HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name



was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way guite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women reasserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Playoff position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF HALSTEAD TOWN FC

The club was formed in 1879 following a meeting of 16 "interested gentlemen" in the Town Hall. In the early years friendlies were played against local villages before the club became members of the North Essex League in 1894. The first trophy of note was winning the Essex Junior Cup in 1902, beating Chingford 2-0 in the final at Chelmsford.

During the early years of the century the club competed in the Halstead & District League and also the Haverhill & District League. They played at various grounds in the

town including Three Gates, Ravens Meadow, King George playing field, Courtaulds Sports Ground and Coggeshall Pieces.

In 1947 they won the Essex Junior Cup again, beating Eton Manor 6-3 at Grays. In the following year they moved to their present ground at Rosemary Lane which had been developed from parts of three fields. In 1949, the clubhouse was opened and the 500-seater stand was added a year later.

Halstead then joined the Essex & Suffolk Border League, finishing joint runners-up to Sudbury in 1955. Three years later, under Bob Curry Snr, they landed the Championship as well as the League Cup, beating Lakenheath 11-4 on aggregate in the final.

Four Border League titles, six runners-up places and four League Cup victories were amongst the honours that followed before the club moved up to the Essex Senior League in 1980. In this league, two third places and League Cup runners-up spot were achieved.

In 1988 Town joined the newly formed Jewson League First Division, from where player-manager Dennis Longhorn led the club to promotion to the Premier Division and the final of the League Cup

In 1992 Keith Martin was appointed manager with Ian Phillips as coach, and the club went from strength to strength. They were pipped by a point for the title, but landed the Essex Senior Trophy, beating Canvey Island 2-0 at Braintree.

The following season 1994/95 they took the title by seven points from Wroxham, and followed up with the title again in 1995/96, this time with Ian Philips in charge. For good measure they took the League Cup as well, beating Fakenham 4-0 in the final at Diss.

Steve Parnell, who lifted the club to a promising seventh spot, ended a disappointing spell with Danny Greaves in charge and then Terry Benson was appointed manager. With only one win in the first 12 games, he then departed and Shaun Bailey took over the reins.

Due to work commitments, Shaun left and was replaced by the Paul Grimsey, formerly with Sudbury Town. Working with very limited finances and resources, his first season ended with the relegation to division one. One year later, Andy Clark joined as assistant manager, and together they were able to land the Division One League and Cup double. They also won the Uttlesford Charity Cup, overcoming Stansted at Leyton Orient's ground at Brisbane Road.

Season 2003-2004 proved to be a very satisfying one; Town ended up in seventh place and reached the Essex Senior Cup semi-final before being beaten by Aveley. Paul Grimsey then handed over the reins to Andy Clark, who added a professional touch to the proceedings. His second in command was Gary Harvey, with keeper Lloyd Pentney also playing an important part.

Season 2004-05 was another excellent season with Town finishing in third position in the league and winning the League Cup for the second time, beating Histon Reserves 3-1. They also reached the final of the Essex Senior Cup before going down 0-1 after extra time to a very good Thurrock side.

The next season was a very turbulent affair, with high hopes of success early in the season replaced with a battle against relegation by the end. Off field problems saw the break up of the complete first team squad, and also the departure of manager Andy Clark. Mitchell Springett took over in charge but was forced to leave due to ill health.

Under 18's manager Tony Kinsella was appointed early in 2006, and with a young and inexperienced side made continual improvements until safety was assured on the final game of the season. The following season, though, the club was unable to fend off relegation.

In 2007, Jody Brown, joined from Tiptree United, and using the experience he gained from working with Colchester United youth players, kept a youthful team in the promotion race until pipped for promotion by Whitton United.

The following year, some new faces were brought in and promotion was on the horizon again. However, Lady Luck did not smile on Halstead and again we missed out on promotion, this time on goal difference to Debenham.

In 2010, Halstead reached the final of Division One KO Cup, losing 1-2 to Clacton and also suffered an extratime defeat by Ryman league team, Tilbury, in the final of the East Anglian Trophy.

At the start of the 2010-11 season, manager, Jody Brown decided to stand down and with the resulting uncertainty many of the previous season's players moved on to other clubs. Rob Munro, previously with Haverhill Rovers, was drafted in as a short-term stand-in replacement and a decision was made that the club would pursue a youth policy.

The team that started the season was a mixture of players from the previous year, with some recruits who had moved over from Haverhill and a number of academy trainees.

Initially, results were hard to come by and the team found themselves near the bottom of the league. In November, Jimmy Holder took over the reins as manager, his fourth such stint for the club, and the team began to find its feet and climb up the table. Helped by four victories in the final five games the team eventually finished in 11th position.

The following season the club had a measure of success in the FA Vase, securing victories against two clubs from higher divisions before being eliminated, and they ended the season a respectable 6th place in the league. By the start of 2012-13 season, the league had new sponsors and a new name. Formerly the Ridgeons League it was now to be known as the Thurlow Nunn League. At this time a new name also appeared on the bench for Halstead with the recruitment of Mark Benterman as assistant manager. Mark, who as a player had spells with Peterborough United and Chelmsford City was previously manager at Maldon St Mary's. At the end of the season he was promoted to team manager with his predecessor, Jimmy Holder, remaining on the bench as his assistant.

In Benterman's first season as manager, 2013-14, the team finished 6th in the league and also brought some silverware to the club by virtue of a hard-fought, 4-3 victory at Witham Town in the final of the Tolleshunt D'Arcy trophy. This brought the trophy back to Rosemary Lane for the first time since 1997.

Another success for the club was the recently-formed Vets team who remained unbeaten throughout the season and won the North Essex Veterans league at the first attempt.

Despite this, the club's focus was still on gaining promotion to the Thurlow Nunn Premier League. The following season was disappointing but a strong challenge was made during the 2015-16 season, with the club still in with a chance of promotion until the very last game. However, on that fateful day results went against the club and the final league table showed the Humbugs, as they were now known, in 4th spot, one place below the promotion places.

During this season, changes occurred off the field. Jimmy Holder stood down as chairman and in his place Darren Mitchell took over the hot seat, joined by some new additions to the committee, and it was decided that work should be started to improve the ground and facilities. The clubhouse was completely modernised, showers updated and thanks to assistance from new sponsors, Milbank Concrete, the external walkways and terracing was greatly improved.

The 2016-17 season is one that will be remembered for the exciting FA Cup run which saw Halstead beat two teams from higher divisions. Firstly Newmarket Town from the Thurlow Nunn Premier League were beaten 2-1 at the newly-named Milbank Stadium before Halstead travelled to the other side of Essex for a sensational 3-2 victory at Ryman League side, Thurrock FC.

The reward for this was a tie at near neighbours, AFC Sudbury and over 100 Humbugs supporters made the short trip across the county border to see the encounter. On the day, however, the home side, who play their football in a league 3 steps higher than Halstead, were just too good and the FA Cup dream ended with a 6-0 defeat.

Nevertheless, the endeavour and application of the players, together with the conduct of the visiting supporters did themselves and the club proud.

Later the same season, Mark Benterman left the role of manager and was replaced by Mark McLean with Pete Travers as his assistant.

For season 2018-19 the Football Association made changes to the structure of the Eastern Counties league and Halstead Town joined a new league, the Thurlow Nunn First Division South. In their first season in this league, the club challenged for first spot all season but unfortunately fell away towards the end and eventually finished 3rd.

The club celebrated its 140th anniversary in 2019.

Halstead Town have had a prolonged period in Division 1 but after 15 years at Step 6 they finally won promtion in 2021/22 when they, surprisingly, beat Buckhurst Hill in the play-off final after losing the two league games against them 10-1 on aggeragate.

The Humbugs first few seasons back at Step 5 would see them consolidate at that level and whilst not challenging for honours they were rarely in danger of going down, although at the mid point of 24/25 season that were in the lower reaches but they turned their fortunes round and finished comfortably mid-table.

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Halstead Town, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, referee Marc Rister and his assistants Emma Delaney and Tristan Hall. Thank you as well to Neil Blackaby who has sponsored today's game.

After the first week of the season, we have four points from six and it could and should have been all six, but we'll take that start. THE (FORMER) SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

Today's FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round FA Cup tie with Halstead Town is only the second meeting of the Clubs despite both being well over 100 years old. They are known as "The Humbugs" which is presumably a reference to their vertical striped black and white shirts. Halstead were formed in 1879 as Halstead FC and added "Town" in 1946 but we have never been in the same League at the same time as although they spent several years in the Essex Senior League that did not include the two seasons we were in membership. Halstead spent their whole existence in Leagues with exclusively East Anglian catchment areas until the Eastern Counties League's recent expansion southwards which did bring them to Coles Park to play our then groundsharers Hackney Wick in Division 1 South on 25th January 2020 – which they won 4-2. Our previous match with them was in the

An interesting stat is that last season saw the greatest number of FA Cup games we have played in one season, seven, and given the abolishment of replay's last season from the first round, we did our bit to support the FA Cup replay in the qualifying rounds by having three of them. Overall, our record last season was three wins, three draws and a loss.

Our most successful season remains 2018-2019 when we reached the first round proper hosting AFC Wimbledon and being selected for a live TV appearance on BBC2, despite the 1-0 loss it put the club on the map and was a tremendous occasion.

JUST 75 days after Crystal Palace stunned Manchester City to lift the FA Cup at Wembley for the first time in their history, the world's most famous cup competition is back for its latest instalment.

Indeed, it seems almost unfathomable that, in the week the kids break up for their school holidays, the summer is all but over in the world of Non-League football with the 2025-26 campaign already up and running. Where did the time go?

The first name etched in the history books for the new campaign is Sherman Artmeladze. His goal after just two minutes of Soul Tower Hamlets' 5-2 Essex Senior League win at White Ensign last Friday night handed him the accolade as English football's first goalscorer of 2025-26.

It's very rare for The NLP to report on competitive football in the month of July, but it was great to sink our teeth into a bit of league action last Saturday with no fewer than ten Step 5 and 6 leagues kicking off and getting valuable minutes in the tank ahead of this week's potentially lucrative FA Cup opener.

Western League side Ivybridge Town, Westside, of Combined Counties League Division One, and Eastern Counties Leaguers Fakenham Town hit the ground running with seven-day openers, but star of the show was veteran former Notts County striker Craig Westcarr, who hit four goals in Sherwood Colliery's 5-1 opening-day victory at Gresley Rovers in United Counties League Premier North – still banging them in at the age of 40.

So, the perfect pre-cursor then to the big FA Cup curtain-raiser on Friday night with seven matches to whet the appetite for the weekend.

And it's one of those matches which throws up one of those quirky tales from which the FA Cup never fails to disappoint.

When NPL West side Bootle take on Midland Leaguers 1874 Northwich in a big battle of the north-west, it will prove to be a proud day for the Woolley family.

Bootle's attacking midfielder Joe Woolley is a player who loves to dribble and take on his man, but the chances are the man wearing 1874 Northwich colours trying to stop him making forward progress will be his older brother Matt.

And that's not it, as Matt will be able to count on back-up in the form of middle sibling Jack, who completed a transfer from neighbours Winsford United to 1874 this summer.

"I've mentioned to people at work that I'm playing in the FA Cup, and they loved it when I told them I'd be up against two of my brothers – it's an added reason for them to come and watch," Joe told The NLP.

And Matt added: "It's always weird when you come up against your close friends in a game, maybe more so if it's your brother because it's so rare.

"I don't think I've got the better of him yet either, although I do remember him turning up for Christmas dinner once with a big grin on his face after scoring against us for Kidsgrove the previous Saturday.

"Dad [Stewart] will just want us to play well no matter what the result is," added Matt, 1874's record appearance holder and the only player to have featured every season since the club's formation.

"Nobody would choose to play an FA Cup tie as their first competitive game and we'll probably start as underdogs, but we're hoping to catch Bootle cold and sneak through if we can."

This week, the FA Cup trophy paid a visit to Step 5 new boys Harwich & Parkeston, taking their place in the competition for the first time in six years on the club's 150th anniversary.

The Shrimpers have prestigious history in English football, having reached the FA Amateur Cup final in 1953 where they played at the old Wembley Stadium in front of a reported Non-League record crowd of 100,000 people.

Among those in attendance that day was Harwich club president Terry Francis whom, at the age of 87, was at the club's Royal Oak ground to see the FA Cup in all its glory.

"It's a great honour for the club to get the FA Cup here at the Oak," he told The NLP this week. "It's our 150th anniversary later this year so it ties in wonderfully."

So, another year, and another place in history at stake. Who will be the headline makers this time round? The FA Cup is back.

HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:

1st half: Continues into the 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent

Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play

If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!



MATT TRAVELL: Matt has become a stalwart of the Humbugs line-up and turned out 44 times last season, taking him to 161 in total. He had made a real impression whether it be at the back or a more forward role in the middle of the park and as well as his defensive prowess he has also contributed some vital goals, 15 in total. His value to the team underlined by the winning of the players player of the year award last season

THEO DUFFIN: Theo joined us midway through last season on loan from Chelmsford and his no-nonsense approach provided a defensive platform for the team to build from. He has already made 28 appearances in the black and white and his input to our strong finish to the season was marked by him being given the Chairman's award for last season.

MATT COPPEN: Matt had a stop start to the season as once again a long term injury interrupted his run of games. He made 17 appearances in all, bringing his Humbug total to 76 in which he has netted 5 times- although none came last term. He is a solid performer at the back and has been missed when out through injury.

ROBBIE BENNETT: Robbie, a fans favourite, also had a frustrating season which was dogged by injuries and he only managed 21 appearances, although his did see him pass the hundred mark for the Humbugs. This landmark being achieved when he started against Romford in March.

A solid and consistent performer he provides defensive security but pops up with the odd goal, having scored 8 in his Humbugs career- although none last season.

ROSS WRIGHT: Played most of his youth football in Maldon and Tiptree and later spent time at Braintree and Heybridge, before going to university. He played for the Nottingham Trent Uni before coming back to this area and has been impressive in pre-season and a great addition to the squad.

ALFIE CLEAL: since making his first Humbugs appearance in 2020 Alfie has been dynamic in our midfield with his wholehearted defensive work, combining nicely with surging runs and the happy knack of scoring goals. At the end of 2024/25 season he had racked up 159 games and netted 36 times, a one inf our ratio of goals per game impressive for the midfielder.

JOEL OLDER: Joel made a welcome return to the Milbanks during last season, after a short spell with Cambridge City, and immediately the Humbugs fans saw him perform as he had in his previous stint at the club. This favourite with the fans managed to score 12 goals in just 23 games and that bought his Humbugs total to 38 in 107 outings.

LUKE BURGESS: Luke progressed from the U23's at the beginning of the season to being a regular part of the first team set-up, with 30 appearances, mostly from the bench. This dynamic midfielder is a huge talent and will be looking to take more steps forward this season.

GEORGE FRODSHAM: George became a Humbugs following a brief spell at Melford (after playing at Hullbridge) and was very impressive on his debut against Stansted. He went from strength to strength, despite an injury lay off, and ended the season with four goals from his 38 appearances- as well as a number of hugely influential games.

DEAN AGER: Last year Dean enjoyed his first season at Step 5, joining the Humbugs from Stanway Pegasus in the summer. He topped both the appearances chart, with 46, and also the goal scorers chart, with 12- which made

him joint leading scorer with the returning Joel. An energetic midfielder and a wand of a left foot made him a great addition to the squad

LEWIS CLIFFORD: Local lad who made the step up from our neighbours Earls Colne. His energy and desire on the field is infectious and helped bring a strong tempo to the team. He has an enormous work rate and was constant threat to oppositions defences in the thirteen appearances he made last season.

OWEN BETTS: A hard working front man who came into the side last season after a number of weeks of trying to entice him across. A real handful for the opposition and in his 23 games he managed to bag himself 5 goals. It is exciting to see how he kicks on this season as the spearhead of the attack

SAM NORTON: A strong, young midfielder who progressed through the Under 23's last season to make a number of appearances for the first team. He has excellent ball skills and in his 10 appearances last season- mostly of the bench- proved that he has talent and application to be a member of the Humbugs side for years to come.

OLLY MICALLEF: Olly has joined us from Chelmsford City where he spent a few years but his progress was hampered by a bad injury. This ball playing central midfielder has great awareness and vision and will become an important cog in the Humbugs wheel.
