HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan



League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10. They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24.

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

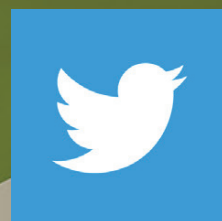

HISTORY OF SPORTING BENGAL UNITED



It all began with a football tour to Bangladesh in 1996 by a group of the best Bangladeshi players in London. There was a realisation that talent was being wasted with the divisions that existed and a solution was required to tackle these divisions. Sporting Bengal United FC was therefore established in 1996 to challenge the under-representation of Asians in football and to offer Bangladeshi and other young Asian people a chance to play football at a higher level.

Having brought together the best local Bangladeshi players, Sporting Bengal went on to win multiple UK Asian Championship titles and dominated the local leagues. It was time to explore the next level.

In only eight years, the team rose from amateur Sunday league football to semi-professional football. Having reached this level, the club broke down many barriers and was one of the first Asian teams to play in the famous FA Cup. Today, the club offers local young people of all backgrounds the opportunity to play semi-professional football.

Having initially competed in the Kent Senior League when securing semi-professional status from 2003, Sporting Bengal moved to the Essex Senior Football League in the 2011-12 season finishing 11th in the league and reaching the FA Vase Third Round Proper in the first season. The club finished runners up in the Essex Senior League Cup in 2013-14.

Ex-Dagenham and Redbridge FC footballer, Anwar Uddin, was the most high-profile manager of the club and managed during the 2015-16 season. In 2016-17, the club reached the First Round Qualifying stage of the FA Cup for the first time after Imrul Gazi was appointed the manager. The 2018-19 season saw the team finish 8th in the Essex Senior League. After a couple Covid hit seasons, the club suffered massively and was relegated in the 2021-22 season.

However, under the management of Steve Clark, Sporting Bengal won promotion back to the Essex Senior League from the Thurlow Nunn League First Division South at the first attempt after winning a dramatic penalty shootout in the Playoff Final. The team also matched the club record run of reaching the FA Vase Third Round Proper.

After Playoff success in 2022-23 season, Sporting Bengal did the unthinkable again and reached the Playoff Final of the Essex Senior League Premier Division in the 2023-24 season after finishing in 5th position in the league with a club record 70 points. Sporting Bengal beat non-league giants Romford FC 3-1 in the Final to secure promotion to Step 4 football and the Isthmian Football League for the first time in the club's history.

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Sporting Bengal, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, referee James Hall and assistants Ricky Ansher and Alfred Finch-Critchley.

Since our last home game, we have exited both the FA Cup and FA trophy, have had an aborted trip to Lowestoft and won our first league game, so a quiet time really. Taking the events in chronological order, the first game against Lowestoft in the 3rd qualifying round must be reflected on as a missed opportunity, given we were 3-2 up in injury time. In summary it was a breathless end to end game, where we twice found ourselves behind at 1-0 and 2-1, before getting our noses in front, only to concede late on. However, there were positives to be taken, we went toe to toe with a team from a higher league and in Joe Waight we have found a forward who can score goals. Credit to Joe for his hat-trick, we have been crying out for a goal scorer since Ben Allen's first stint, two seasons ago and certainly it looks like Joe fits the bill. I love his tireless running and I love the fact he plays for the team with enthusiasm and importantly loves to score goals. Anyone that insists on celebrating their goals with the fans is always going to be popular, as well.

Following the 3-3 draw, it meant a replay was required the following Tuesday, a coach was laid on for players, staff and fans but sadly the coach had to turn around when news came through at 6.30pm that the pitch was waterlogged so the game was postponed, very frustrating.

On Saturday the 5th October we travelled to Felixstowe & Walton United in the 3rd Qualifying Round of the FA Trophy, now the less said about the game the better, we conceded early and then were outplayed for most of the first half going in 3-0 down at half time, eventually losing 4-0. The only plus point from the game was Michael's second penalty save in as many games following his heroics against Lowestoft the previous Saturday. I must say that Felixstowe are easily the best team I have seen from our league this season, their ground is very impressive, they have a great setup and are a club clearly looking to go places. They were also very welcoming and excellent hosts.

The Lowestoft FA Cup game was eventually played last Tuesday. In a carbon copy of the Felixstowe game, we conceded early and were 3-0 down at half time, the difference though was in the 2nd half we were the better team and for a small period of time following a Tommy Boxer headed goal from a corner, we had some hope of getting back in the game. It should also be added that we had chances in the 1st half that again if they had been converted would have given us hope. As it was, we lost 3-1 and exited the FA Cup. Now we all love the game, its why we turn up week in, week out but at times events happen that make you realise its only a game and sadly last Tuesday and the days following our thoughts were with Alaa who suffered a double leg break, and had to undergo an operation in Lowestoft Hospital. I couldn't help but think about the highs and low's the game can bring as just over a month ago, following the 101st minute equaliser against Witham in the Cup, there we all were celebrating Alaa's goal and him being a hero and then only a month later, an horrific injury. It is the beautiful game but it can also be a cruel game at times. Everyone at the club wishes Alaa well and a speedy recovery.

On Saturday, we made our 3rd visit to Suffolk in a week, this time for the novelty of a Saturday 3pm game in the league. I think we all know that our league form has not been good enough and that whilst the cup games have been great, there's been numerous conversations about would you swap cup victories for points in the league. Mostly the answers have been, yes. Well on Saturday we came away with the 3 points to record our first league win in what was a good team performance. From the off we looked up for it and it came as no surprise when Jorge Sambu opened the scoring, the surprise thereafter was that we didn't add to that, as we had numerous chances. Given we were up the other end of the pitch I cannot tell you much about the Ipswich equaliser on the stroke of half-time other than there was a stunned silence around the ground as very few people were aware it had gone in, bemusement and puzzled looks greeted the half-time whistle, 1-1. Given we didn't deserve to be drawing it was hoped that we would come out for the second half on the front foot and that was exactly what happened with some superb play by Jorge Sambu down the right squaring low into the penalty area for the onrushing Derek Asamoah to slot home to make it 2-1 in the 48 minute. There was further joy 20 minutes later when Joe Waight followed up his own shot to smash the ball home. 3-1 and much relief amongst the travelling fans. Now I hope I get to write this often, I certainly haven't in the past but for the last 20 minutes unusually for the Boro there were very few nervy moments and we started passing the ball confidently, one move even saw every player have a touch. So, there it was

our first 3 points.

Tonight's game gives us an opportunity to build on that and I hope confidence was gained from Saturday, I for one believe we are in a false position but I'm also aware the yellow and blue tinted glasses play a part in that. Then Bus 251 (every 15 to 20 minutes) leaves from Waltham Cross Bus Station Platform C, destination Upshire Shops. Ride 7 stops to Farm Hill Road, 10 minute walk to ground. Bus 13 (leaves 45 minutes past the hour), destination the Talbot, leaves from Platform C ride 6 stops to Sun Street, 10 minute walk to the ground. 66 bus also goes from Platform C, but less frequent. Alternatively, Greater Anglia train from Tottenham Hale to Waltham Cross Rail Station. Same buses from Railway Station Stop E. Can also walk from either the bus station or rail station, about a mile.

I'd suggest this place, close to the stops for both the 251 Bus (Farm Hill Road) and the 13 (Sun Street). Then walk to the ground.

Neither are we strangers to our visitors Mile End Stadium and we will be going there again on November 9th. It is a Council owned facility so Sporting Bengal are not its only users and our first team played there against Tower Hamlets in the Spartan League for 3 seasons and lost all three games 1-2 in 1992/3, 1-2 in 1993/4 and 0-1 in 1994/95.

A particularly galling visit was on 24th August 2013 when we played Hamlets in what was only our fourth ever Essex Senior League game and an extract from my report on it is:-

As regards this visit to the huge but soul-less and near empty athletic stadium of Tower Hamlets "least said - soonest mended" might be the wisest course to adopt. Borough's unbeaten 17 match run came to an end with a bitterly disputed stoppage time goal to give the home side a 2-1 win. At the time we were frustrated

enough by the blatantly off-side goal but had we known that come the end of the season we would have won the Essex Senior League Championship on goal difference had that goal been disallowed we would have been incandescent. Probably "least said etc." is still the wisest course for the three match officials were not all of the same gender and a "typo" could well result in an invitation to attend one of the FA's Orwellian Re-education Courses. Going back there on 9th October and eliminating them from the FA Cup by 3-0 might have seemed like revenge at the time but if only we could have reversed the results! Having been condemned to a second season in the Essex Senior League before becoming its Champions and an Isthmian Club we enjoyed what was then only our 2nd ever win at the Stadium by 2-1 over Tower Hamlets.

Nor is our Mens Team the only one with bitter memories of the venue. It seems that some perverse spirit which overseas Cup draws take a sadistic delight in sending us there for as well as the two Mens trips, the Womens team have visited the venue 5 times between 2012 and 2018 (twice to play K.I.K.K United and then thrice to play Leyton Orient by which time the Clubs had merged).and only one was for a League game. Suffice it to say all 5 were lost, including our solitary Womens Premier League visit, in the course of which we conceded 28 goals and scored just 3. Those with a detailed memory of the Womens history probably pray they will not be sent there again whenever an FA or County FA Cup draw takes place !

Even our Youth teams have not been entirely spared a visit for on 9th March 2008 our Under 17s went there to play Millwall Albion in the London FA Youth Cup. Readers will not be surprised that we lost – but only by 0-2.

HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25



MICHAEL ACQUAH – A goalkeeper who has played for Huddersfield Town's U19s and B Team, Farsley Celtic on loan and Norwich U21s

EBENEZER ADDO KUFOUR – Ebenezer played over 30 games for us last season mainly occupying the right back position he is versatile and was asked to perform other roles across the defence.

GEORGIOS ARESTI – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

DEREK ASAMOAH – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal.
