HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan



League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10. They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24.

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

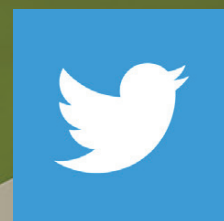

HISTORY OF LOWESTOFT TOWN



Lowestoft Town have a fine history stretching back well over 100 years. The club is first recorded as East Suffolk F C with games, all friendlies in those days, recorded back in 1884. On merging with the original Kirkley club the title of Lowestoft was adopted in 1887 with 'Town' added in 1890.

When the Norfolk & Suffolk League was formed in 1897, providing the first inter-county competitive matches, Lowestoft dominated, winning the title 6 times in the first 7 years. The 'odd' season out 1899-1900 saw Lowestoft's attentions turn to the F Amateur Cup with victories over such famous names as Leytonstone (9-0), and Gt Marlow (1-0) on the way to the final which brought a 1-5 defeat by Bishop Auckland at Leicester.

In 1904 Lowestoft had to appear before a F A Commission to answer charges of professionalism after a testimonial had raised just under £5 for player Fred Timoney who was about to emigrate. Norwich City who had 'poached' 4 of Lowestoft's successful side amongst others were also called before the commission. Whilst City accepted the ruling and formally adopted professionalism to start on the road that has seen them up amongst the top clubs in the country, Lowestoft paid a restitution of 2 guineas to regain amateur status. In 1925 came the decision to adopt the blue and white colours that have served them so well since.

Lowestoft became founder members of the Eastern Counties League in 1935 but before starting out on this new challenge once again merged with local rivals Kirkley. The move proved a wise one with the first season seeing them sharing the title with Harwich & Parkston and then winning it outright 2 years later.

Lowestoft took the bold step of becoming semi-professional in 1962. & 7 ECL titles and twice runners up in the following 9 seasons is clear testimony to the manner in which they dominated in those years.

The ECL title was again won in 1977/8. The 1980s saw a decline in the club's fortunes as crowds and income dropped. The unique club pavilion, originally the Yacht Club before being taken down and moved from the harbour to the Crown Meadow in 1902, was gradually falling into disrepair and the floodlighting system installed in 1964 was coming to the end of its lifespan. The floodlights were updated in 1986 and the new dressing room complex occupied in 1989 and at last attention could be paid to playing matters.

As playing fortunes declined a 19 year old local lad signed for the club in 1980 who was to figure prominently in the affairs of the club for the next 30 plus years. Micky Chapman soon became a favourite with his all action style, eye for the goal, long flowing hair and a genuine desire to bring success back to the club. 5 'Player of the Year' trophies adorn his display cabinet as testimony to the respect he has earned from supporters and players alike. The 1990s saw Micky progress from captain to assistant manager and finally manager in 1994. A persistent back injury forced Mick to hang up his boots in 1997 allowing him to concentrate fully on the managerial side. With the unwavering support of successive chairmen Mick had been able to improve the side year by year. In February 2012 he took charge of his 1000th game as Lowestoft manager.

After several years in the doldrums the 21st century has seen Micky team up with Ady Gallagher to bring a return to trophy winning days with the Ridgeons League title won twice, the League Cup collected twice and the Suffolk Premier Cup brought back to the Meadow five times. The culmination of all that recent success came in May 2008 when joint managers Micky Chapman and Ady Gallagher proudly led their squad out onto the hallowed Wembley pitch in the F A Carlsberg Vase final. On a blazing hot Sunday afternoon in front of over 14,000 Lowestoft supporters, the Blues were in the lead for three quarters of the game before conceding a last minute goal to lose out to Kirkham & Wesham by the odd goal of three.

Season 2008-2009 saw the first team win a League and County Cup double, as well as reach the semi final of the F A Carlsberg Vase and the season ended with promotion to the Ryman League Division One North. Success continued unabated in 2009/10 with back to back promotions seeing the Blues soar to the Ryman Premier Division at the first attempt achieving a century of points and goals for the second consecutive season. An excellent F A Cup run saw the first round proper reached with the run ended at Wrexham by a cruel deflected goal in the final minutes.

The first season in the Ryman Premier Division saw the Trawlerboys involved in the promotion race right to the end. There was just 9 minutes of the season left when Tonbridge Angels scored the goal that gave them a 3-4 victory and ended Lowestoft's hopes of a third successive promotion. It was a similar story in the

following 2 seasons with late goals in the Play Off final denying them promotion before the dream of Step 2 football was realised in 2014 with a play off victory over AFC Hornchurch and a 3rd promotion in 6 seasons. Season 2014-2015 was one of consolidation in the highest sphere the club has ever reached and despite several early morning departures and a mere 8500 plus miles of travelling a satisfactory season ended with them holding a 16th place finish suffering just a single defeat in their final 13 fixtures. On top of this the Blues closed their season out by winning the Suffolk Premier Cup for the twelfth time; beating Whitton United 2-1 after extra time. It was also a season that marked the farewell of a true Lowestoft Town legend with Micky Chapman retiring after the last league game of the season at home to Barrow, who sealed the league title that day with a 3-2 victory over the Blues. After 32 years, 480 first team appearances, 193 goals, 1640 games and 147,600 plus minutes as a player, player/manager and then manager during that time, it was the end of an era for a figure who will forever be etched in the history of Lowestoft Town FC.

Season 2015-2016 saw Ady Gallagher in sole charge for the first time but a season plagued with injuries saw the Trawlerboys relegated on the last day of the season on goal difference bringing a return to the Ryman League Premier Division. Season 2016-2017 was to prove one of consolidation as they adjusted to life at step 3 in a season once again plagued with injuries.

Season 2017-2018 proved to be one of turmoil as firstly Ady Gallagher stepped down to be replaced by his assistant Dale Brooks. The club was then hit by financial problems which saw the departure of several leading players but Brooks achieved a minor miracle by avoiding relegation with the remnants of his squad aided by a bevy of youth loan signings and the clubs scholar's.

Brooks stepped down during the summer of 2018 to be replaced by two former players Jamie Godbold and Andy Reynolds who between themselves boast over 900 appearances for the Trawlerboys. Having to build a completely new side Godbold has had to cope with three season bedevilled with injuries and covid resulting in relegation back to Step 4 and a move back across to the Isthmian League.

So a dozen years of non stop incident that has seen three promotions, three losing play off finals, 2 relegations and a 1st round proper venture and saw us travel as far north as Barrow, south as far as Bristol, west as far as Wrexham and Colwyn Bay sees as back to where this modern day adventure all started in the Isthmian League Division One North.

Season 22/23 saw Lowestoft restart their quest to return to Step 3 but in a season when they were rarely out of the top 5 saw their efforts just fail as they lost out in the play off semi-finals to Heybridge Swifts after finishing in 3rd place. The following season (2023/24) they filled top spot virtually every week of the season and rightly lifted the championship to regain their place in step 3 and now look forward to another tilt at the Southern League Premier Central.

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Lowestoft Town, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, referee Gareth Burton, assistants Bogdan Khimych and Alexander Baker together with fourth official, Nicoleta Bria.

Where do I start about Tuesday, first off, I thought we played well, certainly better passing it in spells to previous games and the two young wing backs, Caleb and Ruben continued where they left off against Wroxham by again both looking like first team players. We should have killed the game off, no doubt about it, and when the board went up showing 6 minutes of injury time there was almost a resigned expectation that those 6 minutes were going to be tricky despite having an additional player. What was bizarre about the equaliser was, I don't think I've seen a goal given whereby no spectators, none of the players, no one in the dugout, claimed or celebrated a goal. From a Concord perspective it only takes one official to see it go over the line and one other official, the referee, to give it and that is exactly what happened with the assistant referee on the far side flagging. Exceptional eyesight.

It really has been a strange start to the season having only played 5 league games and in the next 10 days facing another 3 cup games. There comes a point where we are facing cup fatigue and a bog-standard league game, 3pm on a Saturday would be met with welcome joy. Having said that the cup games bring prize money and today an opportunity to test ourselves against higher opposition.

On the league form let's take some positives, we got our first point, we dominated the game for the first time this season and we still have 37 games left to climb the table. We have a good team and we have good players and I'm not overly worried at this stage albeit the comparisons with last season continue.

Please note that should today's game end in a draw, there is no extra time or penalties, instead there will be a replay next Tuesday the 1st October 7.45 kick off. If there is a replay that game must be played to a conclusion.

Next Saturday we are away to Felixstowe & Walton United in the 3rd Qualifying Round of the FA Trophy, incredibly this will be our third FA Trophy away game against fellow Isthmian North teams, having dispensed of Redbridge and Wroxham previously. To confuse you next Saturday's FA Trophy game must be resolved on the day so if it is a draw after 90 minutes it will go straight to penalties, no replay. It is also worth knowing that in the Trophy it is 5 subs from 5 substitutes named, In the FA Cup it is 5 subs from 7 substitutes named. All understood, good.

At the end of the A143 you will reach a roundabout, where you join the A146 towards Lowestoft. After passing Oulton Broad South railway station on your left you will reach a roundabout, where you take the first exit onto the A1117 (signposted Oulton Broad). Go straight across the next two roundabouts and at the third roundabout, take the third exit towards the Town Centre (A1144). At the next roundabout continue straight on towards the town centre, but after passing the roundabout turn immediately right into Minden Road. At the mini roundabout take the first exit onto Love Street. The entrance to the ground is down on the left. There is little parking available at the ground itself, but there is plenty of street parking on the surrounding roads.

MATCH REPORT

Haringey Borough 1 Concord Rangers 1 – Isthmian League North Division

There wasn't so much a collective sigh just a stunned silence that met Concord's 95th minute equaliser that salvaged a point that should have been beyond them.

Boro, ahead at half time, with several good chances to extend the lead, then with a man advantage for the final 20 minutes contrived not to win in a fashion reminiscent of last season's early woes.

Following the FA Trophy win at Wroxham Ruben started his first game of the season, Alaa dropping to the bench, and Dan replaced Tommy.

After being one of sides relegated from the Premier League along with Boro last season Concord have certainly made a better start to league life, lying above mid-table. Boro, winless and pointless in four league matches needed to start to get results to match the cup form.

Perhaps mindful that Boro haven't started games particularly quickly this season Concord started with a lot of urgency. While Boro largely matched their industry, we didn't have enough control to threaten in the early stages. Equally, Concord were limited to a couple of shots from range and crosses from deep positions, dealt with by Michael and the defence.

Joe and Matt had half chance thwarted as Boro began to push forward more. George, Demmy and Manny seeing more of the ball, Ruben and Caleb willing runners getting forward on the flanks. One move down the left, involving the latter found Joe at the near post. Under pressure he toe poked the ball towards the near post where it was smothered by the keeper.

Boro were gradually getting on top. Concord attacks had become more fleeting, and Boro drawing more free kicks as their work rate created more half breaks.

And from one of these free kicks Boro took the lead just before the half hour. It was simple but well worked. Demmy's ball was on the money, Scott had pulled away to the back post where he climbed to power a header down into the net

Concord tried to respond, with Haringey able to repel any advances, the most dangerous of which came as result of a loose Boro pass. Michael handled the ensuing effort easily enough. He'd have one final save to make from an angled shot late in the half.

However, by that time it was hard to believe Boro weren't 2 up. In a frantic passage of play we had 3 chances to extend the lead. Credit to Concord's defence for throwing themselves to block shots from Matt and Joe, before Ruben couldn't direct his far post header the same way Scott had done a few minutes before.

Before half time Dan had to be replaced by Sean Sankanu but we were ahead at the break.

The second half began with Concord making a couple of substitutions, but the game largely remained in the pattern from the first half.

Michael dealt with whatever came his way, Sean, Scott and J'Ardell marshalled the back line, and we generally played away from our own area. The good chances came but were intermittent. The clearest chance fell to Joe. In acres of space at the back post Ruben's cross was perfect. Credit to the Concord keeper for getting back across his goal before Joe's header could sneak inside the post.

Alaa replaced Ruben soon after and Concord appeared fortunate to keep 11 players on the pitch as a robust challenge, which looked high, left Joe in a heap, but produced only a yellow card. But they soon were down to 10 as the same player, who had only been introduced 10 minutes into the second half, made an almost identical challenge on George near halfway. The referee left with little option than to brandish a second caution and a red card.

Having been in the same position the previous Tuesday at Witham, a goal and a man to the good, Boro looked to press home their advantage.

Richard and Oli were introduced in the latter stages as Boro looked to close the game out

Matt saw his curled effort from the edge of the area tipped round the post after it had taken a slight deflection, then Fred, 6 yards out centrally couldn't sort his feet out and steered wide when it looked easier to score.

As the referee indicated 6 added minutes what had looked unlikely for most of the half started to appear more feasible. Boro were sitting back and at times it seemed Concord had the extra man with wide players in space. And in the final minutes of added time their progressive play paid off. Boro had conceded a couple of corners before a third was headed goalwards. Scott had retreated onto the line and looked to have headed away, only for the assistant referee to signal the ball had crossed the line. The only noise to be heard round Coles Park were the celebrating Concord players.

It could, and should, have been a first home league win since March, but Boro now need to regroup as attention turns back to the FA Cup with the visit of Lowestoft town on Saturday.

PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS & NEXT SATURDAY'S OPPONENTS

Known as "The Trawler Boys" Lowestoft Town have never competed in the same Division of the same League as us so unless there has been a meeting of which no record can be found in one of the FA's country wide Competitions this will be the first match between the Clubs. Formed as Lowestoft in the 1880 they became Lowestoft Town after merging with local Club Kirkley in 1890. It was not until 2009 that they played in a League not restricted to East Anglian Clubs when after winning the Eastern Counties League for the 11th time they were promoted to the Isthmian League which they have graced in three separate spells punctuated by a two year spell in the Conference/National North Division and four years in the Southern League before being relegated back to Step 4 and playing in the North Division for the last two seasons. That brought them to Coles Park twice to play our then ground sharers New Salamis. Having finished first last season they were promoted back to Step 3 but allocated to the Southern Premier League Central Division in which they now hold 19th position and are thus in the Divisional drop zone having garnered 9 points from 9 games with 3 wins and 6 defeats scoring 14 goals and conceding 22.

Although no evidence can be found of a game between our Mens teams, there have been 4 matches between our Womens teams, for in 2013/14 and 2014/15 both were in membership of the Eastern Region Womens League Premier Division. Lowestoft won all four meetings. Our home games were played at Coles Park but we never trod the turf at Crown Meadow as Town's home games were played on a bleak, windswept 3G "caged" pitch at a local school, where on the second occasion it was extremely difficult at dead ball situations to stop the ball taking off without any help from a foot. Yours truly remembers it well as he was running a line. Sadly lack of players forced Lowestoft to fold and we never got the chance to improve on our disappointing record.

NEXT SATURDAY it is our turn to make a trek deep into East Anglia to face Felixstowe and Walton United – another team we will be meeting twice more in the League this season. They are a merger of Felixstowe Town and Walton United in 2000 (by which time they had become Felixstowe Port and Town). Although Felixstowe were formed around 1890 and Walton just five years later It was not until season 2018/19 when they won promotion to the Isthmian League that either of the merged Clubs had played in a League which was not exclusively for East Anglian Clubs. Although we were Isthmian's too at that time we never met them as we had won promotion to the Premier Division in 2017/18 so this will be the first season both Clubs have been in the Step 4 North Division.

However we have twice met them in FA Competitions, firstly in the 2nd Round of the Vase at Felixstowe in 1980/81 with the home Club winning 2-1, and secondly in the Extra Preliminary Round of the Cup in 2005/06 Cup when they departed from Coles Park as 3-0 winners. They missed promotion from the North Division by a whisker in the last three seasons, and are well placed in this years table to challenge again. They visited Coles Park in the last two seasons to meet our then ground sharers New Salamis. Our respective Under23 teams met three times in the North Division of the Isthmian Development League in 2022/23 before that Section was discontinued with Felixstowe winning the first by 2-0 at home, us winning the second by 4-0 at home. and us winning the third at Felixstowe by 1-0.

THE VIEW FROM THE BELL END

For those that aren't aware, Haringey Borough has an U18s team that take part in the FA Youth Cup each season. Through a venture with Barnet and Southgate College the team is made of students aged 16-18. They also play league games and are in Nemean division of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League.



Given the FA Youth Cup takes place in late August / early September in most seasons it is the team's first game of the season and that was certainly the case this season, talk about needing to be ready from the off. On Wednesday 2nd October, the team will be playing in the 2nd Qualifying Round away at Heybridge Swifts. It is the third away game in the competition this season having beaten Saffron Walden Town and May & Baker Eastbrook Community.

Having seen both games the team is made up of skilful, hard working players who don't mind a strong tackle and don't mind playing the game at breakneck speed. Also, both games have been played in a really good spirit with both teams appearing to appreciate each other in terms of the respect shown. This respect no doubt has something to do with the influence of the coaches, Glen Hicks, James Edgerley and Tucker O'Donoghue. The team have been a real credit to them in the games seen.

It should also be noted several first team players have emerged from the U18s, current players Oliwier Fusiek, Louis Maffia and Ruben Tavares Baptista have all starred for the U18s and previous Boro players, Sami Bessadi, Callum Ismail and Jordan Edwards were graduates of the U18s.

Everyone at the club wishes them the best of luck and we look forward to them in the future to them progressing to the first team.

It may be the best part of eight months until the players of both Isuzu FA Trophy and FA Vase finals fulfil their childhood dreams and walk out under the arch of Wembley but ask each of every club left in the two premier Non-League competitions and excitement levels are already reaching fever pitch!

This week, the FA Trophy third qualifying round draw was made, involving all clubs from Step 3 of the pyramid.

And it was another landmark week in the Vase calendar too with the first round 'proper' was drawn from the hat.

We all love a stat so each week in The NLP, when such draws are made, we join forces with our friends from Factfile, who provide us with all the top stats and trends from the FA Cup, Trophy and Vase ahead of each round. Provided by Phil Annets, author of 'FA Cup 150' short-listed Football Book of the Year 2022, the facts and figures always make for fascinating reading and are readily available on X or other social media streams. This week, Phil has surpassed himself with his Trophy tales as the Step 4 hopefuls look to continue their road to Wembley against those from a higher level.

Five clubs; Hadley, Littlehampton Town, Flackwell Heath, Horndean and Newton Aycliffe enter third qualifying round territory for the first time, as do the only competition debutants left in the hat, Real Bedford, They travel to Bowers & Pitsea on Saturday.

Barton Rovers have got to this stage for the first time in 24 years and Karl Marginson's Trafford for the first time in 22, while Herne Bay will be hoping that victory at Chichester City will take them into the first round for the first time in their 13th campaign.

Congleton Town, who host Hyde United, are eyeing a first round berth for the first time in 27 years.

City of Liverpool's reward for registering a record FA Trophy victory (4-0 against Pontefract Collieries in the last round), is a home tie against last season's semi-finalists Macclesfield FC.

The Isuzu FA Vase draw is equally as fascinating after a record-breaking second qualifying round.

An incredible 6-6 draw between Aylestone Park and Clay Cross Town is the first such scoreline in FA Vase history, while Chadderton FC's 8-4 win over Retford United is only the third such scoreline.

Cranfield United travel to Tividale for their first ever first round appearance at their 11th attempt, while eight debutant clubs are still left in the competition; Allscott Heath, FC Hartlepool, Foley Meir, Rayleigh Town, Sturminster Newton United, Sutton United (Birmingham), Windsor and Eton and Wombwell Town.

Stonehouse Town, of the Hellenic League, travel to Downton for their first first-round tie in 49 years in the ninth campaign back in the competition.

The biggest winners of last weekend, Daventry Town, will be looking to follow up their 7-0 victory over Rushden & Higham United – a biggest ever in their Vase history - with a win at Highgate United, while Sturminster Newton United and Okehampton Argyle – who both also recorded best ever FA Vase wins in the last round – go head to head to continue their record runs.

While the Trophy continues next Saturday, the Vase takes a break until October 19. But there's no let-up in the action as the 2024-25 gathers pace.

The games are coming thick and fast so check our your NLP or the Factfile streams for the latest facts and figures in the FA Cup, Trophy and Vase.

His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

DEREK ASAMOAH – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United.
