

CAPITAL GAINS

The Capital Cup quarter final draw pitting Boro against Tottenham Hotspur WSL Academy threw up a number of intriguing questions. Would Boro finally play a team with a lower average age than us? Is it really an N17 derby when the visitors play their home games in Cheshunt? Can we even call it a derby when the opposition are an academy side? And why do Spurs have a page on their website for their men's under 18s who don't play senior competitions but nothing for their WSL academy?



A bumper crowd and a feisty game clearly answered at least some of those questions. Many of Boro's players looked like they had a point to prove, having recent history with Spurs' Academy,

either playing against, being rejected by or in the case of Boro stopper Liamara Hensel Berg being their third-choice goalkeeper.

Spurs, who beat Dulwich Hamlet after a penalty shoot-out in the previous round, were composed in possession and sharp out of it. Despite Boro being the senior side, the visitors looked bigger, stronger and more athletic than Boro. In particular, Jada, who normally terrifies fullbacks with her pace - was up against a defender who was quicker than her..

From the start, the match quickly settled into a pattern where Spurs tried to get into a passing rhythm and Boro tried to disrupt it.

Haringey's aggressive press led to a number of fouls and Spurs' youngsters - clearly well drilled in a core professional skill - often went down far too easily under minimal contact, grabbing the ball when they did so to pressure the young referee - 16 year-old Luka Elson - to award free kicks.

Both sides, their benches and supporters were getting frustrated - Boro with the softness of the freekicks that were being awarded to the opposition, Spurs with the lack of cards. Rimini got the ball (inadvertently) booted at her head while play was stopped. At the next opportunity she went straight through the back of the player. Things were getting chippy.

At half time it was Spurs who seemed to be winning their duels. With half-time fast approaching, a quick break from Spurs forced a tactical foul from Lilian to give away a free-kick just inside the Boro half. The resulting free-kick bounced in the penalty area, over Liamara and in.

After the half time interval, both teams took to the pitch, but the referee did not. It was a pity that she didn't feel she could see out the game - you have to question the London FA's decision to give a local derby to a teenage referee with so little experience in senior football. I hope the experience doesn't put her off refereeing too much.

The extended half-time interval and Elson's departure seemed to take some of the sting out of the game; Boro looked much more composed and comfortable as the second half progressed.

In the end though it was set pieces that transformed the game. Firstly Rimini fired a howitzer from the half-way line that sailed high into the air, dropping perfectly into the top-corner.

Then, with ten minutes to go, Tori stood over a free-kick about ten yards outside the box and fired a rocket that seemed to swerve slightly in the air as it arrowed towards the top corner. I'm pretty sure I've seen her score the exact same free kick about six different times, against different opponents. It never gets old.

She nearly got another go a few minutes later, this one from further away - and again the kick was accurate but this time drew a superb save.

So it was left to Chloe lons to deliver the coup-de-grace. Which she did, straight from a corner. Katie McCabe eat your heart out. The remaining few minutes were relatively comfortable.

The final whistle blew: Boro had earned a semi-final place, secured N17 bragging rights and made a statement about the value of grassroots football as a means of developing young players.

And with Actonians standing between us and the finals, we get another opportunity to show what we can do against National League opposition. I can't wait.



OUR HISTORY

Although Haringey Borough FC was formed in 1973, the Women's team wasn't formed until the start of season 1999/2000 and played only occasional "friendlies" in that first season.

In the summer of 2000 we merged with Mill Hill United and were accepted into Division 2 of the Eastern Region League for season 1999/2000, gaining promotion to Division 1 as runners-up to Saffron Walden Town while based at the rather bleak Donkey Lane Playing Fields in Enfield.

The merged Club adopted the name of Haringey Borough and re-located to the Coles Park stadium of the Spartan South Midlands League club, founded in 1907, in White Hart Lane, Tottenham.

2000/2001 – 16 unbeaten League matches but finished third on goal difference. Eliminated two Greater London League sides in the Women's FA Cup.

2001/2002 – 9 unbeaten League games and promotion to the Premier Division as runners-up. The League Plate was garnered with a 4-1 victory over Cottenham United and a regional 5-a-side trophy.

2002/03 – we led the League for two weeks in mid-season, before finishing a comfortable 4th, retaining the regional 5-a-side trophy.

2003/04 – the team were rocked by a sudden spate of long-term injuries and departures of erstwhile regular players but with a late burst succeeded in preserving its Premier Division status.

2004/05 – the team appeared in the finals of five small sided competitions and finished in a safe midtable position.

2005/06 – the Club progressed through two preliminary rounds of the Women's FA Cup finishing midtable again and were finalists in the League Cup losing by a late goal against the League Champions Norwich City Canaries.

2006/07 – the team finished third despite a slow start and early dismissal from all knock-out competitions.

2007/08 – the team lost three long serving players to National Premier Division sides and played most of the season with a very small squad. Despite that the team had three London County Cup victories including victory over local rivals Tottenham Hotspur in the quarter final. We went on to reach another semi-final in the League Cup.

2008/09 – an extraordinary season where in mid-March relegation looked a likely outcome but an astonishing turnaround saw the team suffer only one defeat in the remaining 12 games and had that game been won, the runners-up spot would have been secured instead of 4th place.

2009/10 – notable for the 5-match run in the Women's FA Cup. In December, the team led the Premier Division and looked favourites to win the Championship but an unexpected deterioration in form finally resulted in a mid-table finish.

OUR HISTORY CONTINUED...

2010/11 – a very challenging season including loss of established players and a series of long-term injuries. The team saw several successful rounds in the Women's FA Cup but the lack of depth in the squad meant that relegation could not be avoided.

2011/12 – a slow start in Division One but as our campaign gathered pace we eventually finished second and thus earned promotion back to the Premier Division at the first attempt.

2013/14 – a major development took place when the Club was struggling midway through this season with the appointment of Steve Browne as Manager and he brought with him his highly successful S & T Academy Girls who in their mid and late teens were becoming too old to continue in Youth football.

2015/16 – mid-table position was easily secured.

2016/17 – the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course at Christmas by the tragic early death of Manager Steve Browne on New Year's Day. After a shaky period we re-asserted ourselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League. We followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win to complete the double.

2017/18 – several of the top players were lost to USA Scholarships and other Premier League teams and a torrid time ensued in Division One South-East and the team returned to the Eastern Region League.

2018/19 – the team began to rebuild only to see the newly appointed manager accept a role in his home Country of Greece at Christmas. A new manager was appointed and the coronavirus pandemic put a premature end to the season with results being deemed null and void.

2019/20 – The appointment of Bob Cato, formerly of Derby County Ladies, Leicester City WFC and a former Haringey Borough player, has brought about much needed leadership and strategy to the team's play. A refreshed side with new players brought in though partnership with Haringey Girls Academy means that there is a now a full pathway from Wildcats to Women's football and much needed depth in the squad with 30+ players at training every week.

2022/23 – the season started strong with a team consisting of predominantly under 18s. Borough remain a contender to win the league as well as reaching the quarter finals of the Capital Women's Cup having beaten tier 4 side London Seaward en-route. Borough narrowly lost out to tier 3 side London Bees whose clinical finishing in front of goal proved to be the deciding factor.
