#### HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan



League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

#### **NEWMARKET TOWN FC CLUB HISTORY**

The Star Hotel on the High Street on the corner with Sun Lane (presently Pizza Express) was the venue on Thursday 22nd November 1877 of a meeting of football interests in the town. Newmarket Town Football Club was formed thus making them one of the oldest clubs in the country.

Under the presidency of Mr.B.T. Chennell, Mr F.G. Postans informed the meeting that subscriptions of nearly £25 had already been collected. Flags, posts and all articles necessary for the game were on order. Players were to be supplied with a suitable uniform at half price.

The first committee was elected as follows:

President: Mr B.T Chennell, Secretary: Mr F.G Postans, Assistant Secretary: Mr A. Hayhoe, Treasurer: Mr F.R Crick

Committee Members: Mr C.E Hammond, Mr A.S Manning, Mr E. Fyson, Mr H. Feist, Mr H. Palmer,


Mr A. Pace Mr C. Kemp, Mr T. Browne, Mr W. Moody, Mr C.B Bosworth & Mr R. Jacobs.

It was further resolved that the headquarters would be the Star Hotel and annual subscription would be five shillings (25p). The first practice was to be on the Severals on the afternoon of the following Thursday. Following on, a practice field was lent by Mr. Norman Wiseman, and funds became available to purchase a tent in December.


The first match took place on the Severals (with the permission of the Jockey Club) on 1st February 1878 but Newmarket were beaten 3-0 by Pembroke College. They began life in local football on a pitch on the Heath near Sefton Lodge, until moving to the present Town Ground in 1885. Few clubs have managed to stay at the same ground for 127 years. Initially the ground was shared with the Cricket Club, the Quoit Club, the Athletic Club, the Gun Club and the Hare and Hounds Club, a real sports centre! The inaugural game on the new ground was on Wednesday October 21 1885 Newmarket Town and Bury School. For obvious reasons they soon became known as 'The Jockeys'. Little success came until 1920 when they won the Cambs Senior League and also the Cambs Senior Cup. The Cambs Challenge was won in 1926. Moving into the Bury and District League Division One they won the title in 1926/27. Another move, this time to the Ipswich and District League resulted in them winning the title in three consecutive seasons, 1931-32, 1932-33 and 1933-34 and the Suffolk Senior Cup in the season 1934-35. Around this time crowds of 2,000 were seen at major games. Wartime matches saw even International Players such as Stan Mortensen 'guesting' for the jockeys.

The club had good times in these earlier days, even to the extent of forming an 'A' side that had its own share of success before fortunes changed for the worse. Following the war, the club finished bottom for five consecutive seasons, and by the end of the 51/52 campaign, they again found themselves rooted at the bottom of the ECL, having lost all 34 league games, scoring 19 goals whilst 171 goals against, a claim to fame that will take some beating. Forced to return to Junior football the club joined the Peterborough and District League, which they won in 1957/58, before returning to the Eastern Counties league in 1959/60 where they have remained ever since. Their best season was as runners up to Lowestoft 1966/67. League honours having been elusive they have in recent years won the Suffolk Premier Cup four times in the five seasons to 1999.

The present clubhouse was completed and floodlights were installed in 1985. The first league game under lights being against Ely City on 19 November. The old wooden stand was replaced by the present 144-seater stand in 1996.


As a club we took a decision last summer to try and encourage more of our youth players, to give them experience at this level and put us in a better position to push up the league next year and in subsequent years. I ask you to bear with us during this transitional period and I am sure that the community atmosphere you have created over the years and the characters that embody you all as supporters will afford the time to the management and coaching staff to implement those changes.

I have regular discussions with Tom and his staff and I am convinced that they will get it right sooner rather than later . Please do not be under any mistaken illusions that the management and coaching staff are not working incredibly hard behind the scenes to win football matches.

I accept we haven't been able to win as many so far as we would like but it is a slow process and an important process to undertake so as to fully integrate the whole club in the local community which has always been my desire.

I reflect back on the number of seasons now and see the immense growth of this club with pride and I am convinced ,and I'm sure you too are , that we are moving in the right direction and we offer a lot more to the local community than merely the first team winning football matches.

Our development as a club in terms of our women's team and our youth sides are key and there will be bigger and greater development now moving forward.








#### PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS

In one word NONE. Formed in 1877 our visitors are 30 years older than us but in our 118 years of mutual existence no record can be found of any meeting between them and Haringey Borough or with any of the Clubs which have merged over time to form us. Although they have played in the FA's National competitions since the 1930s we have never been paired together. They were formed as Newmarket Town and have played under that name ever since so unlike very many Clubs (including us) their history is not cluttered up with mergers and name changes. They moved into their Cricket Field Ground, which we are due to visit on 22nd. March next year, in 1885. It is no surprise that we have never met before as until this season they had played exclusively in Leagues with a catchment area restricted to East Anglia, They now play Isthmian North Division football having won the Eastern Counties League play-off last season.

#### **MATCH REPORT**

#### Haringey Borough 0-1 Felixstowe and Walton United

On a cold, wet, and blustery Saturday afternoon at Coles Park, Haringey Borough's winless streak extended to nine games as they suffered a narrow 1-0 defeat to high-flying Felixstowe & Walton United.

Tom Loizou kept an unchanged lineup from the previous 3-3 draw against Redbridge, opting for a 5 at-the-back system. Scott Mitchell, Damilola Taiwo-Pratt, and Ebenezer Addo Kufuor anchored the backline, with captain Tosin Olufemi and Caleb Dennis providing width as wing-backs. Jack West Astuti retained his spot between the sticks, while Georgios Aresti and J'Ardell Stirling formed the midfield duo behind a front three of Joe Waight, Derek Asamoah, and Alfred Bobson-Bawling, who recently returned to the squad.

The start of the match was cagey. The visitors wearing red shirts, black shorts, and red and black socks and kicking towards the car park end dominated the ball, but failed to properly test Astuti. Their number 10, Callum Harrison, showed flashes of danger with a couple of speculative efforts cutting in from the right, but neither shot packed enough power to trouble the keeper. Boro were struggling to create much themselves though, and their task was made more difficult when they were forced into a change on 25 minutes in, with Scott Mitchell being replaced by Olu Durojaiye, causing a reshuffle that pushed Stirling back into defence.

The first big chance of the game for Boro came on the 36th minute after a great switch of play out to the left wing for Derek Asamoah. Asamoah whipped a dangerous ball into the centre of the penalty area only to be missed by an audacious overhead kick from Joe Waight and put wide when it eventually fell to a yellow shirt. Boro lived dangerously before half-time with the opposition's Jordan Matthews curling a low shot just wide of the left-hand post from outside of the penalty area, and J'Ardell Stirling intervened brilliantly to prevent a dangerous cross finding a Felixstowe man in the middle and giving the visitors a lead. The score remained 0-0 until halftime.

Tom Loizou's men started the second with renewed energy. Bobson Bawling was replaced by Cem Poyraz just after half-time, and he almost made an immediate impact to the scoreline in the 55th minute. Caleb Dennis pulled the ball back into the centre from an overlapping position on the right, and Poyraz was there to meet it, steering a low shot towards the bottom left corner of the opposition net, which was tipped away well by the Felixstowe goalkeeper and Boro were unlucky not to get on the rebound and put themselves ahead. Felixstowe countered well from this chance and had a good effort from their number 9 Rob Harvey well tipped over the bar by Astuti. The tension began to build at Coles Park and tempers flared both on and off the pitch. Felixstowe and Walton's captain Jack Ainsley escaped punishment after a cynical foul on Aresti around the half-way line and moments later Boro manager Tom Loizou and substitute Tom Boxer were both booked after a confrontation with the Felixstowe bench.

On the pitch Felixstowe started to exhibit more control, their left back Thomas Warren lashed a shot just wide of the right post, and some dangerous corners and free kicks were put just wide of the Boro net. The pressure told eventually though 71 minutes into the match. The goal started with Warren who put a great ball into the box, and although Astuti did well to save the first effort, the ball was followed in by Joshua Hitter who slotted the ball into the bottom left corner of an essentially empty net. Boro tried to rally a response but the stormy conditions played their part as they struggled to create anything of note in the final 20 minutes of the match, their only opportunity came in the 88th minute with a long throw-in being headed over the bar by Cem Poyraz. In the end, they were lucky it was only 1-0, with Rob Harvey spurning a good opportunity on the counter-attack, and some desperate defending by Caleb Dennis also preventing another one-on-one opportunity.

Next up for Haringey Borough is an away match at Witham Town on Saturday 14th December as they look to put this winless run behind them.


#### Witham Town 3 Haringey Borough 1 – Isthmian North League – Saturday 14th December

#### Leyton Orient 1 Haringey Borough 8 – Combined Counties Midweek Cup

If Carlsberg did football matches... they'd be freezing cold, wet and perhaps have fizzes of excitement but be intensely disappointing and leave you with a nasty taste in the mouth.

Much like watching [redacted by the club secretary] in recent weeks.

It certainly wouldn't be like the purveyors of fizzy [redacted by the club's marketing director]'s 2004 'Flatmates' advert, where a prospective flatmate enters a house, is warmly welcomed, handed a beer and shown to "the box room" which is an actual executive box at a football stadium.

But that's exactly what we experienced in our Combined Counties Midweek Women's Cup debut at Leyton Orient's Brisbane Road, the Matchroom Stadium, The Gaughan Group

Well, it wasn't literally a flat but you do feel quite enclosed by the London property bubble as flats fill the corners of the ground and loom, threateningly, over the South Stand as if peering over the pitch with a speculator's eye.

But we were warmly welcomed (and thanked for coming) before being handed a voucher for a free beer in the hospitality suite and taking our (padded) seats in the VIP section.

As children waved flags to welcome the teams onto the floodlit pitch it felt, not - as it was - an away game against lower division opposition in a cup competition I was unaware existed a week previously - but an intimate theatre performance in front of a handful of cognoscenti.

I stood to observe the Combined Counties League Midweek Women's Cup Anthem before learning to my disgust that there isn't actually one and we were underway.

The game started at a frantic pace. Orient moved the ball around well, transitioning from defence into attack very quickly. Boro, featuring a formidable front three of Nellz Hume, Shawna Harvey and a back-fromuniversity-for-Christmas Caitlin Star, threatened constantly.


In fact the latter, showing great touches and athleticism, made space for herself outside the box within the opening five minutes and fired an unsavable shot past the Orient keeper. She nearly added a second from a set-piece, the ball beating the keeper, but striking the inside of the post and rolling agonisingly across the face of goal.

But the home side had their own goal threat in the form of Steph McCaffrey. The Orient number nine is a 31-year-old former professional footballer who earned six caps for the US Women's National Team before her illness-enforced retirement.

The first time she really got on the ball, she ran past about six Boro defenders and fired past Emma in goal for Orient's equaliser. Maybe don't let a US Women's International have that much time and space Boro! Boro's response was to tighten up on the American dangerwoman. Meanwhile, Caitlin found that she was being crowded out by two or three red shirts every time she got on the ball, in a bid to limit her influence on the game.

With Orient defenders forced into their cliched seasonal role of following Yonder Star (oh 'boo' yourself!) space opened up for Boro's other attacking threats. A wonderful crossfield pass set Nellz free in the box and she made no mistake to restore Boro's lead at about the twenty minute mark. Then a cute touch from Caitlin put Shawna one-on-one to draw a fine save.

Caitlin then nearly grabbed her second, profiting off a missed clearance only to see her shot, and follow up header, blocked off the line.

























































At the break Boro lead 4 - 1 (the second-most dangerous score in football after 4 - 0) - the better side in chances, but certainly not in control of the game.

It doesn't take long for Boro to extend their lead - Nellz feeds Shawna whose touch takes her round the onrushing keeper to roll the ball into an empty net for her second and Boro's fifth.

But McCafferty shows Orient's threat, battling into the box and getting a shot away that beats Emma but bounces off the post and is smuggled away.

When Boro got their sixth - a Nellz effort parried into the path of Jada Pollendine - the game definitely felt over as a contest.

At the midpoint of the half, Shawna gets her hattrick - a training ground free kick routine and a superb finish on the turn - and once Summer Young smashed in a loose ball after a Boro corner to make it 8 - 1 the only question was how many Boro were to score.

While Emma did have to pull off a save from a free kick in the few minutes, Boro were in total control against the Greater London League side.

Not Carlsberg football then, but champagne football deserving of the fantastic stage. That's the miracle of Christmas, the magic of the Combined Counties League Midweek Women's Cup.

CHRISTMAS time is for giving as they say, well the fixtures computer has certainly served up a festive treat for Non-League fans everywhere this yuletide.

Traditionally, the Boxing Day fixtures are one of the first fans look out for when the schedule is announced - and this year hasn't disappointed with a number of crunch derby clashes taking place up and down the country. Whatever the level, you just can't beat a derby-day cracker to complete your Christmas, so here are just a few that have caught the eye of our NLP groundhoppers.

The National League always seems to serve up a Boxing Day feast with all the trimmings – and the Aldershot Town v Woking derby is usually at the forefront.

Just 12 miles separate these rival clubs, just across the Surrey/Hampshire border, ensuring there's never any shortage of drama for the big crowds on show.

There's a Tyne-Tees affair when Gateshead and Hartlepool United meet at the International Stadium, while Dagenham v Braintree and Southend United v Ebbsfleet United ensure that Essex and Kent are well represented on the day,

At Step 2, Brackley Town and Leamington looks tasty in National League North, similarly the Derbyshire dual between Buxton and Alfreton Town and an 'Old Farm' East Anglian derby with King's Lynn Town hosting Needham Market.

A big day in the north-east is further demonstrated by Darlington v Scarborough Athletic and Spennymoor Town v South Shields, not to mention Stockton Town v Hebburn Town in the Northern Premier League, Premier Division at Step 3.

The South is equally as intriguing, An all-Hertfordshire clash between Hemel Hempstead Town and St Albans City is a worthy headline act, while Aveley versus Hornchurch and Tonbridge Angels v Maidstone United are big games in Essex and Kent respectively. Chippenham Town v Bath City is often a tasty affair also.

The NPL also serves us up with Matlock Town v Ilkeston Town and Bamber Bridge v Lancaster City, while at Step 4 there are two more all-north east affairs between Bishop Auckland and Consett and Dunston v Newton Aycliffe.

AFC Rushden & Diamonds v Corby Town is always an eagerly-awaited affair in their respective parts of Northamptonshire, while in an ultra-congested Midlands division, packed with local affairs, unbeaten Quorn and Shepshed Dynamo, separated by just seven miles, battle it out in Leicestershire.

All eyes in Manchester will be on Wythenshawe when bitter rivals FC and Town meet at Hollyhedge Park, while Hednesford Town v Stafford Rangers looks a Boxing Day battle of heavyweights to rival Usyk and Fury. The Southern League Premier Central is always full of crunch local affairs and Boxing Day doesn't disappoint with AFC Telford United and Halesowen Town or Bromsgrove Sporting v Stourbridge arguably the pick.

The Somerset clash between Tiverton Town and Taunton Town always whets the appetite in the west country, while Havant & Waterlooville and Gosport Borough love a battle on the south coast.

And if you're in or around the Beaconsfield area of Buckinghamshire then why not make the trip to Holloways Park where they take on close rivals Flackwell Heath in a lunchtime showdown.

In the Isthmian League, the all-Essex affair between Billericay Town and Canvey Island gets the juices flowing, as does the Sussex derby between Horsham v Bognor Regis Town and the north London clash between Hendon and Potters Bar Town.

Margate versus Ramsgate is undoubtedly the game of the day in Step 4 as the two Kent coast promotion rivals lock horns, while Hartley Wintney v Farnham Town, a local battle of third versus first, is also well worth a visit.

At Step 5 and 6, of course, derbies are a little more commonplace but there are a few, mainly, cross-town affairs that are sure to whet the appetite of the locals.

1874 Northwich v Northwich Victoria ticks all the boxes for a Boxing Day bonanza, as does Newcastle Benfield v Newcastle Bue Star in Ebac Northern League Division One.

And division two produces two more in the form of Chester-le-Street Town versus Chester-le-Street United and Sunderland West End v Sunderland RCA.

The lunchtime affair in the United Counties League Premier North between Newark & Sherwood and Newark Town bares all the hallmarks of a cracker, similarly Northampton ON Chenecks v Northampton Sileby Rangers in Premier South and the Division One fixture between Retford United and Retford.

And, if you're on your holidays on the Isle of Wight and missing your football fix, then how about East Cowes Victoria v Newport (IoW) in the Wessex League.

Wherever you are in the country, you're never far from a crunch local derby to savour. Combining the spirit of Non-League with the spirit of Christmas, it's truly one of the highlights of the football calendar.

But wherever you go and whatever you do, The NLP wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.






#### **HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25**

**EBENEZER ADDO KUFOUR** – Ebenezer played over 30 games for us last season mainly occupying the right back position he is versatile and was asked to perform other roles across the defence.

**GEORGIOS ARESTI** – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball



**DEREK ASAMOAH** – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal. Since leaving the Boro he has appeared for Cheshunt, Brightlingsea Regent and became the all-time top goal scorer for New Salamis.

BOBSON BAWLING – Bobson has had two spells with the Boro, a winger who previously played over 70 games in the football league for Crawley Town, scoring 6 goals. Other clubs Bobson has played for include Woking, Torquay United, Oxford City, St Albans City, Enfield Town, and Hendon. Known for his versatility, Bobson can play in various midfield positions and has also been deployed as a right-back.

**HAMID BEN-SEISAY** – A young centre half who has played for Rotherham United's U18s and been a member of the Haringey Borough U23s team this season.

**TOMMY BOXER** – An experienced centre back, Tommy was player-manger at New Salamis during the 2023/2024 season.

**CALEB DENNIS** – A young full back who has signed from the U23s, Caleb has previously played for the West Ham Foundation and Shepherd's Bush.

JORGE DJASSI SAMBU – A huge influence on the team's success in recent years, Jorge is a centre midfielder that loves to tackle and is a commanding figure in the centre of the pitch.
