HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name



was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way guite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women reasserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Playoff position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF STANWAY ROVERS FC

Introduction

Stanway Rovers Football Club is a football club based in Stanway, in Colchester, Essex, England. They are members of the Isthmian League North Division and play at the FND and KMCO Community Stadium, 50 New Farm Road, Colchester, Essex, CO3 0PG (what3words = supper.lions.coffee)



1922 to 1956

Stanway Rovers Football Club was formed in 1922 with Mr Brooks as President, Mr Jarman as Secretary and Mr "Fred" Tiggy Nice on the committee. Mr S Isom then took over the job of secretary from Mr Jarman, a position he retained until he became a successful referee.

The First Team initially played their matches on a field owned by a Stanway rose grower. This field is now used by St Leonard's Nursery (also called Stanway Garden Centre). The club then moved to play on a pitch in Winstree Road (formerly Stanway Straight Road), with everyone carrying their kit to the pitch from their "changing rooms" in St Andrews Church Hall (formerly "The Mission Room") on London Road. Their next pitch was a much shorter walk, being on a meadow near St Andrews Church Hall. Houses have since been built on this meadow.

In September 1923 the club had two teams, both playing in the Kelvedon and District League:

the First Team, playing in Section 2 of the full league and the Stanway Rovers Junior Team, playing in the Junior League

The First Team moved to the Essex and Suffolk Border League (date unknown), becoming Division II B Champions in the 1927–28 season – their first trophy.

1956 to 1975

10th July 1956 is recognised as the official formation of the "modern club" of Stanway Rovers. The first members' meeting of the "modern club" was held at St. Albright's Hall in Stanway, chaired by Jack Poole of the Essex County FA.

On this date the club transferred from the Essex and Suffolk Border League to Division Two of the Colchester and East Essex League and moved their home matches to the King George V playing fields in Lexden (commonly known as the Clairmont Road pitches).

By 1960, Stanway Rovers had progressed to the Premier Division of the Colchester and East Essex League and in 1961, they relocated back to Winstree Road, to the playing fields of Stanway Secondary School (now called The Stanway School). The headmaster at that time, Mr Gardham, became Club President, an office that all Headmasters at the School held over the 18 years or so that the Club stayed there.

They won the Premier Division title in the 1967–68 and 1973–74 seasons and, in the 1974–75 season, they reached the final of the Essex Junior Cup but lost 1–0 to Takeley.

1975 to 1992

In 1975, Stanway Rovers transferred back to the Essex & Suffolk Border League, joining Division One. In 1978, they were placed into the newly created Division Two, finishing third in the 1978–79 season and earning promotion to Division One.

In 1979, the club secured a 99-year lease with the local council for a 4.6-acre plot of land – which was given the name "The Hawthorns" after the shrub which grew prolifically in the area at the time. On 18th November 1982, their new clubhouse, also named "The Hawthorns," was opened.

The club was relegated back to Division Two of the Essex & Suffolk Border League but won the division in the 1981–82 season to get back into Division One. They were again relegated back to Division Two and won the division again in 1985–86 to return to Division One. They won Division One the following year, in the 1986–87 season, securing promotion to the Premier Division of the Essex & Suffolk Border League.

The club reached the final of the Essex Intermediate Cup in the 1989–90 and 1990–91 seasons, losing both finals 3–1.

The 1991-92 season saw Stanway finish as runners up in the Premier Division and their application to join

the then Jewson League was duly accepted. The club was granted Senior Status and their first game in the Jewson League Division 1 was a 2-2 draw at Swaffham Town on 22nd August 1992.

1992 to present

Floodlights were installed at The Hawthorns in 1992, inaugurated with a friendly match against Norwich City. The 1991–92 season saw Stanway Rovers finish as runners-up in the Essex & Suffolk Border League Premier Division, which earned them promotion to Division One of the Eastern Counties League.

Although it had served the club well since it had been built in 1982, the club house was rebuilt across 2000/2001. The new, air-conditioned headquarters of Stanway Rovers Football Club, consisting of a Members Bar and a function room and kitchen, plus a Committee/Board Room, was officially opened on 28th March 2001 by Colchester MP Bob Russell (later to become Sir Bob Russell).

The club won the Eastern Counties League Division One title in the 2005–06 season, gaining promotion to the Premier Division.

They went on to win the League Cup in 2008-09, beating Leiston 4-2 on penalties in the final. They won the cup again in 2011-12 with a 2-1 win over Norwich United in the final.

At the end of the 2017–18 season, Stanway Rovers were transferred to the Essex Senior League. At the end of the 2018-19 season they were moved back to the Eastern Counties League Premier Division. They were transferred back to the Essex Senior League in at the end of the 2020-21 season.

The club's football pitch, club house and functions rooms were renamed from "The Hawthorns" to "The FND & KMCO Community Stadium" at the start of the 2024-25 season.

The club were "double" cup winners in the 2023-24 season, winning both the Errington Challenge Cup and the Peter Butcher Memorial Trophy. The 2024–25 season saw the side promoted to step four for the first time as Essex Senior League champions. The club are currently members of the Isthmian League North Division.

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Stanway Rovers Community, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, referee Nigel Owen and his assistants Mark Jenkins and Rami Badaoui.

I'm writing these notes on Wednesday morning on the Overground, fairly glum faces around me and here I am chuckling to myself, grinning from ear to ear, that could be why the seat next to me is free. What we saw for 45 minutes last night was sensational, to welcome the league leaders who must have arrived fancying their chances and to blitz them in the way we did was unbelievable and I mean we were literally all in disbelief. We looked a proper team, Coby in midfield had planted a sign in the middle of the pitch "Thou Shall Not Pass" and they didn't or dare to, Matt was busy finding space all over the pitch and they couldn't keep up with him, Cash and Bilal pulling the full backs out wide and then leaving them for dead, it was wonderful to watch, truly wonderful. Given the nature of the first half the second half was never going to live up to what we had seen and it didn't, an early goal for Sawbridgeworth gave them hope and a further two goals made the scoreline take on a look that didn't really reflect the game. For the crowd of 250 the game will live long in the memory, I can't remember seeing us being 5-0 up at half time before, I'm sure fans will be quick to remind me that we were 5-0 down at half time to Merstham in 2021, though!

Four games in we sit on top of the table and with most teams from our league in FA Cup action this weekend a win for Dunstable Town away at Colney Heath is the only result that can stop us staying there.

Putting the league to one side today's game against Stanway Rovers gives an opportunity for an upset, by winning the Essex Senior League last season Stanway have been promoted to the Isthmian North League, the league we were relegated from! So, an opportunity to test ourselves against higher opposition. Need to let it go but it still hurts. 

There have been 2 Cup meetings firstly on 25th September 1999 when they were 4-3 winners at Home in the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Vase after which they went on to win 3-1 at home to Abingdon Town in the next round followed by a 3-3 draw



There was a season around the turn of the century when our respective Womens teams were in the same Division of the Eastern Region Womens League.

WHEN Stuart Fleetwood dusted down his scoring boots to turn out for hometown club Newent Town last week, he was preparing for his 23rd season in senior football.

It's a career which has taken the 39-year-old striker to a whole host of clubs, from League One down into Non-League, even managing Swindon Supermarine for past two seasons.

Fleetwood, the former Hereford, Forest Green Rovers, Luton, Eastleigh and Sutton United striker, revealed to The NLP this week that he even had to borrow his son's shinpads to turn out for the Hellenic League Division One Daffs, the club where he played most of his youth football before he was spotted by Cardiff City.

"I feel good in my body, I feel pretty fit and it's the club I used to play youth team football for so I've done a complete full circle," Fleetwood told us.

"Until any coaching jobs come up, I just want to go out and play on a Saturday. That's why I'll never retire – I'll probably always be knocking around looking for a game.

"I've actually had to borrow my son's shinpads for this week. Sonny is with the Under 12s at Forest Green. He's lent me his shinpads for the first game and told me to sort myself out after that."

Fleetwood may been settling back into the old routine he knows so well – but there are a number of Golden Oldies out there, still playing, who can relate to the thrill of being put through their paces for another season. Indeed, also in last weekend's edition, we reported on former Premier League striker Charlie Austin preparing for a fresh start at Southern League Premier South club Basingstoke Town and scoring on debut last Saturday at the age of 36.

Alongside that on the NLP's back page, we run a story on former Charlton, Nottingham Forest and Birmingham City striker Lyle Taylor following his move into National League South with Chelmsford City.

Also this week, we've seen another former top-flight big gun, Grant Holt, earn himself a new deal. At the ripe age of 44, the former Norwich City and Forest front man has teamed up with Eastern Counties Premier division side Dereham Town.

Indeed, 40-plusses are commonplace in Non-League these days it seems.

Carlos Edwards, the former Sunderland and Ipswich wide man, is now 46 but turning out regularly for Hadleigh United, also in the Eastern Counties, similarly the great Kevin Ellison, an EFL stalwart with Tranmere Rovers and Morecambe who is leading Vauxhall Motors' front line at the same age, and Chris Dickson, now at Step 3 Cray Wanderers and proving that life does indeed continue to flourish at 40.

But perhaps the oldest playing regular still currently turning out is Jamie Cureton, player-manager at Isthmian North side Cambridge City who turns 50 later this month.

As someone just a few months older than Jamie and who gets tired just watching the game at that level, I'm amazed how that's even possible.

Cureton now will have the record of another veteran top-flight frontman, Barry Hayles, in his sights having played Step 6 football at Windsor FC at the age of 51 before the club resigned from the Combined Counties League this summer.

Elsewhere, strike pair Matt Rhead and Tom Pope hold joint player-manager roles at Kidsgrove Athletic at the ages of 41 and 39 respectively, while the effervescent Jon Challinor is beginning his 13th season at Southern League Premier Central side Stamford at the age of 44.

The former York City and Aldershot midfielder led the England Over 40s side to World Cup glory earlier this summer.

And talking of club legends, Ian Henderson is still banging in goals at Rochdale at the age of 40. After a decade at Spotland, over two separate spells, Henderson is quite easily Rochdale's record goalscorer and has been rewarded for his loyalty with a new deal from Dale boss Jimmy McNulty, his former teammate.

All of these Golden Oldies, and many more still turning out in the Non-League game, continue to put their bodies on the line purely to ignite their passion for the game they have loved their entire careers. They really are an inspiration to us all.

HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:

1st half: Continues into the 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent

Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play

If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!
