HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan



League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was

ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for most other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both game ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team has always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League will not be continuing with an Under 23 (Development) Section at all. Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 (and also winners of the League's Colwyn Cup competition) and 2009/10. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former

professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an Adult League is not without its problems.

The foundations are in place for an eventual assault on the title to secure a National League place for the men's senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic prospect as we pursue our ambition to achieve promotion to the National League should be within the capabilities of our talented squad. The facilities and structures are in place for all the Club's teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF LEWES FC

The Early Years

Lewes Football Club was formed following a meeting at The Royal Oak pub on 23 September 1885. For the first eight years, the players wore light green shirts which were designed to reflect the scenery of the surrounding South Downs, but black and red finally became the club colours in 1893.

The club has played at the Dripping Pan ever since, apart from a couple of seasons prior to the First World War when the club was banished to the adjoining Convent Field. The early years of the club produced only mediocre results and successes were few and far between. In 1920, Lewes became founder members of the Sussex County League.

1960s

Progress was slow and despite four runners-up places, by the 1960s Lewes had only one Sussex RUR Cup win to their name. In 1965, the club's fortunes changed dramatically, winning the County League title for the first time with a massive nine-point lead over runners-up Lancing, as well as both the RUR and Sussex Senior Cups.

Lewes became members of the Athenian League and after winning the Division 2 title in 1968, promotion to the Premier Division was gained just two years later when the Division 1 title was snatched from Boreham Wood, with a further Sussex Senior Cup triumph added in 1971. Six years later, the club entered the newly expanded Isthmian League.

1980s

Promotion to Division 1 soon followed although two sixth place finishes in 1982 and 1989 were the highest positions attained in Division 1. During that time, Lewes reached the final of the Sussex Senior Cup on three occasions and won the trophy in 1984/85.

1990s

Disaster struck in 1990/91 when Lewes were relegated for the first time in their history. An immediate return as runners-up to Purfleet followed, but that success was short-lived and relegation in successive years meant that by the 1994/95 season the club was down in Division Three.

The slide continued and the first season in the basement division would have been the last in the league if it hadn't been for Cove who conveniently propped-up the league and saved Lewes from automatic demotion. The club survived rather than thrived until the 1998/99 season when Jimmy Quinn joined as manager, and at the first attempt missed out on promotion by just one place. Midway through the 1999/2000 season Martin Elliott and a new board of Directors stepped in and immediately the fortunes of the club began to improve, with the capture of the Sussex Senior Cup in 2001 following victory over Bognor Regis.

Naughties (2000s)

There was mixed news on the pitch. The pinnacle of the Men's team's achievement, and what a pinnacle, was to gain promotion to the top of the non-League pyramid in 2007/8. However, the Rooks only lasted one season in the top flight as the Global Credit Crisis hit and funds dried up. The Rooks' new economic reality saw them drop down the divisions.

However, a brand new Women's team was started by Jacquie Agnew and underwent a dramatic rise form park football to the Women's Combination.

A New Dawn (2010s)

Behind the scenes, a group of six supporters calling themselves Rooks125 were working hard to take the club into community ownership having witnessed the serious financial problems that had befallen the club, despite the owners' best efforts.

Finally on July 8th, 2010, Lewes FC was officially transferred out of private ownership into a mass-ownership Community Benefit Society called Lewes Community Football Club, consisting of benefactors and members of the former Management Committee.

The six members of Rooks125 formed the inaugural Executive Board, working as volunteers to install improved working practices and procedures during the season before planning to open up the wider ownership of LCFC to all the club's supporters in 2011/12. The first chairman of the Community Club was appointed in 2013 with club legend Terry Parris taking up the position. Terry was succeeded by Stuart Fuller in 2015. All Board positions now are elected by the whole Ownership base.

In the summer of 2017 the club hit the headlines globally when it announced that it would pay our Men's

and Women's squads the same – a first for any semi/professional club in the world. Under the Equality FC banner, the club attracted and continues to attract a number of partners who shared the same beliefs and vision for gender equality in sport.

On the pitch, restricted resources saw the team drop two Leagues, down to Step 4 but under Darren Freeman they gained promotion as runners-up in the Isthmian League South in 2017/18, then came within a whisker of a play-off spot in the Isthmian Premier the following season.

The Lewes Women's side were given a place in the inaugural Women's Championship, the second tier of English football playing alongside sides such as Manchester United, Leicester City and Tottenham Hotspur. In December 2018 they attracted a record attendance when nearly 2,000 fans saw them host Manchester United at the Pan.

So where are we now?

Freeman stepped down in October 2019 after four years in charge to concentrate on his footballing career away from management and after a period when his former assistants Ross Standen and Tony Coade led the side, Hugo Langton took over the hotseat in February 2020, leading the team to 16th spot before the COVID-19 pandemic curtailed the season.

In April 2021, the Club appointed Tony Russell as manager and former Lewes player Joe Vines as his assistant. Their appointment and unique playing style brought new impetus and invigoration to the Rooks who finished just four points outside the play off places in 2021/22.

The Rooks had a sluggish start to the first half of the 2022/23 season but found their feet and came agonisingly close to finishing in the play offs, losing out on a goal difference of plus two. The season also saw a sell-out crowd at the Dripping Pan as the Women's team lost to Manchester United in the FA Women's Cup Quarter-Finals.

The club is building a solid foundation on which to build for the future. It has around 2,500 Owners and has gained a great reputation for all its community work and stand-out marketing especially with the continued stance on pay equality and committed stance against the harms of gambling advertisement in football.

I was so humbled and touched when after our 6-0 defeat recently fans actually came up to me and just said "it's ok " I was visibly so disappointed with our relegation but those comments just reinforced what we have created at this Club, a Club of inclusion and unity with such a special core, such good people that I genuinely do not believe any other Club possesses to such an extent.

I have seen all the other clubs who have fallen and the backlash against those that run their respective Clubs yet here I haven't seen a single "Aki out " banner let alone a barrage of online abuse. Thankfully you seem to feel we are doing something right.

Just to curry favour again moving forward and keep you lot off my back for another year I AM PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE THAT FOR THE 9TH SEASON IN A ROW THE CLUB WILL BE OFFERING FREE SEASON TICKETS ONCE AGAIN IN RESPECT OF ALL LEAGUE GAMES FOR THE 24/25 SEASON – There is a caveat however and that is that the on line application (or for those who cannot do it online there will be a form to complete at the Club) MUST be made by no later than the Saturday 28 September 2024, thereafter there will be a cost to purchase a season ticket in the sum of £30 for the remainder of the season. We offer a warm welcome to the players, management team, committee and supporters of Lewes and to our officials, referee Jake Hillier and his assistants Thomas Burns and Matthew Basterfield

Well, our fate was sealed in pretty spectacular fashion against Billericay on the 6th April losing 6-0, although the writing was on the wall it was still a surreal experience. My feeling is one of disappointment, not because we've got relegated but because of the hard-work it took to achieve getting to the Isthmian Premier League in the first place. That might sound strange but step 3 is the highest level the club have played at, the hard work needs to start again and will probably be even harder this time given the money being pumped into clubs and the competitiveness of the football.

I don't really want to inflict further pain by reminding you of the Billericay game but it should be mentioned that both Dren Hoti and Ruben Tavaras-Baptista made their first starts in the team, both have been regular members of the U23s this season so credit to them on their promotion.

The away game at Wingate & Finchley saw us put up a much more spirted performance and if football wasn't about scoring goals, wasn't about getting into the penalty area but was about possession of the ball, we were the better team. We defended well and another new debutant Oliwier Fusiek was excellent at centre half, Ollie has been in and around the first team for most of the season so it was great to see him take his opportunity. Well played Ollie. Also of note was Dren's performance in goal, very assured and he looked the part, which I always think is a big deal in having assurance in your goalkeeper. As it was a single goal which came from a ball down the right wing which looked close to being out of play, the winger cutting along the goal line and squaring it back for the only goal of the game. After 5-0, 5-0 and 6-0 defeats, a 1-0 loss almost felt a relief.

The following Tuesday we made the trip to Potters Bar and like every time we travel there the question always asked is "Has anyone ever seen us win here?", well for those present they will continue to answer the question with a no. Again, another spirted performance but we came away with a 2-1 loss. The positives of these musings so far have been around the progression of the U23 players that have stepped up. That was the case again at Potters Bar with Stephane Mgbada getting our goal in injury time, following him having a good game after coming on early for Bobson. By my reckoning we had gone 541 minutes without seeing a goal so you can imagine those there were very excited to finally see one.

For interest, our league record at Potters Bar is played 11 lost 7 Drawn 3 Won 1. So, if you were at the game on the 18th September 1999 to see a 2-1 win, lucky you. I omitted cup games from this as our record is played 3 lost 3. Not a happy hunting ground.

What is a happy hunting ground though is Imperial Fields in Morden, home of Tooting & Mitchem United and Kingstonian, our previous two visits had seen us beat Tooting 2-1 in the London Senior Cup and Kingstonian 3-0 in the league last season. That record was maintained last Saturday with a fine 3-0 victory in our last league away game of the season, in the battle of the basement teams, 22nd v 21st. As is it we cannot finish bottom now. The back four was much changed with Charlie Smith returning from injury, Oliwier Fusiek missing out through injury and right back Ebenezer playing centre back. Whilst Kingstonian were poor, the team played well and credit to Ebenezer who was excellent. Olu who played a captain's role and to Mekhi who we've been crying out to shoot more all season, grabbing two goals.

Our away league record reads Won 3, Drawn 4, lost 14, scoring 20 and conceding 39.

Women's Team – The Women played out an exciting 4-4 draw against Stevenage in their most recent game which sees them maintain their position of 2nd in the league, currently their main challenge to securing 2nd is from Luton Town who have still to play runaway leaders Real Bedford, twice. Which leads nicely into the game played on the 7th April, Real Bedford v Haringey Borough.

Now I cannot do justice to the game by writing a match report given I watched on a live stream hosted by Bedford. So please see a comprehensive report here https://womensfootballeast.com/match-report-557/ I'm not someone that generally watches football on a laptop or iPad as I prefer to be there or watch a game out with friends but I must say I thoroughly enjoyed watching the game at home and Real Bedford did a great job of streaming the game. The overriding emotion, given Real Bedford had not dropped a point all season, was one of pride, I must say it was really emotional watching a Haringey Borough team giving a bloody nose

to counterparts that have walked away with the league this season.

Please try and get along to Hendon FC on the 2nd May for the Capital Women's Cup final, where the team will play Ashford Town in the final. Directions to Jubilee Park can be found within the programme and your support would be very much welcomed.

U23s – In what has been a fine first season for the U23s, they beat Aveley U23s 5-1 in their final game of the season which saw them finish 3rd in the league, having also got to the semi final of the Senior Division Cup.

U18s – The U18s season finished in February and they finished 3rd in the league.

I make no apology but I have a number of thank you's given the season is coming to an end.

Firstly, an off-field team that warrants special mention is the Social Media team, the advertising of games, level of detail at games and just general promotion of Haringey Borough has been truly incredible. Kiki Christofi, Dave Worley and Jim Shepherd, absolutely superb, thank you!

In a similar vein, thank you to Dave Cumberbatch. For those that are not aware apart from being the Club's Welfare Officer and Assistant Manager, if that's not enough! Dave oversees for home games, Football Web Pages and the Non-League Paper. Keeping up with yellow cards and substitutions is not an easy task at times!

In putting the programme together, thank you to Richard Brickell the programme editor, and for the contributions to the content, Gerard Walker for the travel and pubs information for away games and to Rick McEwen who has helped with the history of the club features.

Thank you to the volunteers who have made the match day operations run smoothly all season.

Thank you to girls behind the bar that have looked after us all season, Apples, Gina, Bianca, Clare, and Bobbie. Sorry if we've been miserable for most of the season!

Let's not coat it it's been an incredibly difficult season and I know there's been an enormous amount of soul-searching but this club is what it is, a warm, welcoming and friendly club because of the likes of Tom Loizou and Tucker O'Donoghue, they've never hidden behind disappointments or the results this season. They are always available and always approachable.

Thank you to the players, look if you read this and think, are you mad, we've just been relegated, then I'm sorry but we spend a great deal of our time, travelling, discussing and encouraging the players, so thank you for always being available in the bar after a game and for always willing to engage in conversations. We are all sorry over the number of times you've said sorry after a game this season. At times we know it's been embarrassing and particularly Hashtag away we all thought of just leaving to save that embarrassment, but we didn't want you to think we didn't appreciate you, so we stayed and probably created further embarrassment, I'll stop there, I'm digging a hole for myself, but thank you.

Thank you to the fans. THANK YOU to the fans. All season you've stood by the team and our attendances have been unbelievable. It means a huge amount to those at the club and please stick with us next season. I love the fact our fan base covers all ages as well, from Arlo and his gang behind the goal to Trey leading the singing, to us older ones at the back of the stand. I sound like a scratched record but it is truly wonderful.

If I've missed anyone then sorry but thank you!

On a personal level I want to thank Aki for the opportunity of becoming more involved in the club, it's an incredible honour and responsibility and something I don't take lightly. On that note I know what it must have been like to follow Sir Alex Ferguson, given John Bacon's years of esteemed service. It has been fantastic to have John return with Fiona to games recently and whenever faced with a situation I always think, what would John Bacon do! Knowing John is at the end of the telephone has been a tremendous comfort. On that note I must thank Kellie Discipline at the Isthmian League who has been very supportive and helpful.

We've helped each other at times so a huge thank you goes to our other secretary's Sue Doyle (U23s), James Edgerly (U18s) and Karla Parker (Women's) the time and effort that is needed to arrange games, deal with disciplinary issues, liaise with officials and ensure pre and post admin work is correct, is incredible and underestimated, and there are many more tasks undertaken without fuss.

Finally, thank you to Johnny Fitsiou (Managing Director) who has been a constant help and constant contact

getting and giving quick answers to situations and ensuring I don't have to chase too much. Having Johnny around and his responsiveness has made the role easier.

So that's it for the 2023/2024 season not a vintage one, far from it but we've had some good times as always and I believe as a club we bring something to the league in terms of a warm welcome, hospitality and an incredible fanbase, so whatever league we find ourselves in next season we will continue to do the same.

Directions

By Car

From Staples Corner travel north along the A5, towards Edgware, through West Hendon past Sainsbury's on your right, to the junction with Kingsbury Road at the traffic lights. Turn into Kingsbury Road and Townsend Lane is the 3rd turning on the left, at the top of the hill. The ground is in the bottom left hand corner of the Silver Jubilee Park. Please note that on site parking is limited and the car park is often closed well before kick off. There is plenty of side street parking.

By Train

Nearest National Rail station is Hendon (Thameslink). Buses 83, towards Alperton, (every 7 mins) and 183, towards Pinner, pass Hendon station and close to the ground. Best stop to alight 83 is Slough Lane (avoids walk up & down steep hill), and 183 is Townsend Lane.

By Tube

Nearest tube station is Kingsbury (Jubilee Line). Approximately a 20 minute walk along the main road (turn right out of the station) and right down Townsend Lane. Or bus 183 to the top of Townsend Lane. Alternatively Metropolitan Line to Wembley Park, bus 83, (every 7 mins) towards Golders Green, from Stop N. Ride 6 stops to Queensbury Road, then walk 9 minutes to the ground.

Pub

Really aren't any decent pubs on the way, the clubhouse has always been very welcoming. Alternatively alight from Kilburn Station, Metropolitan Line, and walk 6 minutes down Kilburn High Road to this pub. We used if for our last visit to Hendon and was very good.

Whether it's kick-off time on FA Cup final day – incidentally this year's is 3pm – or clamours for a return to semi-finals away from Wembley, the world's oldest competition always stirs debate.

You will have no doubt seen the furore around the news replays will be scrapped from the first round proper onwards next season.

A big trigger, apparently, is the expanding UEFA schedule going forward and there are promises of more funding for the grass-roots game.

A post on BBC Sport's X account suggested it would divide opinion – the reality was a large part of it fell on one side.

There probably isn't enough space in this programme column to go through all the 'he saids, she saids', and much more. But it has ignited passionate views from all corners of the game, to say the least.

What's your view? Are replays outdated or the very fabric of the great FA Cup?

For many in the lower leagues and Non-League, replays not only represent a chance to make extra money on top of a current cup run through gates and potential broadcast fees, they are also an opportunity to create memories.

Many clubs have come out and said exactly that over this past week.

Steve McKimm's Cray Valley PM held Charlton Athletic to a draw earlier this season and earned the right to welcome the League One club to their intimate Artic Stadium home in front of the live TV cameras.

"The money they're saying will be passed down is great – but money doesn't make memories," McKimm told us.

"We've had memories this season that will never be taken away from our staff, players and fans. And I only speak for our club – Horsham did the same.

"We both had away games to start with so we had the experience of playing at their grounds. Then we had the opportunity to bring good players, good teams, back to our home ground on live TV. That's gone now.

"But it's the memories that matter more than the money. For clubs that make money off it, such as us, it's great. It helps a club be sustainable and it helps it move on. But it also gives the club memories.

"Cray Valley have never had a League One side come and play a competitive game at our stadium. We've done that now."

As the Millers boss says, Horsham did the same in this year's competition – earning a replay after a thrilling 3-3 draw with Barnsley before a memorable home tie with the Tykes.

There are many other examples. Think back down the years to Burton Albion, then in the Conference, taking the mighty Manchester United to a second game. The tangible legacy is seen at the club today, but for fans and players the memories burn bright too.

Football, as a whole, should be sure it's happy giving moments like those up.

EBENEZER ADOO – Right back, signed in the summer of 2023 from FC Romania, Ebenezer has quickly established himself within the team, he likes to get forward and a strong tackler.

BEN ALLEN – Ben returns from Chatham Town for a 2nd spell at the Boro following a very successful period last season, which saw him score 11 goals in 19 games, including 2 in the London Senior Cup final. A popular player with the fans, who will hope Ben can carry on where he left off, in terms of finding the back of the net.



GEORGIOS ARESTI – Cypriot International midfielder who numbers AEK Athens among his previous Clubs; 2017/18 deadline day signing and now virtually an automatic selection for every match.

RUBEN TAVARES-BAPTISTA – Full back Ruben is a product of the U23s and has been promoted to the first team and made a good impression.

DILLON BARNES - Goalkeeper, who has played for the Jamaican national team, appeared for Colchester United, Hibernian and most recently Queens Park Rangers.

BOBSON BAWLING – attacking midfielder in second spell with us who left for Hendon at the end of 2021/22 but came back at Christmas 2022. Originally joined us from Enfield Town at the start of the 2020/21 season having previously been with Crawley Town, Woking and St. Albans City.

ARTHUR PENNEY - Penney is an exciting young defender who captained Millwall U21s and is a commanding figure at the back. Arthur previously spent the 21/22 campaign on-loan at Welling United, making 19 appearances in the National League South, scoring one goal.

RONNIE VINT - A commanding centre back, Ronnie, spent 10 years with Dartford from youth to senior level and following two loan spells with Dulwich Hamlet, he joined them permanently in January 2022. A centre-back who is strong in the air and scores his fair share of goals from set pieces.

Ola joined us from Bishop's Stortford in the National League South following an impressive two seasons with Hornchurch. During his time with the Urchins, he got over 30 goal contributions in 60 appearances and was influential in their push for promotion. His performances earned him a brief move to Concord Rangers before returning to Hornchurch and eventually joining Stortford in the summer.
