HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY



The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th. in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially

composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF WORMLEY ROVERS FC



Wormley Football Club was originally formed in 1921 playing its home matches on land donated by Joseph Rochford & Sons, at that time a big name in horticulture as well as being an employer of a large percentage of the local population. The Club was reformed in 1947 after the 2nd World War, moving to its present ground at Wormley Playing Fields, in Church Lane in 1954.

During the late 1940's, 50's and early 60's the Club was a major force in Junior Football, frequently embarrassing more senior opposition during that period. The late 1960's, and early 70's saw a decline in fortune, however, this was redressed and by 1975 the Club had progressed to join the Herts Senior County League, where they had two teams performing: the first team in the Premier and the Reserves in Division 2. Despite a few near misses over the years the First team have never managed to lift the Premier Division title.

The highlight for the Reserve team was winning the Division 1 Reserve title in 1998-99 dropping only four points in the process. Since stepping up to the Herts Senior County League, the Club formed a successful Youth Section in 1975, with a number of players going on to play in professional ranks. David Bentley, Arsenal, Blackburn & Spurs began his football career with Wormley Youth as did Charlie Lee, Peterborough, Gillingham Stevenage and Yeovil Town.

The next step was the addition of a flourishing and successful Vets section in 1984. In line with League requirements, a fixed post and rail was installed in 1990, floodlights were added in 1994, and the brick-built dugouts in 1996. Adam Arnold achieved a fifth place finish in the last season of County league football before embarking in the 2018/19 campaign at step 6 in the Thurlow Nunn league.

Despite a tricky start to the season the side settled by October playing at the new level taking several scalps along the way notably inflicting the only home league defeat on eventual champions Hashtag United. A good start to the 2019/20 season saw Wormley spend much of the early season in the top five but a poor run in November and December led to a managerial change take place in February.

Jamie Elliot stepped up from assistant to take charge and with a few changes the club went on a long unbeaten run which lifted them to eighth place when the season ended due to covid19. The team had also reached the final of the Herts Centenary Trophy in which they were due to play Oxhey Jetts reserves. This game however did not take place, and the Herts F A jointly awarded the trophy. Off the field the club installed a new 75 seat stand in March and look forward to the 2020/21 season which will see the club celebrate their centenary season with celebrations hopefully taking place in the new year.

The centenary season saw us consolidate ourselves in the division with a seventh-place finish and grateful for an undisrupted season at last. Jamie retained most of the squad going into the 2022/23 season but started slowly throwing away points turning winning positions into draws which saw us struggle to climb out of the bottom half early on. September saw a managerial change Jamie Elliot moving to Cheshunt in an assistant manager role.

The Club moved quickly to appoint Ryan Wade and John Stevenson to take charge. With the addition of some players with step 5 experience the club went on an amazing run of results that took us into the top three by Christmas accompanied by a good run in the FA Vase bowing out to higher level Sheringham Town in front of a large crowd at church lane. The new year saw continued positive results and saw us go top with three games left after beating eventual champions Frenford at home. However, the terrible April weather saw us have to play the last three games in six days which saw us drop into the play off places where we succumbed to a strong Sporting Bengal side who would gain promotion to the Essex senior league.

Disappointment was compounded when Ryan Wade decided to leave for Ware FC at the start of pre-season training. A dozen players followed in various directions leaving us in a dire situation with barely a month to go before the start of the season. Dean Harrison originally appointed to assist Ryan took charge and to his credit and some players who have stayed loyal have managed to pull a squad together to get us up and running again. Dean Harrison however decided to take a lucrative position as CEO of Kent United after only six games but Ryan Wade unhappy at Ware FC was very keen to return and rebuild the squad he had assembled from

last season. Ryan's return soon took us on a run of results that saw us climb into the Promotion places and a title race with Benfleet Fc. Our encounter away at Benfleet in October, although totally dominating, resulted in a rare 2-0 defeat but one we avenged winning the return 4-0 in March to keep us hot on their heels, following this up by beating Harlow Town 4-2 to jump into top spot. This only lasted briefly as Benfleet won their game in hand and this is how it remained until the end of the season. So it was the play offs for the second year in a row. Both games were nail-biting affairs, firstly beating Clapton Community F.C 3-2 in injury time then defeating Dunmow Town 2-1, again in injury time thanks to Bradley Empson's late winner to send a massive crowd home happy. So on to step 5 Football for season 24/25 let's see where it takes us.

The 2024/25 season was certainly a historic season for the club being its first at step 5 football, and it proved to be a memorable one for many reasons. A fairly slow start soon gained momentum with an amazing five away win run pushing us into the top six where we would remain for most of the season to eventually claim fifth place and the last play off place. Alongside good league form several good cup runs would see us make two county cup semi finals but somewhat disappointingly we fell at the first hurdle in both FA cup and FA Vase. The Herts Senior Cup saw us narrowly lose at home to Hemel Hempstead Town in the semi after taking the scalps of higher opposition in Kings Langley and Borehamwood on the way. The Herts Charity Shield saw us score two late goals in the semi final away at Oxhey Jets to take our place in the final against Tring Athletic. We went on to lose a close final 2-1 to Tring the inform side in the South Midlands League for the last half of the season which saw them take the runners up spot in the league. Our fifth place then meant a trip to Tring for the semi final and we gained quick revenge for the previous weeks cup final loss beating them 2-1 to take our place in the play off final away to London Lions. In front of a large crowd Wormley came back from a goal down to level at 1-1 but could not find the breakthrough needed to avoid the dreaded penalty shootout. Some heroics from the London Lions keeper meant it was not to be our day and we lost out on the chance of a second successive promotion. Congratulations though to Ryan Wade and his players and staff for what was a truly fantastically entertaining first season at step 5 and good luck for the current campaign.

Beau had double the reason to smile - not only did she lead the lads out for the opening fixture, but she was also celebrating her birthday! What a fantastic way to mark the special day.

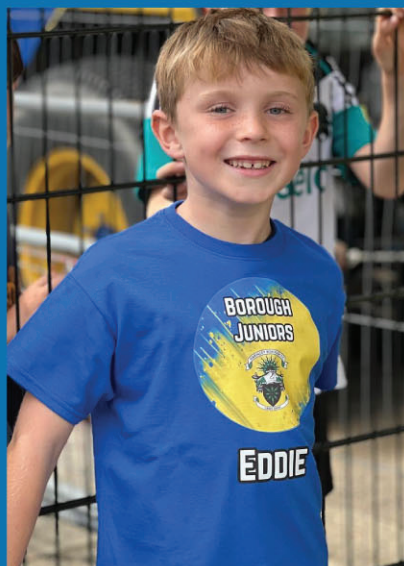




BOROUGH JUNIORS MASCOT MOMENTS

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Wormley Rovers, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, referee Ben Soll and assistants Noel Glavin and Lior Koskas.

Our last home game was the 16th August, so after a month away, welcome back! It hasn't exactly been a joyous time away but at least in the next two and a half weeks we have three home games starting tonight. So where do I start, probably best to take the 5 games, newest to oldest.

Certainly, in the last two and a half games we have been lacking a spark, something or someone that is going to turn the game in our favour, close games that are competitive and where there is little between the teams aren't going our way and we need to change that and change it quickly. I don't think it is arrogance or misplaced worth but currently we seem to be a scalp for teams, probably because we've come down from a higher league but because of that we need to put more effort in than the opposition, use the ball better than the opposition and show more commitment than the opposition. Obvious to say maybe but needs saying. Mind you being seen as a scalp may change if we remain in 12th place in the league!

Saturday's game was a classic example of the need for a spark, tight game, nothing between the two teams but we didn't really start to exert ourselves onto the opposition until Zayshaun came on and we started finding space. If our aspirations are promotion or play-offs. we need to start winning games like that. A player that has shown himself to be a good acquisition is Johnville Renee at right back, comfortable on the ball he is always looking to get forward and start an attack, he has impressed so far.

Against Arlesey Town the week before we didn't create much again, in what was a largely frustrating game, I don't remember a save their goalkeeper had to make and the closest we came to scoring was a shot in the second half late on from Matt that hit Jorge Sambu on its way towards the goal and deflected away. The game also saw a penalty save by Ashlee which was given following Daniel Awokere pulling a forward back for which he received a red card. There was much debate about the double jeopardy rule and why he was sent off and a penalty given but as he made no attempt to play the ball and it was a pull, a red was given. Arlesey are the only unbeaten team in the league and they showed they are organised and like to get the ball forward quickly. We won't get to avenge the defeat until the 21st February 2026 so let's hope by that stage of the season it is a game that really matters.

On Bank Holiday Monday game we were away to AFC Welwyn who play at Potters Bar's ground, a 2-0 defeat and previous visits up the A111 mean we can only describe the place as a graveyard, whilst we should be disappointed with the result and the second half performance the first 20 minutes we absolutely battered the opposition and how we didn't score I don't know, if we had of scored I'm sure the outcome would have been totally different, for me bigger than the disappointment of the result was the red card received by Adrian Clifton in the final minutes, which has meant him serving a three match ban, with the last game being tonight.

Two days before the Welwyn game, 23th August, we continued our interest in the FA Vase with a 2-0 win over Stanway Pegasus. An early Matt Young goal followed by a second from Bilal just before half time, meant the second half became a formality as Pegasus rarely threatened. The win sees us take on Sawbridgeworth Town away this coming Saturday in the Second Qualifying Round.

And finally, we come to our last home game on the 16th August against Stanway Rovers in the FA Cup which was a real lesson for us, at the time it was our first defeat of the season and it's fair to say it was a comprehensive one, we had chances when the score was close but didn't take them and got punished. To be fair to Stanway Rovers are easily the best team we have played this season and comparing them against the Isthmian North sides from last season there is no doubt they will be pushing for the play offs / promotion. To clear up the incident that took place midway through the second half, a Stanway substitute was brought on who didn't appear on the team sheet exchanged with the referee and ourselves before the game. It was an administrative error, the player was eligible to take part in the game, he was just missed off the sheet, on my part there was certainly no schadenfreude and I was pleased there were no repercussions for their secretary. As such our FA Cup journey is over for another season, given the BBC did a special feature on the cup a week or so ago and only two rounds after it actually started, I couldn't help but feel a tad disappointed that we

were no longer involved but in truth we were well beaten.

As mentioned above this Saturday we are away to Sawbridgeworth Town in the FA Vase, a repeat of the 5-0 first half performance against them in the league would be welcome. We are then without a midweek game followed by a visit to Harpenden Town on the 27th September. Once that game is complete our record for Saturday league games will read home played none, away played five. Given our crowds are always significantly larger on a Saturday and consequently our income greater, this has been a disappointing start to the season in terms of our fixture spread. Our next home game is Tuesday 30th September against Colney Heath.

A few updates on players, Wraynel Hercules and William Danquah have departed, we wish them both well and may see Wraynel playing against us at Harlow Town as he has signed for them. Returning to us is Sami Bassadi, a popular player from a couple of seasons back, good to have Sami back. It was great to see Rakim come on in the Arlesey game following injury but sadly another injury will keep him out again for a few weeks. Daniel Awokere is back today after his one game suspension for his sending off but Adrian is serving the last game of his suspension.

I've said in previous programmes that we need Coles Park to become a fortress we have won both our league games here this season and with the slant of away games to home games so far, we will soon be climbing the table if we do.

Let's get behind the team and come on Boro, there's no place like home!!

Women's Team

John has covered the women's team in depth later in the programme, all I want to add is that we have seen some cracking games, particularly the Bowers & Pitsea and Stevenage games. If we had a club player of the month the goalkeeper Erica Meale, would be a shoo-in for winning it for September already.

Reserves

It's fair to say it's been a difficult start to the season for the reserves, 1 win, 2 draws and 2 losses is an unusual position we find ourselves in, generally competing at the top of the table we are currently occupying 10th position in the league, early days and it's almost a completely new team from last season. This coming Friday we are at home to Kulture and the team will be looking to bounce back from a 6-2 defeat to Dagenham United on Saturday.

The U18s were knocked out of the FA Youth Cup 2-0 by Tilbury, the first game in the FA Youth Cup is always a strange game for the U18s, as it comes before the season starts so is always their first competitive game of the season. Their league campaign started 4 days after that loss in what was a much better performance securing a 3-1 win at home to Wealdstone. The goals coming from Dominic Faria, Euyéal Hagos and Omar El Gomri Bait. Last night the team played West Essex losing 2-0.

It has been good to see that already the Reserves have been registering players from the U18s to play for them. I hope players see there is a pathway for them and we provide that pathway for them, there's always something special about having one of your own playing in the first team.

THE (FORMER) SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

Today's game will be the first between our respective FIRST TEAMS for although WORMLEY were originally formed in 1921 they folded in 1926 but returned to action in 1946. They played, with considerable success, in Junior and Intermediate Football until joining the Senior ranks at Step 6 in 2018/19. They visited Coles Park in the mid-1950s to play Wood Green Town Reserves in an Intermediate Cup winning 1-0 with a very late goal. In season 2008/09 there were home and away Under 18 Fixtures in the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League which ended in a 3-3 draw at Wormley and a 4-0 Borough win at Coles Park. So it's only the 4th meeting of the Clubs today. They have twice visited Coles Park to play our then ground-sharers winning on both occasions by 3-1 against Hashtag United in 2018/19 and 3-0 the following season against Hackney Wick.

..... **WHAT COMES NEXT** is our second step on the road to Wembley and it's likely to be a sterner test than the first for we will be travelling to Crofters End to take on fellow Spartan South Midlanders SAWBRIDGEWORTH TOWN next Saturday. Although we have already won our home League game with them the first half of that match was probably our finest display of the season as we swept into a five goal lead at a time when our visitors were League leaders. However they did not accept that their position was hopeless and hit back strongly to score three times and reduce the deficit to a more respectable two goals. They will obviously be keen to avenge that defeat in front of their own supporters, at what is now known as The Toro Stadium, and some of our subsequent performances have been below par and unlikely to have seen us repeat that victory had they been our opponents. Matches with them have been quite frequent and have included several between our respective Womens teams as well as First Team matches. They were formed as Sawbridgeworth FC in 1897 and until 1976 played for most of the time in Junior and Intermediate Football. They then added "Town" to their name and despite being in Hertfordshire were admitted to the Essex Senior League in 1976/77 retaining unbroken membership of that League up to and including 2022/23 and we met them 5 times during the 2 seasons we spent in that League. They were one of only 3 teams to inflict a League defeat on us in our first season, 2014/15, by 3-1 in a somewhat fractious meeting at Crofters End which ended with our 'keeper being red carded and in one of the games he missed which was lost by 2-1 (away to the eventual Champions, Great Wakering Rovers) he would have been odds on to save the winner and the point lost deprived us of the Championship and promotion but fortunately only for one season. In 2023/24 they were switched sideways into the Spartan South Midlands League but finished bottom of its Premier Division and were back in the Essex Senior League in 2024/25 only to be reallocated back to the Spartans this season. A consequence of being so close to the Hertfordshire/Essex border. The table below records the seven First Team matches played to date, the first having been a pre-season friendly in 2006. They have also visited Coles Park on several occasions to play games against our various ground-sharers.

UPDATE ON THE WOMEN

After a disappointing start to their League campaign which bought only 1 point from their first two games, both of which were away, from an odd goal in three defeat at Wroxham and a 2-2 draw at Enfield Town a fine recovery brought 9 points from their next three games and lifted them to 2nd spot in the table. The third game was a visit to Coles Park by Harpenden Town and it marked a resumption of the multi goal matches which had been numerous last season in which 122 goals were scored in our 22 games, just over 5.5 per match, which was more than the combined "for" and "against" totals of any other Club in the Division. Unfortunately the 48 we conceded pushed us down into 4th place although our 74 equalled those netted by Champions Luton Town. So the eight goal match with Harpenden in our first home game was a return to normality and an end to end match finished 5-3 in our favour. The mandatory mid-week League match followed two days later when we visited Atletico London (formerly London Seaward) and kept a clean sheet for the first time this season which is not really our forte and was achieved only twice this season. A 2-0 win was garnered in a match we always controlled despite the absence of our inspirational goal hungry injured Captain, "Nels". Emily Pickard and Shanice Newsam did the necessary in her absence but had Nels been around she would likely have added to our tally as we dominated throughout and did not convert some fine chances. The next match, again with Nels missing, was the visit of Bowers & Pitsea – one of our clean sheet opponents last season but there was to be no repeat as they made clear with an early drive into the top corner and we needed a scrambled Chloe Ions goal created by a long free kick midway through the half to equalise. That we won was due to a magnificent display from our 'keeper Erica Meale as time and time again she thwarted the strong and determined Bowers attacks when a goal seemed to be the obvious outcome; a performance of which Mary Earps would have been proud. Not only that, but Erica is a long free kick specialist including those from over the half way line and it was one of her several such deliveries which led to our first half equaliser. Bowers seized the initiative in the second half without getting the better of Erica but it was against the run of play when we took the lead midway through the second half with a fine cross-shot from Vedhika Walia. But it didn't last long as Bowers opened up our defence rather too easily and Erica could do nothing about their equaliser from close range. Bowers looked the more likely winners but Erica had other ideas and somewhat against the run of play we scored a winner through Nia Garwood, who flicked the ball over the head of the 'keeper after a mis-kick by the Bowers defence saw her in the right place to take advantage. With some ten minutes or so left the game was far from over but Erica was in no mood to surrender two points and Bowers must by then have despaired of ever getting the better of her. So our 3-2 win lifted us to 2nd in the table and set up the vital game last Sunday away to four game, four wins League leaders Stevenage. And what a game! From start to finish it looked like the 1st v 2nd that it was. A superb match between two teams without a whisker between them. We were bolstered by the return of Nels and although we only got half a game out of her (fortunately its a rolling substitutes League) that was long enough for her to net a hat-trick. Opening exchanges were even, with chances at both ends, before Stevenage took the lead midway through the half with a rather soft goal but a clinical Nels cross shot soon put us level. The end to end excitement continued well into the second half and it was the re-introduction of Nels around its half way mark whose 2 quick goals put us ahead. Naturally a team of Stevenage's calibre was not going to surrender and if there was a disappointing element to the proceedings it was that our defence was breached twice in two minutes by close range finishes around 10 minutes plus added time from the end. A rejuvenated Stevenage looked the more likely winners in that period and had Erica not shown that last week's performance was no flash in the pan they would have been. A sprawling save of a close range effort at the foot of her right hand post a couple of minutes from the final whistle being particularly special. So 3-3 it finished and in truth anything except a draw would have been harsh on the losers. With three of today's six League games ending in draws Stevenage remain top but have lost their 100% record and we remain second; it will take a fine team to prise away one of the two top spots. Especially pleasing is that the game was played in the most sporting of spirits throughout and all the players were a credit to themselves and their Clubs, and in our case the Managing/Coaching team of Bobby, Adem and Karla. The girls now have a break from the chase for League points with two Cup matches coming up. Our support at Stevenage was less than we had hoped for but the wet and miserable weather may have been a discouragement so we hope amends will be made with a really big turnout at Coles Park for tomorrows Isthmian Womens Cup tie with Wycombe Wanderers. On Sunday 21st they will make the 160 mile round trip to Thetford Town to begin their WFA Cup campaign and will start as favourites as the hosts are in Division One North of our League in 8th place from 2 wins and 3 defeats.

We'll also be highlighting the players. At the end of August, the top scorer across Non-League football was Zak Khan.

He was closely followed by Alnwick's Euan Potts and Step 5's leading scorer from Penrith, Luke Hunter, who both ended August on 12. Potts has also grabbed two trebles, while Hunter led the way when it comes to consecutive games he scored in with nine. The closest player to that sequence is Oxhey Jets' James Barnett with six games on the spin.

At Steps 1 to 4 - having not played as many games - National League North duo Michael Gyasi, the King's Lynn Town striker, and Scarborough Athletic's Stephen Walker were the most profitable in the opening month with seven goals each.

The stats will focus on different areas throughout the season but we can't wait to see how the Golden Boot races unfold.

And who knows where these goal getters might end up. In last week's NLP, Tony Incenzo spoke to QPR's new signing Richard Kone.

It seems incredible the striker, who the Hoops recently signed from Wycombe Wanderers, was playing for Athletic Newham in the Essex Senior League a couple of years ago.

The 22-year-old scored 125 goals for the Non-Leaguers while visa issues were sorted to allow him to move into the full-time game.

"I was playing against tough men week in, week out," he said. "It helped me discover how to overcome physical defenders."

His rapid rise will be a real inspiration to so many. After all, goals pay the bills. And they also help draw in the crowds! Whitley Bay and Retford are certainly on our ones to watch in September!

For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:
1st half: Continues into the 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent



Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline



Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted



A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play



If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!

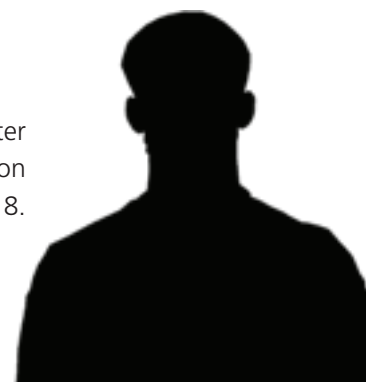

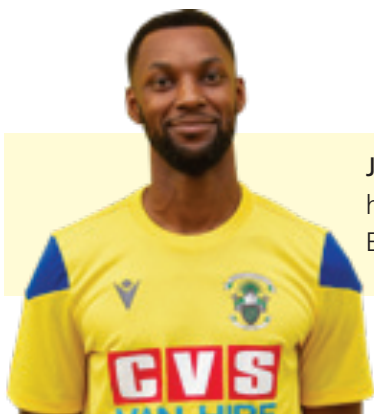
