

# **WE'RE GOING TO TBC**

There's a wonderful photo on the Haringey Borough Women's instagram page from the Capital Cup semi final against Actonians.

It's the moment after Saoirse Hourigan had taken the ball on her chest (contrary to what the fake news merchants in the main stand/the Actonians website will have you believe, it was not a handball) and lashed an unsavable volley past the Actonians keeper into the top corner.

As she wheels away celebrating, she's captured in front of a backdrop of half a dozen fans, hands aloft, screaming.



You can almost see the nervous energy of the past hour or so dissipating as the Boro fans celebrate, and the feeling that we were, maybe, going to get what we deserved from the match.

Boro fans are in general a pessimistic bunch and at half-time all the talk was about missed chances, missed opportunities.

Despite getting off to the worst possible start - conceding after 18 seconds - Boro had more than held their own; equalising thanks to an ice-cool finish from Nellz Humes and had defended well to keep the dangerous Actonian attackers quiet (shout out to Chloe Ions who won pretty much everything).

Marta and Nellz had also forced a number of excellent saves from the Actonians keeper, and the midfield were working hard to prevent Actonians from hitting any sort of rhythm.

But despite being second-best, Actonians had looked dangerous going forward, especially from set pieces. Liamara Hensel Berg made a couple of crucial stops including a ridiculous point-blank stop from a free header.

As the second half progressed, Actonians seemed to have an edge in terms of fitness with Boro looking leggier and leggier. The sense of inevitability; that we were going to make an error and let the visitors grab a winner they scarcely deserved.

Saoirse's goal changed that - two minutes later, Nellz dinked the ball over the keeper, and ran onto her chip to give Boro a 3 - 1 lead.

That wasn't quite the end of it. With minutes left on the clock, Actonians pulled a goal back. However, Boro's response to conceding was to keep possession deep in Actonians' half to run down the clock.

"Que sera sera, whatever will be will be, we're going to TBC" we sang behind the goal as the final whistle blew. And then piled into the HBFC board-room (the bar was in use) to celebrate.

It was wonderful to see coaches, fans, volunteers and of course John Bacon who has been all three at one point or another dissecting the match.

As John Bacon suggested, it was one of the club's best ever wins.

## WHAT A HEADER!

Head injuries are often not given much attention in comparison to other injuries but they do remain a persistent issue in sports, and the realm of women's football is no exception. The exponential growth of women's football in the UK has been a triumph, with increased investment, participation and media coverage. However, as the sport reaches new heights, so does the scrutiny on player safety.

The most commonly seen head injury in sports is concussion which is often referred to as a mild traumatic brain injury that occurs due to a sudden jolt or blow to the head, causing the brain to move rapidly within the skull. The early signs of concussion include headache, dizziness, difficulty balancing, nausea or vomiting, confusion or disorientation, sensory disturbances, fatigue or drowsiness, mood changes and sleep disturbances. In football, concussions can occur anytime due to collisions, heading the ball, falls, during tackles and/or accidental contact.


While heading is a fundamental skill in football, research suggests that headers are one of the leading causes of concussion. It can be caused as a result of repeated or forceful headers, particularly if the technique is incorrect or if the ball is struck with excessive force. However, any suspected head injury should be taken seriously and the affected individual should be removed from play and evaluated by a qualified medical professional as soon as possible.

A study published in the Journal of Athletic Training indicates that concussion rates in women's football are comparable to, if not slightly higher than those in men's football. Factors contributing to this increased risk include differences in neck strength, hormonal influences and Ovarying style of play. Furthermore, research conducted by the FA in England has highlighted the need for increased awareness and education surrounding concussion in football. The FA has since then implemented measures to improve the identification and management of head injuries.

Societal attitudes and perceptions surrounding concussion may also play a role in underreporting among female athletes. Cultural expectations of toughness and resilience, coupled with a lack of awareness about the signs and symptoms of concussion can lead players to downplay or ignore head injuries, exacerbating the problem.

As awareness grows and research continues to uncover the nuances of head injuries in women's football, it is essential to prioritize player welfare and implement evidence-based strategies to mitigate risks effectively.

By fostering a culture of safety and support, we can strive to reduce the prevalence of head injuries and ensure a healthier future for female football players at all levels of the game.





### ADOBE WOMEN'S FA CUP LAUNCH EVENT



The Adobe Women's FA Cup has come a long way since Southampton Women's FC won it in 1970. Fast forward fifty-four years and the competition is more popular than ever with record viewing figures and WSL players reaching millions across social channels.

A new partnership between Adobe and The Football Association (announced in November 2023, which will run for at least three years) seeks to *inspire the next generation of young girls and women who dream of becoming professional players*, increase fan engagement, and elevate the profile of the competition even further.



## **OUR HISTORY**

Although Haringey Borough FC was formed in 1973, the Women's team wasn't formed until the start of season 1999/2000 and played only occasional "friendlies" in that first season.

In the summer of 2000 we merged with Mill Hill United and were accepted into Division 2 of the Eastern Region League for season 1999/2000, gaining promotion to Division 1 as runners-up to Saffron Walden Town while based at the rather bleak Donkey Lane Playing Fields in Enfield.

The merged Club adopted the name of Haringey Borough and re-located to the Coles Park stadium of the Spartan South Midlands League club, founded in 1907, in White Hart Lane, Tottenham.

2000/2001 – 16 unbeaten League matches but finished third on goal difference. Eliminated two Greater London League sides in the Women's FA Cup.

2001/2002 – 9 unbeaten League games and promotion to the Premier Division as runners-up. The League Plate was garnered with a 4-1 victory over Cottenham United and a regional 5-a-side trophy.

2002/03 – we led the League for two weeks in mid-season, before finishing a comfortable 4th, retaining the regional 5-a-side trophy.

2003/04 – the team were rocked by a sudden spate of long-term injuries and departures of erstwhile regular players but with a late burst succeeded in preserving its Premier Division status.

2004/05 – the team appeared in the finals of five small sided competitions and finished in a safe midtable position.

2005/06 – the Club progressed through two preliminary rounds of the Women's FA Cup finishing midtable again and were finalists in the League Cup losing by a late goal against the League Champions Norwich City Canaries.

2006/07 – the team finished third despite a slow start and early dismissal from all knock-out competitions.

2007/08 – the team lost three long serving players to National Premier Division sides and played most of the season with a very small squad. Despite that the team had three London County Cup victories including victory over local rivals Tottenham Hotspur in the quarter final. We went on to reach another semi-final in the League Cup.

2008/09 – an extraordinary season where in mid-March relegation looked a likely outcome but an astonishing turnaround saw the team suffer only one defeat in the remaining 12 games and had that game been won, the runners-up spot would have been secured instead of 4th place.

2009/10 – notable for the 5-match run in the Women's FA Cup. In December, the team led the Premier Division and looked favourites to win the Championship but an unexpected deterioration in form finally resulted in a mid-table finish.

## **OUR HISTORY CONTINUED...**

2010/11 – a very challenging season including loss of established players and a series of long-term injuries. The team saw several successful rounds in the Women's FA Cup but the lack of depth in the squad meant that relegation could not be avoided.

2011/12 – a slow start in Division One but as our campaign gathered pace we eventually finished second and thus earned promotion back to the Premier Division at the first attempt.

2013/14 – a major development took place when the Club was struggling midway through this season with the appointment of Steve Browne as Manager and he brought with him his highly successful S & T Academy Girls who in their mid and late teens were becoming too old to continue in Youth football.

2015/16 – mid-table position was easily secured.

2016/17 – the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course at Christmas by the tragic early death of Manager Steve Browne on New Year's Day. After a shaky period we re-asserted ourselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League. We followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win to complete the double.

2017/18 – several of the top players were lost to USA Scholarships and other Premier League teams and a torrid time ensued in Division One South-East and the team returned to the Eastern Region League.

2018/19 – the team began to rebuild only to see the newly appointed manager accept a role in his home Country of Greece at Christmas. A new manager was appointed and the coronavirus pandemic put a premature end to the season with results being deemed null and void.

2019/20 – The appointment of Bob Cato, formerly of Derby County Ladies, Leicester City WFC and a former Haringey Borough player, has brought about much needed leadership and strategy to the team's play. A refreshed side with new players brought in though partnership with Haringey Girls Academy means that there is a now a full pathway from Wildcats to Women's football and much needed depth in the squad with 30+ players at training every week.

2022/23 – the season started strong with a team consisting of predominantly under 18s. Borough remain a contender to win the league as well as reaching the quarter finals of the Capital Women's Cup having beaten tier 4 side London Seaward en-route. Borough narrowly lost out to tier 3 side London Bees whose clinical finishing in front of goal proved to be the deciding factor.
