HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name



was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way guite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women reasserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Playoff position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF KINGS LANGLEY FC

Kings Langley Football Club is one of the oldest in Hertfordshire, having been formed in 1886, with the village doctor, Frederick Fisher as its first Chairman. Founder members of the West Herts League in the 1891-92 season, Kings Langley also won the St. Mary's Cup in front of 3,500 people at the Watford Recreation Ground in the same season, retaining it the next year and losing the final on a replay the following year. Early pitches were at Groomes Meadow, Blackwell Meadow and Kings Langley Common and although it has been stated that the Club did not move to Home Park until 1913, the pitch was certainly hosting a 1898-99 match against Hemel Hempstead Town in front of 300 spectators.

After slipping down the divisions, Kings Langley's first league honour came in 1911-12, winning the Division 3 title, followed by the Division 2 Championship in 1919-20. The following two seasons saw an uncomfortable time in the Herts County League, before returning to the West Herts Division 1 in 1922-23. A similar drop down the divisions led to the Club folding in February of 1930, only to be reformed four months later, with a Division 2 Championship and Webster Cup triumph at the end of the first season. The return to the top flight lasted only two seasons, but two years later Kings Langley topped Division 2 for their fourth divisional title. 1934 saw a new pavilion built on Home Park and this was opened by the future F.I.F.A. president, Sir Stanley Rous, who kept a close interest with his local club.

The Herts County League was then reformed, but Langley took the radical step of joining the Southern Olympian League, taking the second and first division titles in successive years and spending two seasons in the Premier until the outbreak of war.

A 1939 application to play in the F A Cup was accepted in the post of 1945, leaving Kings Langley to raise a side in four weeks! Amazingly, the Preliminary round was negotiated before losing in the first Qualifying round. Missing the first season, Kings were back in the Herts County League, gaining promotion from Division Two in 1946-47. In the five seasons that followed, the First Division title was won twice, runners up spot achieved twice and the St. Mary's Cup won after a 58 year gap.

Kings Langley regularly competed in the F A Amateur Cup and in September 1949 entertained the famous amateurs of Corinthian Casuals. Although losing 1-3, the match provided plenty of local interest with over 500 watching the game.

Three successful seasons in the Parthenon League followed, but travelling expenses were high, so it was back to the Herts County League in 1955-56 for a tenure that would last for the next 45 years. Gradual improvement led to back to back Premier League titles in 1965-66 and 1966-67, plus a Herts Charity Shield triumph (66-67) and the Aubrey Cup in 1967-68. This was probably the first 'golden period in the club's history and although the 1971-72 season saw the St. Mary's Cup won again, relegation followed a year later. Three seasons in Division One culminated with promotion as champions, the forerunner of two seasons up, two seasons down, before another promotion was overshadowed by the loss of Home Park to redevelopment in 1980. A nomadic existence followed, playing at Oxhey, Rolls Royce and Buncefield Lane and finally the Leavesden hospital ground, until the first weekend of March 1997 saw a dream finally realised as Kings Langley's senior and junior teams took up the residence of their new ground at Hempstead Road under the banner of the Associated Football Clubs of Kings Langley.

The reformation of Kings Langley Youth Football Club in 1989 after a 19 year absence was to play its part, as both junior and senior supporters combined to launch a project of obtaining the Hempstead Road land, laying two pitches and building a pavilion. Sponsors included the National Lottery, Herts. F A, Dacorum Borough Council, Kings Langley Parish Council and the club's great benefactor, Graham Gaywood, who tragically passed away so soon after the dream was realised. The ground is named Gaywood Park as a tribute to someone who made it all possible.

However, the new home did not bring an immediate turnabout in results and despite winning the Rickmansworth Charity Cup, Langley were involved in relegation battles for the next two seasons. Form improved and as the first season of a new century ended, a top four finish was achieved. This was followed by the heartbreak of losing the title race on goal difference in 2000-01 and the decision was taken that the time was right to apply for a higher level of football. Promotion was accepted to the Spartan South Midlands

League at Division One level and while the club held its own with three mid table finishes, the continuing upgrading of ground requirements by the League at this level saw relegation to Division Two in 2003-04.

The first season in the lower tier was disappointing and Steve Heath was appointed manager for the next campaign. A sixth place was followed by the runners up spot the next season, but ground standards were still an issue and promotion was denied. 2007-08 saw magnificent treble success of League, Division 2 Cup and the retention of the Herts Intermediate Cup This included a club record run of 47 consecutive matches unbeaten in all competitions between 15-09-07 and 15-10-08. Promotion was granted on the basis of floodlights being in operation by late March 2009, but the slow turning wheels of the Local Planning system meant that this deadline was missed by a matter of weeks. Although seating improvements had been made in anticipation of Premier status, this was not considered and the club remained in Division One. Hard work ensured that the facilities accorded with standards for Step 5 in the pyramid, but by the start of the 2009-10 season, Steve Heath had moved on. He was succeeded by the experienced Paul Hobbs, who took a new young side to an encouraging 7th placed finish, as well as the semi-finals of the Herts F A Senior Centenary Cup and quarter finals of the Challenge Trophy and Division One Cup. 2010-11 saw his emerging side further improve to third place and narrowly miss promotion, as the Club celebrated its 125th anniversary.

2011-12. The Club took fourth place in Spartan South Midlands League Division 1, won the Herts Senior Centenary Trophy for the first time and were Herts Charity Shield & Division One Cup runners up. Paul Hobbs retired at end of season and Ritchie Hanlon & Paul Hughes were appointed joint managers.

2012-13. An encouraging sixth place in SSML Division 1 was achieved, with the bonus of winning the League Division 1 Cup

2013-14. Kings were Division 1 Runners Up and promoted to SSML Premier Division. Winners of the League Division 1 Cup, retaining trophy.

2014-15. Became SSML Premier Division champions at first attempt and won promotion to Evo-Stik Southern League Division One Central.

Achieved the double by winning the Challenge Trophy (League Cup).

2015-16. Won the third consecutive promotion by finishing as champions of the Southern League Division 1 Central.

2016-17. A turbulent season saw the departure of Paul Hughes and Ritchie Hanlon at the end of October and the return of Paul Hobbs as manager. The season was a battle against relegation from the Southern League Premier in the debut season and back to back wins in the last two games ensured safety.

2017-18. The reorganisation of Steps 3 and 4 for 2018-19 meant only one team was relegated and while failing to improve on last season's record, Kings were never in danger. Steve Conroy was promoted from coach to manager in December, succeeding Paul Hobbs.

2018-19. Achieved highest placed position in the history of the Club, finishing sixth and missing the play offs by one point. Steve Conroy departed at the end of the season due to failure to reach a financial agreement. **2019-20**. Dean Barker appointed manager, but was succeeded in September by Chris Cummins. Club moved laterally to Southern League Premier Central. Ten match unbeaten run at start of 2020 took Kings to edge of play offs before season was concluded in March due to global pandemic.

2020-21. Season again abandoned due to pandemic.

2021-22 Club moved back to Southern League Premier South and avoided relegation with back to back wins in the final two games.

The Youth section continues to flourish and now boasts twenty six boys youth teams and two girls youth teams, ranging from Under Six up to Under Eighteen.

The club has now been granted FA Charter status and looks to further improve its facilities as well as to make further progress up the football pyramid.

2021-22. Lateral switch to Premier South on resumption of a full season. Injuries and narrow defeats condemned Kings to a relegation dogfight, and against the odds, status was preserved on the last day with a win at Salisbury.

2022-23. Lateral switch to Premier Central. Another relegation battle saw Chris Cummins resign in November, but despite a good start Chris Winton was unable to halt the slide and relegation was confirmed with two games to go.

2023-24. Jordan Parkes was appointed manager and after a good start, Kings hit a poor run of form mid-

season and despite turning the corner in the latter stages were disappointed with a mid table finish. **2024-25**. Kings were fourteen points clear of the relegation zone at the start of February, but a disastrous run of games without a win led to the appointment of Steve Heath for the climax of the season. He was unable to turn the tide in the timespan involved and despite winning the last game, Kings were overtaken by a single point and relegated.

A huge THANK YOU from John Bacon

This article has appeared in 2 programmes for our Friendly matches but is being included for the 3rd and last time in this programme for our first home League match as attendance is sure to be much higher and I hope that all or more of "the 23" will read it.

At last I have the opportunity to express my gratitude - and astonishment – for the kind remarks of so many people, 23 no less, which almost made the programme for our last home game with Walthamstow on Easter Monday look more like a Fanzine of the "John Bacon Appreciation Society" than a football Club programme.!!! I don't have all the e-mail addresses and phone numbers of my praise singers so rather than thank some but not all hope that this article will be seen by all of them. I was taken totally by surprise as having proof read programmes I don't read them again after they have been uploaded so the changes came as a massive surprise. Neither had I an inkling that the Plate presentation was planned; I knew the Mayor and our MP were attending and that I would be introduced to them as a Club stalwart but never expected anything more.

Throughout my tenure I have received nothing but full co-operation and support from everyone connected with the Club from Tom, all his helpers and the players as much as from everybody involved in off field activities. I have occupied many roles at the Club but was never a player (nowhere near good enough) or First Aider (no wish to face a manslaughter charge). The lower reaches of AFA football in the 1950s and 60s and a final season with a Sunday pub team in the grandly named but short lived Vange and District Working Mens League constituted my playing career although 20 years later I put my boots on again to be in the "dads team" which provided training opposition for our young teenage daughters. Of course they ran rings round me but in my defence (not dropping any names) several went on to play or have a trial for England. But in the days when we ran a Reserve team in the SSMFL I did come within a couple of minutes of taking the field to make up the numbers at an evening away match at Harpenden Town when well into my sixties, but mercifully the late arrivals got there in the nick of time and saved both me and the Club from what would undoubtedly have been a huge embarrassment. Of course, like every one with a passion for their Club, I experienced moments of elation and despair based on match results but in all my years with the Club I cannot remember ever having had an unfriendly exchange with anyone and that is more important to me. That's more than enough about me, but there are some others I must mention. First and foremost our long serving Chairman Aki who devotes so much time to Club affairs it seems incredible that he also manages to head up a successful firm of Solicitors. Someone said there might not now be a Club without my contribution, which is not the case but is certainly true of Aki who has for so long dipped generously into his own pocket to keep it solvent. Generosity is the first characteristic which comes to mind at the mention of his name. He puts a brave face on it but he must surely be devastated having come so close to fulfilling his National League dream only for us to drop back to where we started. So many ambitious Chairmen, usually with totally ridiculous expectations of EFL football, throw in the towel and walk away as soon as they realise such is not going to be quickly and easily achieved; but not Aki who has stayed the course and it would be wonderful if he could be rewarded with a start on the upward road again at the end of this season which is the least his dedication deserves. It was his decision 10 years ago to introduce the free season ticket offer, about which a good deal of scepticism was then expressed, which has sent our attendances soaring. By 2015 our "one man and his dog" attendances in the dying years of the Athenian League in the mid 80's were behind us but a three figure attendance still meant the visiting team must have sent a sizeable contingent. Now we enjoy figures of several hundred plus a good few more dogs. That the figure falls significantly at matches where we are obliged to charge everyone and share the proceeds with the visitors is testament to its success and shows that we have a substantial core of devoted supporters, who probably have blue and yellow blood in their veins, and our many attendees at away matches, which are far from cheap days out, does nothing to dampen their enthusiasm for flying the Borough flag wherever possible and introducing the home supporters to their amusing repartee of songs. That the female and children elements of the regular attendance have so vastly increased illustrates how we have become such a friendly, family oriented Club and the Junior Borough initiative, about which Aki is justifiably proud as can be seen from his article in the Walthamstow programme, bodes well for the Club's future under his stewardship.

Then there is our extraordinarily long serving First Team and Club Manager, Tom, who joined us in March 2009 when relegation back to Division 1 of the SSMFL was a threat and in the interim took us to the very brink of National League status in the last pre-Covid season. Sadly it has been downhill all the way after normality was restored but his affection for the Club is such that he will relish the chance to take us all the way back up, and even higher, hopefully in a shorter time span and starting this season


Next up is Karla Parker and it is indeed possible that the Women's team would not have survived some difficult times without our joint determination to keep it going. Its always been a pleasure to work with her and Karla's commitment to and involvement with the Club now far exceeds just looking after the Women's Section.

Now that I can in some ways assist again it is still as much of a pleasure as ever to work with him and I am so glad he welcomes my involvement even though he could cope perfectly well without it. Of course he welcomes the input of all who wish to be involved. I am conscious too that although I was retired for the last 20 or so years of holding office, Nick also has a demanding job to cope with as well as being the leading light of the "Bell End Boys". In truth, the hand over would have occurred by now anyway as the FA's relentless drive towards 100% paperless administration would have necessitated it because of my limited on-line abilities. I hope the Club realises how lucky it was to have such a ready made IT genius who is so passionate about the Club on hand to take over. I vaguely remember being honoured with the SSMFL's Secretary of the Year" award in the dim and distant past and who would want to bet against Nick receiving it too if they are still making that presentation? So many Club Secretaries concentrate exclusively on their First team. But not Nick who will be seen at as many matches of all our teams as he can fit in. It was typical of him that when the season was basically over but the Women's team had a meaningless final away League game to fit in near the end of May - at Letchworth on a Wednesday evening - he was there, together with Dewi (another passionate Bell Ender frequently seen at non First Team games), they having also gone out of their way to pick up Fiona and I on route. Starting age probably means that he will not run up an involvement as lengthy as mine but I hope and expect it will be a long, rewarding, enjoyable, and hopefully more successful, tenure. Few Clubs are fortunate to have the benefit of being in the care of a triumvirate of the quality of Aki, Tom and Nick. They too are lucky to have such a sizeable, band of eager helpers.

THE (FORMER) SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

Our opening home League match sees us pitted against Kings Langley, formed in 1883, and it is the first League match between the Clubs as they have never before been in the same Division of the same League. In truth both Clubs probably regret it is taking place at all as it has been brought about by the relegation of both Clubs at the end of last season – "The Kings" from the Southern League and us from the Isthmian. The fortunes of both Clubs have been remarkably similar in recent years for both were Step 3 Clubs for several seasons; Kings Langley from 2016/17 to 2022/23, Borough from 2018/19 to 2023/24. After relegation Kings Langley spent 2 seasons at Step 4 while we were relegated again in our first season back at that level. Todays game is the third between the Clubs as there were pre-season friendlies at Coles Park on 29th September 2017 and at their Gaywood



Park ground on 5th September 2020. Langley won both by 3-0 and 2-1 respectively. There have been two matches between our respective Under 18 teams in the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League firstly at Gaywood Park on 10th January 2019 which Borough won 5-3 and then at Coles Park on 18th March 2019 which Borough won 5-0.

HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:

1st half: Continues into the 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent

Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play

If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!

HERSON ALVES – Herson began his footballing education with Brentford and Inverness Caledonian Thistle, before carving out a career in non-league football. His journey has taken him through clubs such as Hampton & Richmond, Maidenhead United, Walton Casuals and Enfield Town. He signed for the Boro in the summer of 2025 from Hayes & Yeading United





GEORGIOS ARESTI – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

DEREK ASAMOAH – Derek played 49 times scoring 12 goals last season. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal.





DANIEL AWOKERE – Joined Boro in the Summer of 2025, Daniel is a defender who normally plays centre half, previous clubs include Welling United.


