highest goalscorer and appearance maker, became the second City player to score a double hat-trick in the F.A. Cup as the Saints beat Hillingdon Borough 11-1. The club can boast of several players to have progressed through them to the Football League, these include; Arthur Grimsdell moved from the Saints to Watford and then Tottenham Hotspur, leading them to victory in the 1921 FA Cup Final. Dean Austin also went to Spurs via Southend United, earning City £90,000 in transfer fees along the way. Other players to have moved from City to League sides include Junior Morias (Peterborough United), Tony Kelly (Stoke City), Harold Miller (Charlton Athletic, Chelsea), Allan Cockram (Brentford), Dean Williams (Brentford) and Michael Danzey (Peterborough United), George Edmonds (Wolverhampton Wanderers via Watford). Grimsdell and Edmonds faced each other in the 1921 FA Cup Final. During the 2022-23 season defenders Alex Lankshear and Riccardo di Trolio signed for Blackpool and Coventry City respectively.

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

This afternoon it gives us great pleasure to welcome the players officials and supporters of ST. ALBANS CITY FC to the CVS Van Hire Stadium for this, our penultimate pre season friendly. Likewise we welcome our Match Officials for the day who are James Keane assisted by Steven Walsh and Yashar Yekta. St. Albans came within a whisker of being a National League side having finished 6th in the National League South Division last season but could not quite make it through the play-offs. We wish them well in their endeavours to go up this season.

In recent years the only match between the Clubs was our home Friendly in the ill-fated 1919/20 season which "The Saints" won by 2-1. But there was a time when matches between City and the Tufnell Park half of our Clubs were regular occurrences for St. Albans had unbroken membership of the Isthmian League from 1923 to 2004 (leaving via promotion to "The Conference") while Tufnell Park were members from 1919 to 1952 (leaving by voluntary relegation after finishing bottom for 4 consecutive seasons). Our home matches were played at various location used by Tufnell Park during that period but never at Coles Park.

The Under 23s who will be competing in the Senior (highest) Division of the Essex Alliance League will commence fixtures on Saturday 12th August with a Home game against Kit Out London FC. This may well be their only Saturday Home game as they will normally play home matches on Friday evenings, but very unusually, both our First team and ground sharers New Salamis have away games on Saturday 12th. On Friday 18th we will be at home to FC Petrocub. On Friday 25th August we will be at home again to Frenford Development and the September fixtures are not yet published. They have a home friendly against Haringey United on Friday August 4th.

The Under 18s have drawn a bye in the Extra Preliminary Round of the FA Youth Cup so their season will begin in the week commencing 4th September – day as yet unknown – with a visit to Bowers & Pitsea in the Preliminary Round, They will be continuing their membership of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League but this time in its Olympian Division; that is expected to have 9 members but the fixtures are yet to be announced. Their Home games will normally be played on Mondays.

The Womens League fixtures have been announced and are listed later in this programme and are also now shown on our haringeyboroughfc.com and .net websites. On Sunday 16th they commenced their pre-season season campaign with a trip to Donkey Lane from whence they returned victorious having overcome Enfield Town by the emphatic score of 9-2. They were without a game last Sunday tomorrow they have a friendly with Watford Under 21s at St. Clements Danes School, Chorleywood kicking off at 2pm. They start their competitive fixtures on August 13th with a visit from Luton Town.

THE VIEW FROM THE BELL END

Haringey Borough 2 Royston Town 1 Pre-Season Friendly 25/07/2023



Tuesday night saw the most competitive game we have seen this pre-season. Royston Town came wanting to play a passing game, working the ball out from the back at every opportunity, which was attractive on the eye but Boro who were slightly more direct, also put together some good passing passages of play and overall deserved the win.

Watching pre-season games over many seasons you get to see lots of players that may appear once or they may get 2 or 3 games, and then they disappear never to be seen in the yellow and blue again. On Tuesday's showing I hope we get to see more of the number 9, Temi Babolola. He looked good, held the ball up and laid it off well. Clearly scoring a goal as a centre forward helps as well.

It should also be said that our defence is looking very healthy. It was noticeable Tuesday that Raks was playing right back and playing well, MoD is having a great pre-season, looking fit, bombing forward and being instrumental in much of our good attacking play. Ebenezer is looking a welcome addition and like MoD is good going forward. Scott has picked up where he left off last season, winning tackles and keeping forwards at bay and Dexter I believe has oozed control and assurance, he is also very vocal which is something we've not had for a while. We've only conceded 1 goal in 4 games and I've felt we've dealt with the attacking play of the opposition well.

In terms of the game, as mentioned Temi opened the scoring in the 41st minute, when his shot from just outside the penalty box with the outside of his boot, hit the post and went in. Worth mentioning Jorge Sambu's control and spin, in one movement Jorge sent his marker the wrong way to open up the space for the pass to Temi, superb. 1-0 at Half Time to the Boro.

The first action in the second half was the awarding of a penalty to Royston in the 52nd minute following a foul in the area, the penalty was missed and hit with such force that the crossbar is probably still shaking. We then had a strange incident whereby the floodlight on the main stand side, nearest the car park didn't come on, which left the corner area in darkness for the rest of the game. It wasn't of the magnitude of Merstham 2018, but it was still pretty dark.

Boro went 2-0 up in the 80th minute when Harry Philippou with a great bit of skill to drag the ball back away from the defender and square it to Pawel who evaded a defender and passed it into the bottom corner. It was a really good finish.

There was still time for Royston to dent Boro 100% pre-season clean sheet record when Cain Keller scored for the Crows but it finished 2-1.

Boro's clean sheet may have gone but the unbeaten run continues. The attendance was 117.

Lastly a big thank you goes to Rick who has overseen the turnstiles and provided the attendances for the pre-season games to date. Much appreciated.

50 Years of the Boro

Formed in 1973 through the merger of Edmonton and Wood Green Town, 2023 is the 50th anniversary of Haringey Borough FC. Initially known as Edmonton & Haringey the club changed its name to Haringey Borough in 1976, and for one season in 1995/1996 took the name Tufnell Park, that only lasted one season though before reverting back to Haringey Borough.

A few of the fans have been carrying out research on the club and I hope during the course of the season we can give mention to this anniversary event and include some articles. One theme that runs through the research is the state of the pitch when it was grass. Postponements and moans galore.

KASIM AIDOO – young left back but with plenty of Isthmian experience having been with Potters Bar Town and briefly Hastings United last season and Cray Wanderers in the previous season as well as National League Eastbourne Borough. Originally with Charlton Athletic Under 21s. Signed in close season

GEORGIOS ARESTI – Cypriot International midfielder who numbers AEK Athens among his previous Clubs; 2017/18 deadline day signing and now virtually an automatic selection for every match.

BOBSON BAWLING – attacking midfielder in second spell with us who left for Hendon at the end of 2021/22 but came back at Christmas 2022. Originally joined us from Enfield Town at the start of the 2020/21 season having previously been with Crawley Town, Woking and St. Albans City.

CHRISTOS DJAMAS – Cypriot Under 21 International signed in October 2020. Midfielder who was most recently on contract at Othello Athienoy and previously with Apoel Nicosia and Agia Napa.

JORGE DJASSI-SAMBU – midfield powerhouse now in 10th season with Club; opponents know when they have been tackled by this non-stop box to box player. Dangerous in opponents box at set piece situations.

STEFANOS GEORGIU – signed from St. Margaretsbury a few days before the March 2022 Registration deadline; a right sided midfielder also a dangerous attacking full back who immediately looked at home at this higher level of the game.

ARTHUR IRONTTON – defensive midfielder who moved to us from Hendon in the close season. An experienced player whose earlier berths include Stevenage, Braintree Town, Kings Lynn Town, and Hampton & Richmond Borough.

CALLUM ISMAIL – skilful young full back previously with Bowers and Pitsea who joined us in September 2018 and after establishing himself in the Under 23s and on the bench made his first start in December 2019.

ALPHANSO KENNEDY – Goal scoring winger signed in 2022 close season. Was with Wingate & Finchley last season and also played for FC Romania; played against us when we lost 1-0 at Wingate & Finchley on August Bank Holiday Monday 2019.

PAWEL KOWALKOWSKI – Polish striker – last Club Czarni Jaslo - who joined us in the close season. Briefly with Wealdstone in season 2018/19 then returned to Poland.

MEKHI LEACOCK-McLEOD – attacking midfielder who rejoined us earlier last season from Farnborough. Wide attacking midfielder who also numbers Halifax Town, Accrington Stanley, Eastleigh and Romford among his previous berths and Fulham, Wolverhampton Wanderers and Glasgow Rangers at Under 23 level.

SCOTT MITCHELL – a summer 2017 signing; 22 year old central defender who was previously with Dagenham & Redbridge. Almost an ever present in 2017/18 season and thereafter; now an established member of the squad who sometimes wears the captains armband.

MICHAEL O'DONOGHUE – powerful full back who re-joined us after spending some time at National League side Concord Rangers. Formerly a professional with Colchester United. Superb dead-ball deliverer.

DEXTER PETER – much travelled central defender signed in the close season who was with Bowers & Pitsea last season. A product of the Millwall Academy, he was released in February 2015, and went on to play for Merstham and, Chelmsford City before joining Colchester United's Academy in June 2016, and made his first-team debut in August 2016. He was released by Colchester in May 2017 and then joined Concord Rangers and had spells at Maldon & Tiptree, Thurrock, Coggeshall Town, Grays Athletic, Hullbridge Sports and Wingate & Finchley before joining Bowers and Pitsea.

HARRY PHILIPPOU – Long serving midfielder who has come through our Under 18 and 23 teams and made a scoring debut at Kingstonian on his First Team debut last season.

RAKIM RICHARDS – versatile player with us since 2010 and most usually to be found in a defensive role but quite at home in midfield and a menace in the opponents penalty area when corner kicks arrive. Captain for 2022/23.

ST. ALBANS CITY PLAYER PROFILES 2023-24



MICHAEL JOHNSON (28/10/1993) - 29-year-old goalkeeper Michael Johnson joined The Saints from Hitchin ahead of the 20/21 season, and quickly became a favourite amongst fans.

In his over 80 appearances for the club, Johnson has made a name for himself with his outstanding penalty record, with memorable saves against Corinthian Casuals, Concord Rangers and even on his first game back from injury in the 22/23 season against Weymouth.

'Jonno' as he's affectionately known has struggled with injuries across the previous two seasons, missing four weeks with a leg injury in 21/22 and much of the 22/23 season with a broken finger.

JACK JAMES (26/01/2000) - Attacking full-back Jack James joined the club for the 23/24 season as one of the first signings in David Noble's managerial career.

A product of the Luton Town academy, James spent loan spells with Hitchin and Havant & Waterlooville before joining Braintree Town in 2019.

Playing as a Republic of Ireland U19 international, 'JJ' featured in all three of the Boys in Green's group topping performance at the 2019 U19 European Championship.

Spending the last three seasons with Gloucester City in the National League North, James brings a wealth of experience to his first season with St Albans City.

SAM BROWN (30/10/1992) - 30-year-old defender Sam Brown began his football career at Kempston Rovers, before making the switch to Rushden & Diamonds.

Brown spent 8 years at the club, before making the switch to Banbury, aiding the club in their promotion to The National League North and their successful following campaign maintaining their step 2 status.

A left-sided player, the 30-year-old can play as both a central defender and a traditional left-back.

DAN BOWRY (29/04/1998) - Son of former Crystal Palace, Millwall and Colchester United midfielder Bobby Bowry, Dan began his career in the Charlton Athletic academy.

Comfortable on the ball and in defence, Bowry joined Cheltenham Town in 2019, before spending loan spells with both Bath City and Wealdstone and ultimately departing the club to join then National League Kings Lynn Town.

After spending the last campaign with fellow free flowing National League South side Worthing, Dan joined up with David Noble's squad in the lead up to the 23/24 season.

MICHAEL CLARK (05/09/1997) - Central defender Michael Clark is into his second spell with St Albans City, having spent a brief stint with the club between 2018-2019.

Coming through the ranks at Leyton Orient, Clark was called in to the first team in the 16/17 season as Orient attempted to avoid a first relegation out of the football league in their history, making 9 League Two appearances at the end of the campaign.

Upon leaving Orient, Clark had spells with Braintree Town and Concord Rangers, before his first stint with The Saints. The defender then rejoined Braintree Town before returning to Clarence Park during the 19/20 season.

A number of injuries have impacted on Clark's regularity in the side, but the versatile defender plays an important role in the squad.

NATHAN CARLYLE (19/12/2000) - A product of the QPR academy, Carlyle initially joined Weymouth on loan during the 21/22 campaign, before joining The Terras permanently for the 22/23 season.

A key part of the south-coast side's great escape from relegation, Carlyle joined up with David Noble's squad for 23/24 as a marshalling central defender full of fight and determination.

RAUL DA SILVA (20/03/1996) - Portuguese central defender Raul da Silva has enjoyed a football career spanning much of Europe, with spells in Malta, Norway, Sweden, Denmark and his native Portugal before joining Cheshunt for the 22/23 season.

An ever present feature of Craig Edwards rotation heavy squad, Da Silva proved a physically strong central defender, who's aerial ability catches the eye of many around the league.

DYLAN FAGE (18/03/1999) - Frenchman Dylan Fage came through the ranks at AJ Auxerre in the Burgundy region of France. A Martinique native, Fage then made the move to Oldham Athletic, making 60 appearances in League Two before joining Macclesfield for the 22/23 season.

A versatile player, Fage can play as a winger and wing-back on either flank, as well as a central midfielder.

BEN WYATT (04/02/1996) - Born and raised in Norwich, left-back Ben Wyatt spent his youth career in spells with Norwich City and Ipswich Town, before making his first senior move to Maldon & Tiptree.

Signing a professional deal with Colchester United after impressing for the Essex side, Wyatt was then loaned to Concord Rangers, before making a permanent switch to Braintree Town, where he linked up with fellow Saint Michael Clark. Wyatt initially signed for St Albans ahead of the 2018/19 campaign, winning three Player of the Month awards and the Supporter's Player of the Season before being snapped up by National League Sutton United.

Ben played a key role in the Us promotion to the football league, and stayed with the club for their first ever season as a League Two side. Moving on from London, Wyatt then joined Torquay United, before re-joining St Albans City during the 23/24 pre-season as undoubtedly the most exciting signing of the season at the club for fans.

RYAN BLACKMAN (03/02/1995) - Central Midfielder Ryan Blackman may only have been at the club since January 2023, but has already concreted himself as a fan favourite thanks to his tireless workrate and visible passion for the club. A coach at Tottenham Hotspur, Blackman has spent playing spells with Enfield Town, Waltham Abbey, Welling United, Concord Rangers and even a brief stint on the wrong side of the A414 with Hemel Hempstead Town.

Initially joining the club on loan midway through the last campaign, David Noble was quick to negotiate a permanent move for the midfielder, who's unwavering commitment and effort is evident every time he steps onto the pitch.

BEN SMITH (17/03/2004) - Midfielder Ben Smith used the 22/23 season to transition from prospect to first-team player following his departure from Watford. Arriving off the back of pre-season, Smith initially spent time in the St Albans City B team, before David Noble's arrival at the helm provided the chance for the youngster to step up into the first-team squad. Making his debut out of position at Eastbourne Borough, Smith's composure on the ball immediately impressed, with the midfielder playing a key part in the remainder of the season, including a start in the 2022/23 promotion final.

BOBBY DUNN (10/08/2003) - Featured in BT Sport Films' 'South of the River' documentary hosted by Rio Ferdinand, Bobby Dunn impressed in a spell with non-league Ramsgate, earning himself a move to Sheffield Wednesday.

After an early release from his contract, Dunn joined Dartford with two month's remaining in the 22/23 season, but injuries prevented the midfielder from making the impact he desired. Impressed with the St Albans City fans during the play-off semi-final, Dunn only had his sights on one club for his next move, linking up with David Noble's squad for 23/24.

GIORGIO RASULO (23/07/1997) - Midfielder Giorgio Rasulo joined St Albans City from having spent five seasons with Banbury United, playing a part in their 21/22 promotion campaign to The National League North.

Starting his career with MK Dons, Rasulo was a highly fancied prospect of the academy, making his first-team debut for the club aged just 15. 25 first-team appearances followed for The Dons between 2012-2018, with spells spent out on loan around the EFL and National League. Giorgio then made his initial switch to Brackley Town, before joining Banbury United in the 2018/19 campaign.

SHAUN JEFFERS (14/04/1992) - One of the most feared strikers in football at step 2, Jeffers' name has been ever present at the top end of the goalscorers charts since joining St Albans City for the 20/21 season.

Beginning his career at Coventry City, Jeffers has had spells across a host of EFL & National League clubs, but found his finest form since joining The Saints. Records have fallen often for the number nine, with the striker holding the third highest goals per game of any player to have played 100 appearances or more for The Saints, behind only club legends Billy Minter and Steve Clark. Beyond his consistent goalscoring exploits, Jeffers will forever be written into St Albans City folklore having scored the winning goal in the club's first triumph over a league club in the proper rounds of the FA Cup.

ZANE BANTON (23/05/1996) - Fan favourite Zane Banton took the title of longest serving player in the St Albans City squad following the departure of Tom Bender at the end of the 21/22 season. Initially joining the club from Luton Town on loan in 2017, Banton made the permanent switch following the expiry of his contract with The Hatters. With over 200 appearances for the club under his belt, Banton is a favourite with fans and coaches alike, and became just the 30th player to net 50 or more goals for the club with a goal away to Bath City during the 22/23 campaign.

MITCHELL WEISS (11/08/1993) - Watford born Mitchell Weiss has worked his way up the football pyramid from grassroots football in Cassiobury Park through to becoming a St Albans City regular.

Having spent a number of seasons at Kings Langley, Weiss also made appearances for Hayes & Yeading and Hemel Hempstead Town, including scoring an last minute equaliser for the latter in an A414 derby. Weiss joined The Saints ahead of the 20/21 season, and has gone on to make over 100 appearances for the club.

GEORGE MORRALL (24/11/2003) - Youngster George Morrall burst onto the scene with an 87th minute equaliser in The Saints opening FA Cup fixture of the 22/23 campaign, announcing his intent to stick around the first team squad. Struggling to make as consistent of an impact, Morrall spent the beginning of the 23/24 campaign on loan with Cheshunt.

ANDRONICOS GEORGIU (28/10/1999) - A product of the Tottenham academy, Georgiou first donned the St Albans City shirt during a loan spell from his then parent club Stevenage in 2019. Georgiou then made the switch to Wycombe Wanderers, before joining Haringey Borough and then Kings Langley. The midfielder then joined up with former team mate David Noble in The Saints squad for 23/24.

MANAGEMENT

DAVID NOBLE (HEAD COACH) - Following an illustrious career in the Football League with Bristol City, Exeter City, West Ham and more, Noble made the move to St Albans City to round out his career. Spending 5 seasons in the playing squad, Noble began to take up a coaching role with the side, before assuming a temporary role as Head Coach following the departure of Ian Allinson.

Success came quickly for the side, leaving the ownership little option but to appoint Noble and his attractive style of play into the role permanently, with the side finishing third in the table for games played after he took the reins. Noble goes into 23/24 as his first full season in management, hoping to build on the successes of last season.
