## HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan



League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10. They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24.

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

## HISTORY OF MALDON & TIPTREE FC



Maldon & Tiptree Football Club Club History 2010 - 2024 In 2009, Ed Garty became the owner of Maldon Town taking over from Michael Kirkham whilst still in charge of Tiptree United. Alan Brockhouse was installed as Maldon Town's new Chairman. Following the takeover, Colin Wallington returned for a second spell as manager of Maldon Town, leaving his post at Tiptree United. Colin previously managed Maldon Town between 2003 and 2007 during which he achieved promotion in the 2005-06 season via the play-off final. Having left Maldon in 2007, Colin went on to manage Tiptree United where he achieved promotion winning the Eastern Counties Division One title in the 2007-08 season. Until the conclusion of the 2009/10 season both Maldon Town & Tiptree United played their home games at Park Drive, under a ground share arrangement. During the summer of 2010, Maldon Town & Tiptree United amalgamated to form, Maldon & Tiptree Football Club, under the ownership of Ed Garty. Following the amalgamation, Tiptree United withdrew from the Essex Senior League, with the Clubs last ever fixture being a 3-1 defeat against Enfield 1893 on 24th April 2010. Maldon & Tiptree took the place of Maldon Town in the Isthmian Division One North. Following the retirement of Colin Wallington, Assistant Manager Brad King and Glen Knight were appointed as the Clubs Joint-Managers. With the pair being new to management, the new Club witnessed wholesale changes with only a handful of players remaining from both former Clubs squads. The 2010-11 campaign saw the new Club remain in or around the play-off positions for the majority of the season finishing in 8<sup>th</sup> place. Despite a high turnover of players, a high standard of football was maintained and it was a disappointing end to the season with the Club falling away in the latter stages of the season with suspensions and injuries eventually taking their toll to leave the club frustratingly short of the play-off positions. The following season proved not be as successful and in November 2011, King and Knight were relieved of their duties. Ex-Charlton professional Mike Flanagan was appointed as Caretaker Manager and remained until the end of the season steering the club to a respectful mid-table finish with a win percentage of 49.12%. At the beginning of the 2012-13 campaign, ex-Stansted & Redbridge manager Terry Spillane was appointed as Manager with Mike Flanagan departing the Club. Ex-Tiptree United manager, Jody Brown was brought to the Club to assist Terry. After a fantastic and unbeaten start to the season, the Club found themselves at the top of the table, however, an incredible run by eventual Champions Grays Athletic meant Maldon & Tiptree had to settle for a place in the play-offs. Disappointment came in the play-off final letting a two goal lead slip to draw with Thamesmead Town, who went on to win on penalties. Following a poor start to the 2014-15 season the Club parted ways with Spillane and Chairman, Ed Garty, took over as Caretaker Manager for three games. In September 2014 Alan Kimble was appointed as Manager and it was a difficult season finishing the season in 19<sup>th</sup> place. During the 2014-15 season a competition was run with supporters voting for a Club nickname. The Jammers was the clear winner with over 50% of the vote. Following the completion of the 2014-15 season, the Club formed a relationship with Colchester Utd and ex Ipswich Town midfielder David Wright was appointed as 1st Team Manager. In December 2015 Wright was appointed Assistant Manager at Colchester Utd and Liam Bailey took Maldon & Tiptree Football Club – History. 2 charge of the team on a temporary basis managing a single match against Tilbury. In 2016, ex-Leiston Manager, Steve Ball was appointed Manager and steered the club to a respectable 7<sup>th</sup> place just missing out on the play-offs. As the season ended Ball was appointed as Assistant Manager at Colchester Utd and ex-Manchester City midfielder Kevin Horlock was brought in to replace him. For the majority of the season, the Jammers sat at the top of the table before slipping to finish in 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Horlock's side managed to reach the play-off final, where they lost 1-0 to Thurrock. The following season was not quite as successful with the team finishing just outside the play-off places in 7<sup>th</sup> place. After managing 112 games, Kevin Horlock departed in the closed season and was replaced by ex-Colchester defender, Wayne Brown for the 2018-19 season. In Brown's first season, the Jammers finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place and reached the play-off final, where they agonisingly lost on penalties against local rivals, Heybridge Swifts. The 2019-20 season was one to remember for the Club. The Club had an incredible run in the Emirates FA Cup. Having reached the First Round proper of the competition, Maldon & Tiptree traveled to League Two side, Leyton Orient, joined by

over 600 fans. Goals from Danny Parish and a superb solo goal from Jerome Slew saw victory for the Jammers earning then a home fixture against Football League side Newport County in the Second Round proper. The match was televised live on national television and attracted a record home attendance at Park Drive of 1,876 seeing the Jammers only beaten by the League Two side with a goal in stoppage time. Following the excitement of the cup run, Maldon & Tiptree were also riding high in the league, finding themselves top of the Isthmian Division One North, 13 points clear with four games in hand, when disaster struck. With the Coronavirus pandemic, the league competition was formally abandoned on 26 March 2020, with all results from the season being expunged, and no promotion or relegation taking place, the Club were denied a chance of promotion. Following the disappointing end to the 2019-20 season, Wayne Brown remained in charge of the Club and looked to build another competitive squad following a number of the previous season's squad securing transfers to Clubs higher up the football pyramid. In October 2020 owner and Chairman, Ed Garty stood down from his position, after a challenging ten years at the helm. After a period of uncertainty for the Club, General Manager, Ron Dangerfield was confirmed as the new Chairman, with Richard Cowling taking ownership of the Club. Just like the previous season, the 2020-21 season was terminated with promotion and relegation denied for all the team competing in the Isthmian Division One North. However, prior to the termination of the season, the Jammers reached the Emirates FA Cup First Round proper for the second successive season, this time losing to Morecambe 1-0 in front of the television cameras and achieved their longest ever run in the Buildbase FA Trophy before losing to Gloucester City. The Jammers were only able to play the five league games, finishing in third place before the season was curtailed. Midway through the 2021-22 season, Brown was appointed as interim Head Coach at Colchester Utd and his former assistant, Paul Abrahams, took over as interim Manager. Abrahams steered the Jammers within touching distance of the play-offs, however three defeats in the final three matches saw the team finish in 9th place. At the end of the season, Ron Dangerfield announced his departure as Chairman and left the club to join Charlton Athletic as Club Secretary. Jerry Carter replaced Dangerfield as Chairman, coming from Braintree Town. Roger Stapleton was appointed as the Club's vice-Chairman. Maldon & Tiptree Football Club – History. 3 In May 2022, Wayne Brown departed on a permanent basis and was appointed as Head Coach at Colchester Utd, having managed 141 games and a win percentage of 68% and arguably the Club's most successful Manager to date. After a positive spell as interim Manager, Paul Abrahams was appointed Manager on a permanent basis. A difficult start to the 2022-23 season saw Paul Abrahams departing and Liam Bailey again stepped up as interim-Manager. Adam Flint came in as Manager bringing James Robinson as his assistant. Flint and his coaching team managed to steady the ship and earn some positive results in what turned out to be an short tenure of only 9 matches. Daniel Barber was named as new Chairman in December 2022 replacing Jerry Carter and shortly afterwards Peter Taylor was appointed as team Manager. Peter Taylor departed the Club in August 2023 and Liam Bailey was appointed on a permanent basis as his replacement with Rui Costa joining shortly afterwards as his assistant. Former Enfield FC manager, Jamie Cureton, replaced Rui as Liam Bailey's assistant in October, 2023. Having made over 1000 competitive appearances Jamie has put on a Jammers shirt coming on from the substitutes bench.

## PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS

Maldon & Tiptree FC came into existence in the close season of 2010 when Ed Garty, already Chairman of Tiptree United, also took over Maldon Town in 2009 and amalgamated the Clubs. Tiptree played out the remainder of season 2009/10 in Maldon's Park View Stadium and were then amalgamated with Maldon Town and the name Maldon and Tiptree was adopted.

Maldon Town had been founded in 1946 and played in Leagues with a catchment area of Essex and Suffolk only until, in 1966/67, they became members of the Eastern Counties League and after finishing in the lower half of that League for 6 seasons switched to the Eastern Counties League to spend 24 seasons in it until returning to the Eastern Counties League for season 1996/97. Having finished 2nd in 2003/04 they became a Step 4 club allocated to the Southern League East. Via the 2004/05 play-offs they reached Step 3 and the FA then allocated them to the Isthmian Premier Division for just one season at the end of which they were relegated to the Isthmian Division 1 North where they remained for the last 4 seasons of their independent existence. On only one occasion did we meet them and that was in the 1994/95 FA Vase 1ST Round when we visited them and lost 5-1.

Tiptree United were formed in 1933 and until 1971, when they were founder members of the Essex Senior League they played in various Leagues restricted to Essex and Suffolk based Clubs. After 8 seasons in the Essex Senior League they switched sideways to the Eastern Counties League in 1979/80, and stayed there until 2008/09 before returning to the Essex Senior for the final year of their separate existence of which the highlight was surely a trip to Villa Park to play Whitley Bay in the 2002 FA Vase Final, although losing 1-0 to an extra time goal. There is no record of our having ever played against them.

Our first meeting with the amalgamated Club was in season 2015/16, our first as an Isthmian North Division Club, and this will be the 7th League encounter, the number having been kept down by our promotion to the Premier Division in 2018/19 until relegated back to the North Division at the end of last season. The most memorable, but somewhat frustrating meeting was the Division 1 North play off semi-final in 2016/17 at their Park Drive Stadium when despite scoring four goals we contrived to let in five and so missed out on becoming a Premier Division Club for a further season. Three Cup matches have been played and we lost the lot - it being made worse by our being a Premier Division Club at the time of all of them.

So the chart below hardly makes enjoyable reading from our point of view for of the 11 games we have won just 2 and lost 8 with 1 drawn having scored 16 goals in the process while conceding 27.

## HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25



**EBENEZER ADDO KUFOUR** – Ebenezer played over 30 games for us last season mainly occupying the right back position he is versatile and was asked to perform other roles across the defence.

**GEORGIOS ARESTI** – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

**DEREK ASAMOAH** – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United.
