HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY



The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially

composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF HENDON FC



HENDON FC – 117th SEASON – 2025–26

Hendon FC, who begin a new era in Step 4 of the Non-league Pyramid, are now into their 16th season under the ownership of their supporters, following their takeover of the club in the summer of 2010. Cyrus Cooper, who took over from Simon Lawrence in 2023, is the Club Chairman.

Hendon has an illustrious and proud history. The club was formed in 1908, beginning its existence as Christ Church Hampstead. In their inaugural season, the club finished as champions of the Finchley & District League Third Division. There was regular success in the early years, but not before the first of four name changes.

Ahead of the 1909–10 season, the club became Hampstead Town, and immediately won the Finchley & District League Second Division title, and the First Division title followed a year later. Further successes followed as the club gained senior status in 1912 (entering the FA and county cups for the first time) and competing in both the London and Middlesex Leagues. On the back of this, the club was elected into the Athenian League in 1914, one of the best competitions in amateur football, this just six years into the club's existence.

Hampstead Town had played only two matches in 1914–15 (both away draws) when season was abandoned because of the outbreak of war. In their eventual debut season, 1919–20, the club finished a highly creditable fourth. The club finished runners-up in 1929, 1933, 1948, 1949 and 1952, before eventually winning the title in 1953. Further titles followed in 1956 and 1961.

The second renaming of the club came in 1926, when the suffix Town was dropped, and the club was simply called Hampstead. Seven years later the club became Golders Green and the final change came in 1946 when the club took the name Hendon.

There had been another Hendon club – it reached the quarter-finals of the FA Cup in 1883 – and, in 1932, Hendon and Hampstead met in two friendlies, the second of which was to raise funds for the former club. Sadly, Hendon – which appeared to add and drop the Town suffix in their dying years – ceased to exist a couple of years later, but their continued existence meant Hampstead had been unable to take the name in 1933. It was as Golders Green that the club made its first appearance in the FA Cup competition proper, losing in the first round to Southend United in 1933–34.

In 1963, after more than half a dozen rejections in the previous 50 years, the club was accepted into the Isthmian League and the Greens were members for 55 seasons, always competing in the top division. Success continued as they finished runners-up in their first season, followed by the first of two league titles a year later. Hendon were again champions in 1973, adding to their runners-up achievements in 1966, 1974 and 2015. Indeed, in their first 11 seasons in the Isthmian League, Hendon never finished lower than sixth. Since then, the club has had both good and bad seasons in the League, the low point coming in 2025, when the Greens were relegated.

During the amateur era, the club reached the final of the FA Amateur Cup on five occasions, winning in 1960 (against Kingstonian), 1965 (against Whitley Bay) and 1972 (against Enfield) but losing in 1955 (against Bishop Auckland) and 1966 (against Wealdstone).

The club throughout its history has enjoyed FA Cup success. As well as 21 appearances in the first round (most recently at Aldershot Town in 2012), there have been six appearances in the second round (latterly in 1999–2000 at Blackpool) and one in the third round in January 1974 which saw the Greens draw 1–1 at Newcastle United before losing the replay 4–0 at Watford FC's Vicarage Road.

The club has also enjoyed much glory in county cups, winning the Middlesex Senior Cup no less than 16 times out of 28 final appearances, as well as winning the Middlesex Charity Cup 14 times (two of which, in 1945 and 1988, were at Wembley Stadium). The London Senior Cup has been won on six occasions, with a further 10 appearances in the final, including a 2–1 defeat in April 2024. The 16 London finals is the competition record.

Hampstead moved into its Claremont Road ground in 1926, the first game being an FA Cup tie against

Berkhamsted Town on 18 September, which Hendon won 4–3. The final match was played 82 years later, almost to the day, on 20 September 2008, when local rivals Wealdstone won 4–1 (Hendon's last goal at Claremont Road came from defender/midfielder Dave Diedhiou, who is now the player-coach having racked up 61 goals in 502 appearances).

After leaving Claremont Road, Hendon spent four years ground-sharing with Wembley FC and, from 2013, a three-season arrangement with Harrow Borough FC at Earlsmead. In February 2014, plans to return close to the London Borough of Barnet at the old Kingsbury Town FC ground, Silver Jubilee Park (the borough boundary is around 20 metres behind the clubhouse) were announced.

Hendon moved into Silver Jubilee Park in 2016, sharing with Edgware Town & Kingsbury, but it took until January 2017 for a first home League win to be achieved. A last-day draw, completing a run of 22 points from 10 games, saw the club avoid relegation. The 2017–18 season was nearly glorious. Led by the prolific 92-goal attack of Niko Muir (40 goals – he returned to the club in 2023), Zak Joseph (18), Ashley Nathaniel-George (17) and Josh Walker (17), Hendon roared to third place in the Isthmian League – a second top-three finish in four seasons – and reached the playoff final. Sadly, it was not to be as Dulwich Hamlet won a penalty shoot-out.

A new era dawned in summer 2018 as The Football Association announced that Hendon would be playing in the Southern League Premier Division South, the Greens' first League change since 1963. An even bigger change came as manager Gary McCann, his coaching staff and every senior player moved on to pastures new.

A new, much-improved pitch was laid in 2022, while there have been regular improvements to the clubhouse and spectator facilities. In May 2024, the Greens got the news from the Football Association they were craving, that they were being reassigned to the Isthmian League for the 2024–25 season. Just before Christmas, boss Lee Allinson decided accepted the challenge of managing at a higher level led to almost all the squad and his staff moving to pastures new, four players following the manager. In charge at Silver Jubilee Park now is Ben Bukowski, a coach when Gary McCann was Hendon manager, who switched from Harrow Borough in February 2025.

It had a disastrous effect on the team, which needed to be almost completely rebuilt, and a winless run of more than 20 games saw the Greens drop from the edge of the Premier Division playoffs to the relegation zone. Two wins near the end of season meant Hendon did not finish with their worst points record – set two seasons earlier – but their 39 points left them five from safety. It means that in 2025–26 Hendon will play in the Pitching In Isthmian League South Central Division.

Did you know that

- 100,000 watched Hendon against northern giants Bishop Auckland in the 1955 Amateur Cup Final at Wembley.
- Following an invitation from the F.A. to test the system, Hendon were the first club to play under floodlights at Wembley Stadium. The first team beat the reserves 1–0.
- In October 1951, Hendon became the first team in Britain to win a floodlit cup-tie when they won a London Challenge Cup match against Arsenal at Highbury.
- In 1964–65, Hendon created probably a unique record for a visiting team when they won two matches scoring four goals at Highbury in the same season. Arsenal were beaten 4–3 in a London Challenge Cup tie – after the Gunners led 3–0 – and Finchley were downed 4–1 in an FA Amateur Cup semi-final.
- The club's original colours were blue, but changed to green in the 1930s, when the club was Golders Green. In 1997–98 the club replaced their now traditional green and brought back the original blue resulting in an outcry from supporters and the green was restored two seasons later!
- England's three highest capped Amateur Internationals between World War 2 and May 1974 were all Hendon players. Rod Haider (65 caps), John Swannell (61) and Mike Pinner (52) lead the way with Peter Deadman (40) and Laurie Topp (32) make it five Hendon players in the top ten of England cap winners.
- Hendon progressed through the first round in which they entered the FA Cup for 29 consecutive seasons, 1985–2014. The run ended against AFC Sudbury in 2014.
- In June 2015, Charlie Goode became the second Hendon player, after Phil Gridelet, to play for the England

Non-League team, now England C. Peter Deadman turned down the honour in May 1974, not wanting to miss Hendon's end-of-season run-in. He would have been one of the very few players to earn Amateur and Semi-Professional honours.

- The club's nicknames are the Greens or the Dons. They were the Green, even when they wore blue in the mid-1930s but at the time, the club was still known as Golders Green.
 - Many Hendon players have stepped up to the Football League, including Iain Dowie and Junior Lewis. In 2018 and 2019, respectively, Ashley Nathaniel-George and Ricardo German joined Crawley Town. Also in 2019, Jacob Gardiner-Smith signed for Wycombe Wanderers while, in January 2023, six months after leaving Hendon, Jayden Clarke signed for League 2 Gillingham.
 - Hendon set a new club record with a 25-match unbeaten run in 2015. After a loss to Peacehaven & Telscombe in January, the Greens did not lose again until the Ryman League Premier Division Playoff final in mid-May.
 - Hendon's longest serving manager was Gary McCann, who was in charge from February 2005 until May 2018. Both his assistant Freddie Hyatt – like McCann a former player – and the club's physical therapist Mark Findley gave more than 10 years of service.
 - In 2023–24 Hendon enjoyed two firsts in their 50th attempt to win the Isuzu FA Trophy. The Greens had last reached the last 16 for the first time this century and won five matches in one season for the first time. Manager Ben Bukowski is assisted by Ryan Wharton who made his debut for the club in 2006 and made 76 appearances.

A huge **THANK YOU** from John Bacon

At last I have the opportunity to express my gratitude - and astonishment – for the kind remarks of so many people, 23 no less, which almost made the programme for our last home game with Walthamstow on Easter Monday look more like a Fanzine of the “John Bacon Appreciation Society” than a football Club programme.!!! I hope all of them will read this but will repeat this article in the first home League match programme. I don't have all the e-mail addresses and phone numbers of my praise singers so rather than thank some but not all hope that this article will be seen by all of them. I was taken totally by surprise as having proof read programmes I don't read them again after they have been uploaded so the changes came as a massive surprise. Neither had I an inkling that the Plate presentation was planned; I knew the Mayor and our MP were attending and that I would be introduced to them as a Club stalwart but never expected anything more.

Throughout my tenure I have received nothing but full co-operation and support from everyone connected with the Club from Tom, all his helpers and the players as much as from everybody involved in off field activities. I have occupied many roles at the Club but was never a player (nowhere near good enough) or First Aider (no wish to face a manslaughter charge). The lower reaches of AFA football in the 1950s and 60s and a final season with a Sunday pub team in the grandly named but short lived Vange and District Working Mens League constituted my playing career although 20 years later I put my boots on again to be in the “dads team” which provided training opposition for our young teenage daughters. Of course they ran rings round me but in my defence (not dropping any names) several went on to play or have a trial for England. But in the days when we ran a Reserve team in the SSMFL I did come within a couple of minutes of taking the field to make up the numbers at an evening away match at Harpenden Town when well into my sixties, but mercifully the late arrivals got there in the nick of time and saved both me and the Club from what would undoubtedly have been a huge embarrassment. Of course, like every one with a passion for their Club, I experienced moments of elation and despair based on match results but in all my years with the Club I cannot remember ever having had an unfriendly exchange with anyone and that is more important to me. That's more than enough about me, but there are some others I must mention. First and foremost our long serving Chairman Aki who devotes so much time to Club affairs it seems incredible that he also manages to head up a successful firm of Solicitors. Someone said there might not now be a Club without my contribution, which is not the case but is certainly true of Aki who has for so long dipped generously into his own pocket to keep it solvent. Generosity is the first characteristic which comes to mind at the mention of his name. He puts a brave face on it but he must surely be devastated having come so close to fulfilling his National League dream only for us to drop back to where we started. So many ambitious Chairmen, usually with totally ridiculous expectations of EFL football, throw in the towel and walk away as soon as they realise such is not going to be quickly and easily achieved; but not Aki who has stayed the course and it would be wonderful if he could be rewarded with a start on the upward road again at the end of this season which is the least his dedication deserves. It was his decision 10 years ago to introduce the free season ticket offer, about which a good deal of scepticism was then expressed, which has sent our attendances soaring. By 2015 our “one man and his dog” attendances in the dying years of the Athenian League in the mid 80's were behind us but a three figure attendance still meant the visiting team must have sent a sizeable contingent. Now we enjoy figures of several hundred plus a good few more dogs. That the figure falls significantly at matches where we are obliged to charge everyone and share the proceeds with the visitors is testament to its success and shows that we have a substantial core of devoted supporters, who probably have blue and yellow blood in their veins, and our many attendees at away matches, which are far from cheap days out, does nothing to dampen their enthusiasm for flying the Borough flag wherever possible and introducing the home supporters to their amusing repartee of songs.. That the female and children elements of the regular attendance have so vastly increased illustrates how we have become such a friendly, family oriented Club and the Junior Borough initiative, about which Aki is justifiably proud as can be seen from his article in the Walthamstow programme, bodes well for the Club's future under his stewardship.

Then there is our extraordinarily long serving First Team and Club Manager, Tom, who joined us in March

2009 when relegation back to Division 1 of the SSMFL was a threat and in the interim took us to the very brink of National League status in the last pre-Covid season. Sadly it has been downhill all the way after normality was restored but his affection for the Club is such that he will relish the chance to take us all the way back up, and even higher, hopefully in a shorter time span and starting this season.

Next up is Karla Parker and it is indeed possible that the Women's team would not have survived some difficult times without our joint determination to keep it going. Its always been a pleasure to work with her and Karla's commitment to and involvement with the Club now far exceeds just looking after the Women's Section.

Then there is my wonderful wife, Fiona, without whose indulgence, and acceptance of the unavoidable de facto Assistant Secretary's role, my activities would have been drastically reduced. I know there are some among the Clubs activists who envy my good fortune.

Last but not least I must talk about Nick who has now taken the administrative reins, It was always a pleasure to work with Nick, as it was bound to be given that his affection for the Club is certainly as great if not greater than mine. Nick has no interest in titles and although I several times invited him to take over as Secretary he was perfectly happy with the status quo. When health problems forced the issue I was comforted in my hospital bed by the knowledge that the Club would still be functioning perfectly well without my input. Now that I can in some ways assist again it is still as much of a pleasure as ever to work with him and I am so glad he welcomes my involvement even though he could cope perfectly well without it. Of course he welcomes the input of all who wish to be involved. I am conscious too that although I was retired for the last 20 or so years of holding office, Nick also has a demanding job to cope with as well as being the leading light of the "Bell End Boys". In truth, the hand over would have occurred by now anyway as the FA's relentless drive towards 100% paperless administration would have necessitated it because of my limited on-line abilities. I hope the Club realises how lucky it was to have such a ready made IT genius who is so passionate about the Club on hand to take over. I vaguely remember being honoured with the SSMFL's "Secretary of the Year" award in the dim and distant past and who would want to bet against Nick receiving it too if they are still making that presentation? So many Club Secretaries concentrate exclusively on their First team. But not Nick who will be seen at as many matches of all our teams as he can fit in. It was typical of him that when the season was basically over but the Women's team had a meaningless final away League game to fit in near the end of May - at Letchworth on a Wednesday evening - he was there, together with Dewi (another passionate Bell Ender frequently seen at non First Team games), they having also gone out of their way to pick up Fiona and I on route. Starting age probably means that he will not run up an involvement as lengthy as mine but I hope and expect it will be a long, rewarding, enjoyable, and hopefully more successful, tenure. Few Clubs are fortunate to have the benefit of being in the care of a triumvirate of the quality of Aki, Tom and Nick. They too are lucky to have such a sizeable, band of eager helpers.



MUSINGS OF THE (FORMER) SECRETARY

This evening we take pleasure in welcoming the players, Officials and supporters of HENDON FC to the CVS Van Hire Stadium for our 2nd pre-season friendly. We will be hoping to improve upon the result of the 1st last Saturday when Waltham Abbey left 4-0 victors. We welcome too our Match Officials who are James Keane in the middle assisted by Steven Walsh and Paul Roberts. The last competitive meeting between the Clubs occurred on 15th March 2021 when we visited Silver Jubilee Park in the semi-final of the London Senior Cup and left having lost a match, which could have gone either way, by the only goal scored midway through the second half. Committee members will recall the occasion as one of superlative hospitality. Unfortunately, Hendon were to be losers in the Final after a penalty shoot out with Brentford "B". Despite both Clubs being over 100 years old - Hendon were formed in 1908 just one year after us - and despite our geographical proximity the Clubs have never been in the same Division of the same League so there have never been League matches between us. It looked like there would be when we won promotion to the Premier Division of the Isthmian League for season 2018/19 but the FA put a stop to that by moving "The Dons" sideways into the Southern League at the end of that season thus bringing to an end 55 years of Hendon's Isthmian membership. Prior to the Cup Final friendlies between the Clubs had been held in December 2020 (Borough won 5-3 at Coles Park), July 2018 (Borough won 3-2 at Silver Jubilee Park) and July 2015 (2-2 draw at Silver Jubilee Park). There was a Cup games between the Clubs when Borough entered Middlesex County Competitions for a few years in the late 70s/early 80s and the game at their Claremont Road Stadium also ended with a 1-0 Hendon win Jubilee Park has also been the venue for two recent Cup finals firstly on 2nd May 2023 when a superb London Senior Cup Final against Charlton Athletic Under 23s which we eventually lost 5-3 after extra time after fighting back from a three goal half time deficit. Then a year later to the day our Women's Capital Womens Senior Cup Final against Ashford Town (Middlesex) was staged there and although losing 4-2 we pushed our National League opponents all the way. At Under 18 level the Clubs have met 7 times in The Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League with Hendon winning 4 and Borough 3 with Hendon having scored 22 to our 17. The final one of the 4 consecutive seasons was 2021/22 when Hendon completed the double but we had won both games in 2020/21 (Covid meant that only one meeting took place in 2019/20 when Hendon won at home) and in 2018/19 both teams won their home game. At Under 23 level there was a Friendly at Coles Park in August 2018 which Borough won 3-0.

THE VIEW FROM THE BELL END



Several people have asked what the difference between being in Step 4 and being in Step 5, in the non-league pyramid, means for the club. From an FA competitions perspective, we will continue to compete in the FA Cup but will be entering the competition at its earliest entry point the Extra Preliminary Round, previously we came in one round later, the Preliminary Round.

We will swap entering the FA Trophy which is open to Step 1-4 clubs for the FA Vase which is open to Step 5 and 6 clubs. The furthest the club has ever been in the FA Vase is the Quarter Final stage in 1978 when we were beaten by losing finalists Barton Rovers.

We will still be entering the London Senior Cup, as Step 5 is the cut off for clubs entering that competition, we have fond memories of the competition having been semi-finalists and finalists within the last 4 years. We have been used to entering the Isthmian League Cup in recent years and that is replaced by two cups for league sides in the Spartan South Midlands League. The Gladwish Challenge Trophy for teams across all three divisions and there is a Premier Cup for just Premier Division teams.

On the field a big change will see the introduction of Sin Bins, an FA initiative since 2019, Sin Bins were brought in to reduce dissent, if a player is sent to the Sin Bin and it is their first yellow card they receive a yellow card and are sent to the dug out for 10 minutes. If the dissent is the 2nd yellow card, then they are sent off immediately, no ten minutes served, straight for an early bath.

Changes can also be seen in the media, the Spartan South Midlands League does not appear on Football Web Pages so it will be more difficult if you want to keep up with other games around the league. A personal disappointment is that the coverage of games is much less in the Non-League Paper for Step 5 clubs there are no match write ups just a mention of the score of the game and the goalscorers, if you are lucky.

It should be said we are no strangers to Step 5 and in fact have spent the majority of our history as Haringey Borough at this level, our previous spell in the Spartan South Midlands League started in 1989/90 when it was called the Spartan League, merging in 1997/98 with the South Midlands League to become the Spartan South Midlands League and we remained there until the end of the 2012/13 when we were moved sideways to the Essex Senior League, where we stayed until 2014/15, 26 years in total.

SIN BINS

Temporary Dismissals - otherwise known as 'sin bins' - are mandatory for acts of dissent across all of grassroots football.

HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:
1st half: Continues into the 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent



Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline



Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted



A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play



If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!
