RECENT RESULTS

It has been an excellent opening to the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division season for Borough's men as they bid to make their step-five stay a short one. Unbeaten in their last nine games, Tom Loizou's side sit second in the table and are the only team with a perfect record at home, where they have not dropped a point all season.

Victory over Hutton last weekend also secured a spot in the second round of the FA Vase. Just six more wins in the competition and we can prepare for a trip to Wembley in May!

In an incredibly congested Eastern Region Women's Premier Division, Borough's women sit comfortably mid-table, while victories over Thetford Town and Harpenden Town have secured a place in the FA Cup first round.

Our Reserves team, previously our Under 23s, also currently occupy mid-table in the Essex Alliance Senior Division.

COMING UP NEXT

Borough's men will look to take their unbeaten run into double figures this Saturday 25 October, when they host Pitstone & Ivinghoe in the second round of the Gladwish Challenge Trophy – a cup competition for all three divisions of the Spartan South Midlands League. Cup games are not usually included in season tickets, but the club has torn up the rule book for this one so entry is free to season-ticket holders!

Kicking off a run of upcoming home games, the men then host Harlow Town (Tuesday 28 October) and Tring Athletic (Saturday 1 November) in the league, before welcoming Eynesbury Rovers (Saturday 8 November) in the FA Vase second round.

The women also remain at Coles Park for their next few fixtures, starting with the visit of National League side Bristol Rovers in the FA Cup first round this Sunday 26 October. The match will feature 11 Borough Junior mascots – one for each starting player – and it would be great to get as much support as possible for what is a massive game for the club so please do come down to Coles Park!
