HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.



The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was

ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for most other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both game ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team has always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League will not be continuing with an Under 23 (Development) Section at all. Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 (and also winners of the League's Colwyn Cup competition) and 2009/10. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former

professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an Adult League is not without its problems.

The foundations are in place for an eventual assault on the title to secure a National League place for the men's senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic prospect as we pursue our ambition to achieve promotion to the National League should be within the capabilities of our talented squad. The facilities and structures are in place for all the Club's teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

HISTORY OF MARGATE FC



The club was founded in 1896 and joined the Southern Football League in 1933. After a spell in the Kent League after World War II the team returned to the Southern League in 1959 and remained there until 2001 when they gained promotion to the Football Conference, the highest level of English non-league football. Their stay at this level saw the team forced to ground share with other clubs due to drawn-out and problematic redevelopment work at their Hartsdown Park stadium, and during the three years spent away from their own ground they were expelled from the Conference National and subsequently relegated to the Isthmian League.

After the Second World War the Gate continued to play in the Kent League under new manager Charlie Walker, who led the team to two Kent League championships but was then controversially sacked. The team slumped during a succession of rapid managerial changes which only ended in 1950 when Almer Hall was appointed manager, a post he was to hold for the next twenty years. Under Hall the team won a host of local cup honours and reached the rounds proper of the FA Cup on several occasions, but never managed to match this success in league competition.

In 1959–60 Margate returned to the Southern League after the Kent League folded, and in 1962–63 won the Division One championship and with it promotion to the Premier Division. Two years later the club turned full-time professional but this policy proved financially untenable when the team were relegated back to Division One in 1965–66. Nonetheless, they won promotion at the first attempt and returned to the Premier Division in 1967.

During the 1970s Margate endured severe financial problems and a series of mediocre league seasons but took part in two famous FA Cup ties. In 1971 the Gate lost 11–0 to Bournemouth, with Ted MacDougall scoring a cup record nine goals. Then, a year later, Margate beat Swansea City and Walton & Hersham to set up a third round tie against First Division Tottenham Hotspur, then UEFA Cup holders. A record crowd of over 14,000 packed into Hartsdown Park for a match which Margate lost 6–0.

In 1996, the club's centenary year, the club appointed Chris Kinnear as manager. In 1997–98 he took the team to the first round proper of the FA Cup where they played Fulham in a home tie that drew a crowd of 5,100. Although the Gate took the lead, the Cottagers eventually won 2–1. The following season saw the club finally win promotion to the Southern League Premier Division, albeit only after an appeal was lodged against the league's initial refusal to allow the team promotion due to the club failing to carry out necessary ground improvements in time. The Premier Division championship followed in the 2000–01 season, and with it promotion to the Football Conference.

The 2001–02 season was Gate's first ever season of Conference football and they finished the season in eighth place. In the 2002–03 season the team began ground sharing at Dover Athletics' Crabble while redevelopment work took place at Hartsdown Park, but various problems stalled the planned redevelopment. On the pitch, Margate enjoyed more success in the FA Cup when, after defeating Leyton Orient in the first round, they were drawn at home to Cardiff City in the second round, but lost 3–0 at Crabble. The following season, despite finishing sixteenth, the Gate were forcibly relegated one division due to the ongoing delays and problems with the redevelopment plans for Hartsdown Park.

Margate spent the 2004–05 season in the Conference South, now ground sharing at Ashford Town. Amidst ongoing issues with the redevelopment work, which at one point made it seem very likely that the club would fold completely, Margate were again relegated to the Isthmian League Premier Division.

After 10 years in the Ryman Premier Division Margate won promotion back to the Vanarama National League South after beating Hendon in the play-off final at the Earlsmead Stadium. Ryan Moss scored the winning goal as Terry Brown's side celebrated promotion back to second tier of Non-league Football.

Margate's first season back in the National League South was a rollercoaster ride with survival secured on the final day of the season despite a 2-0 defeat to Bath City. A run of 11 defeats from their final 12 games left Margate needing results elsewhere to keep them in the division and Weston Super-Mare's 1-1 draw away at Havant & Waterlooville meant Havant were relegated.

Since the 2017-2018 season Margate have been in the Isthmian Premier League, where under new ownership


the Club have installed a state of the art 3G Pitch, plans are in place to develop the stadium further and build a hotel on site. The Club narrowly missed out on the play offs in the 2017-18 season and after the departure of manager Steve Watt the Club went through a period of transition and were able to avoid relegation in the 2018-2019 season thanks largely to the presence of Jay Saunders as temporary manager. At the start of the 2019-2020 campaign fan favourite Jay became our permanent manager and is still at the helm for season 2021/22, after season 2020/21 was made null and void.

The 2021/22 saw Margate enjoy their most successful season in a while as they finished 8th in the Isthmian Premier Division, and reached the Velocity Trophy final for the first time in 24 years. The final ended in a 4-0 defeat to Horsham, however the Blues also reached the Quarter-final of the Kent Senior Cup, where they were beaten by eventual winners Dartford FC. At the end of the campaign, Manager Jay Saunders was approached by National League South side Tonbridge Angels, and he decided on a new chapter with them and left Margate in May 2022 to take up the position as Manager at the Longmead Stadium.

The Club moved quickly to install a new Manager as Andy Drury was appointed on the same day as Saunders departed. A former Ipswich, Luton Town and Stevenage player, Drury possesses extremely good knowledge of the game. He had spent just a handful of games in charge at Whitstable Town, however this is his first full season in Management.

Sadly, after just six months in the job, the Blues dismissed Drury and Reece Prestedge and Ben Greenhalgh were installed as interim joint managers on 26th December 2022. Prestedge and Greenhalgh were handed the job on a permanent basis on Monday 10th April 2023 after securing the Blues survival in the Isthmian Premier Division. Margate ended the season with some celebration after they lifted the Kent Senior Cup in May at Gillingham after beating Chatham Town 5-4 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in 90 minutes. It was the first time the Blues lifted the trophy since 2005.

After a run of bad results Reece was relieved of his duties in early December and Margate brought in the vastly experienced Mark Stimson to replace him.

IN THE week where the sporting world stood still for the Taylor Swift show (aka, the Super Bowl), our very own live TV showcase was entering the spotlight.

While the pop superstar took centre stage during the most-watched sporting event across the Atlantic, the Football Association here were finalising terms for a four-year, multi-million pound deal with TNT Sports to show the FA Cup from the 2025-26 season.

As part of the agreement, TNT Sports, who have won many plaudits this season for their coverage of the National League and even North and South, will share the rights with a free-to-air broadcaster.

As part of the deal, all games from the third round onwards outside of 3pm kick-offs will be broadcast live, while the Wembley final will be shown on both TNT Sports and free-to-air.

At present, and for the past four seasons, the BBC and ITV currently share rights for the FA Cup and details of the extent of the involvement of free-to-air channels covering FA Cup games will be announced in due course. TNT Sports, however, insist the deal, reportedly worth £66million-per-year - an increase of 15 per cent on the current deal – “will ensure that the world’s longest-running national knockout football competition continues to be as broadly available as possible across the UK”.

“Selected matches from every round will be available free-to-air, and highlights of every game will be made available,” they said in a statement.

In his NLP column this week, Matt Badcock outlined the pros and cons of the new deal amidst a rather mixed social media reaction with critics suggesting having fewer FA Cup games shown live on free-to-air television hammers another nail in the world’s most famous cup competition.

But, as Matt rightly pointed out, FA Cup ties being played behind a ‘paywall’ is nothing new. Sky Sports, Setanta, ESPN and BT Sport have all had deals in the past with another channel showing games free.

And, let’s not forget, games will be free-to-air under this deal too. We just we don’t yet know by who.

Suggestions are at least two games per round will be free to view – as well as one semi-final and the final – but, clearly, having stumped up the big bucks, TNT will dictate what they have.

From a Non-League point of view, that won’t be such a bad thing if they put National League teams on the games. As mentioned earlier, their coverage of the National League this season has been exemplary.

Far from some of the patronising coverage Non-League often has to put up with in the past, the TNT commentary team led by Adam Summerton and including the likes of very own Adam Virgo and Aaron McLean tell the National League story with knowledge and passion, capturing some of the division’s biggest moments as if it were a Champions League final.

Crucially, Matt also points out that while opinion is shared on the deal, the real focus should be on the extra revenue and what it can do.

FA Cup TV money is a key revenue stream for the FA to invest back into the game. A lot of good can be done with it and there are good people at Wembley who know that.

The fall-out from Covid saw the prize pot slashed. Having seen it doubled from previous years, it had to be trimmed back again with the Women’s FA Cup – quite rightly – benefitting as a result.

It’s vital for the Non-League and lower league game that the FA Cup fund is topped up again - especially in the early rounds where so many clubs have a chance at bringing in money on sporting merit rather than status alone.

We believe Non-League football deserves as many eyes on it as possible. And, of course, some more cash in the kitty.

EBENEZER ADOO – Right back, signed in the summer of 2023 from FC Romania, Ebenezer has quickly established himself within the team, he likes to get forward and a strong tackler.

BEN ALLEN – Ben returns from Chatham Town for a 2nd spell at the Boro following a very successful period last season, which saw him score 11 goals in 19 games, including 2 in the London Senior Cup final. A popular player with the fans, who will hope Ben can carry on where he left off, in terms of finding the back of the net.

GEORGIOS ARESTI - Cypriot International midfielder who numbers AEK Athens among his previous Clubs; 2017/18 deadline day signing and now virtually an automatic selection for every match.

DILLON BARNES - Goalkeeper, who has played for the Jamaican national team, appeared for Colchester United, Hibernian and most recently Queens Park Rangers.

BOBSON BAWLING - attacking midfielder in second spell with us who left for Hendon at the end of 2021/22 but came back at Christmas 2022. Originally joined us from Enfield Town at the start of the 2020/21 season having previously been with Crawley Town, Woking and St. Albans City.

HARRY SEADEN – Harry is our new 'keeper between the sticks and former England youth level player who represented the under 16s and under 17s categories. Harry's career started within the youth ranks of Southend United and has made 4 appearances for their senior teams. Harry has gone on to have several loan moves with teams such as Cambridge City, Colchester United, Great Wakering Rovers and Dagenham & Redbridge before enjoying his first full spell as a number 1 with Billericay Town where he established himself as the first choice and enjoyed a great season before joining the 'Gate and becoming our very own number 1.

REECE HOBBS – Reece is an 18 year old keeper who is a product of Ben Greenhalgh's Dartford Academy. He has impressed pre season so earned his place in the Margate squad for the 2023/24 season.

TOBY STEVENSON – 24 year old Toby was signed from Braintree Town in January 2024. A product of the Leyton Orient youth academy, Stevenson succeeded on loan at Heybridge Swifts before he moved to Charlton Athletic. He played three times for the Addicks. His most successful seasons of his career came at the Essex side, playing a combined 51 times from 2021-2023 scoring five goals. He was a consistent performer in the Blues backline and he got a move back to Braintree Town of the National League South. So far this season, he has played eight times scoring one goal.

HARRY HUDSON – Harry is an integral part of the 'gates backline and a main reason for our success in last year's Kent Senior Cup final, with a fantastic defensive performance and scoring the winning penalty. Harry's footballing journey began in the academy ranks of West Ham United before at the age of 16 he moved to be part of the Watford FC set up where Harry had a couple of good loan moves to Cray Wanderers and Billericay Town. After his two loan moves Harry left Watford in search of first team football and was picked up by Tonbridge Angels and guided the side to consolidating their place in the 6th tier of the English footballing pyramid. Following his time at the Longmead Stadium Harry was picked up by the 'Gate last summer and staked his claim at the heart of central defence and has led to Harry becoming an integral and core member of the club.

TYRONE STERLING – Tyrone is a true non-league veteran of the game; Tyrone has racked up a very impressive 585 appearances in the game. Tyrone began his career with five years at Cray Wanderers. After his time with Cray, Tyrone joined former National league side Dover Athletic where in his time with the club was able to help get the club promoted by winning the National League South play-off final back in 2014. Following his time at Dover Tyrone had short stints with Dartford, Bromley, Concord Rangers, Hemel Hempstead and Dulwich Hamlet. On two separate occasions once with Concord Rangers and once with Bromley Tyrone missed out on silverware by being part of the team that was runner up in the FA Trophy in the 2017/2018 and the 2019/2020 seasons. Tyrone returned to Dover last season before moving to the 'Gate this summer to provide manager Reece Prestedge with more experience in the squad. Impressively Tyrone has also made 5 appearances for his country of Grenada where his debut was in 2018 during a CONCACAF nations league game. Tyrone has also even played for England in the 6 aside Socca World Cup in 2019.

BEN GREENHALGH – Ben is an experienced midfielder, forward and assistant manager to Reece Prestedge. Ben has enjoyed a long career thus far with several trophies to his name including the 2010 champions league with Inter Milan, Four different cup competitions and a league title. Ben has played for numerous clubs, including Ebbsfleet United, Maidstone United, Concord Rangers, Inverness Caledonian Thistle, Hemel Hempstead and Dartford where Ben is part of the coaching team for the Academy at Princes Park. Ben joined the club two years ago and his impact has been exceptional and is a true role model for upcoming talent coming through for the club as well as being a brilliant leader on and off the pitch. Ben was top scorer for the 'Gate last season netting 12 times to help the club confirm its status in the Isthmian Premier Division.

SAM BLACKMAN – Newly appointed captain Sam is our experienced midfielder in his second spell at Hartsdown Park having previously played for the 'Gate in the 2017/2018 season. Sam began his career with Leatherhead before joining us in the summer of 2017. After his first short stay with the club Sam moved onto Concord Rangers and then Dartford where Sam was part of the Concord team which took place in the delayed FA trophy final at Wembley 2020. Daniel bounced around a host of clubs before finding a home at Dover, where he played 57 times for the Whites from 2017-2019. He then joined Margate on loan in 2019 where he impressed in six games, scoring four goals, which was enough for the 'Gate to sign him permanently the next season. He made 27 appearances for us in the 2019/20 season scoring eight goals from midfield. He has also played for Hampton & Richmond, Hayes and Yeading and Folkestone Invicta. This season, he found himself at Horsham, where he played 15 times scoring five goals and being a part of their magical FA Cup run where they got to the first-round proper, knocking out league one side Barnsley, causing a massive cup upset. He has also represented Guyana 18 times.

DOMINIC VOSE – Midfielder Dominic signed for us in January 2024. Gate fans may remember the name as Vose did sign for us in 2020 but didn't play a match due to covid-19. The 30-year-old was most recently at Hastings United where he had a short spell before leaving the Sussex side for Thanet. Dominic Vose enjoyed spells in the football league at Barnet, Colchester United, Scunthorpe and Grimsby as well as a host of non-league clubs including Welling United, Dulwich Hamlet and Bromley. He then tested his abilities overseas, playing for Icelandic club, Magni Grenivik and Gibraltar side Europa F.C before he decided to return to England to play for Hastings United.

YASER KASIM – Midfielder Yaser joined the 'Gate in February of last season and quickly became an integral part of the team and played a major role in us winning the Kent Senior Cup as he scored the 2nd goal in our semi-final win against Ramsgate. Kasim left us at the end of last season where he joined up with Eastbourne Borough in the National League South and played 14 times, scoring one goal. Yaser also played over 100 times for Swindon Team and has also represented Iraq 21 times. Gate resigning him in January 2024.

LEWIS KNIGHT – Lewis is our 30-year-old tall powerful centre half marking his second spell with the club following his initial arrival in 2021 from Billericay Town. Lewis began his career on the books of Thamesmead Town before signing on at now fellow Isthmian Premier League side Concord Rangers. From there Lewis spent a season with St Albans City and then in 2019 joined the ranks of Billericay Town where he impressed, and Margate snapped up the 6"4 centre half in 2021 to partner up with at the time Ben Swift. After having a loan spell with Isthmian Premier side Enfield Town. At the conclusion of the 2022/2023 season Lewis joined Ashford United. Lewis made six appearances for Ashford before re-joining Margate in October to add depth to the defence for the 2023/2024 season.

MO KAMARA – 28 year old Midfielder Mo signed in February 2024 from Herne Bay having played for the Bay in the 2017/18 and 2020/21 campaigns. He has played every single game for the Bay this season before reuniting with us for a second time having played under Jay Saunders in 2021 where he mostly featured in defence He has also played at Faversham Town, Ashford United, Concord Rangers, Potters Bar, and Whitehawk.
