HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY



The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th. in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially

composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF CRAWLEY GREEN FC



Crawley Green Sports & Social Club was formed in November 1989 after arsonists caused the virtual destruction of the present building. Members of Stopsley Harriers, The Wyvern and Ramridge Rangers Sunday Football Clubs amalgamated to form the present club and were successful in securing a 99 year lease from the Council. The New Club house was formally open on 19th June, 1992 by then Luton Town manager, David Pleat.

The badge incorporates all the elements of the three founding clubs but also local history. The club badge was adopted in 1996 after many years of discussion. Maroon was the colour of the largest single club Ramridge Rangers and it was adopted as the club colour. It is incorporated in the Club badge as the bar across the middle. Stopsley Harriers were well known for their red and blue quarters, whilst Wyvern Members were predominantly blue since their foundation. Both these colours are reflected in the badge. Crawley Green FC Saturday side was formed in 1993 after another local team, Somerset Tavern came under the Crawley Green umbrella. The club colour of maroon was adopted by the team.

In 2018 Luton Town FC and Crawley Green FC further enhanced their club partnership with the announcement that Crawley Green FC will play their home games at The Brache training ground from season 2018-2019. Crawley Green, who are the only Luton based team to play at step 5 or above of the National League System, have been trying since 2008 to get permission to build a suitable stadium. Unfortunately in that time they have failed to receive the support needed from Luton Borough Council, despite there being no cost involved for the Council. This decision has meant that they have had to ground share with Barton Rovers FC for 11 years now, to enable the team to continue to play at that level.

This is a poor indictment of the Council's attitude to football in Luton, considering that other major towns in Bedfordshire have at least one team each playing step 6 or above. Their lack of support in comparison to the likes of Biggleswade (3 teams), Bedford (2 teams), Dunstable (2 teams), Leighton Buzzard (1 team) and Kempston (1 team), means that even our local leagues have the ignominy of having to travel to local villages to host their cup finals.

Luton recently installed a brand new all-weather surface down at the training ground and to comply with national ground grading criteria Crawley Green will complete the remaining requirements. This will include new changing rooms, dugouts, turnstile and spectator standing area. Tony Talbot, Chairman of Crawley Green stated: "We would like to thank Gary Sweet and Kevan Platt and everyone at Luton Town FC for firstly affording us this opportunity and then their support in making this happen.

"In the past we have seen a number of ex-Crawley Green players go on to play for Luton, but our partnership has really continued to grow in recent years. It's with great satisfaction for us that we are currently seeing James Justin starring for the first team. In addition the recently transferred Tyreeq Bakinson and four of the current U18s team, Josh Neufville, Joe Mead, Ciaren Jones and Michael Shamalo all came through our youth system.

"A town the size of Luton needs a successful professional club, as well as teams playing in the national league pyramid". This gives our talented youngsters a pathway to development, without having to go outside the borough to develop. "In addition, underneath these clubs is a large community hub, which affords lots of youngsters the opportunity to play football. These community hubs ensure all young people have the opportunity to participate in football in a safe supportive environment, which preserves the dignity and respect of the individual regardless of age, gender, sexual orientation, ethnic origin, religion, disability, income and any other social deprivation. With Government statistics showing a concerning rise in childhood obesity throughout the UK, these community hubs encourage our children to stay active and engage in physical activity. This all helps promote health, self-confidence and importantly social cohesion, and hopefully leads to the wider benefits in raising standards."

Hatters chief executive Gary Sweet said: "We see ourselves as guardians of elite football in our region and part of that responsibility is to help – wherever possible – other local, aspirational clubs develop and thrive,

staying at the core of their roots. "The challenges faced at Crawley Green were difficult and, with the great relationship we've had over the years, having recruited numerous young players from their excellent development structure, we're proud to help Crawley Green retain a local home for their competitive games, just as we are happy to utilise our existing training facility at perhaps the only time when it won't get used." In recognition of his services to the community and sport, Crawley Green Sports & Social Club Chairman, Tony Talbot was awarded a BEM – British Empire Medal - in the 2018 New Year's Honours List. Finally Crawley Green would like to sincerely thank all their programme advertisers, match ball and match day sponsors for their generous support throughout the season.

2004-05 Gary King takes over as 1st Team Manager and wins the Spartan South Midlands League Division Two and the Bedfordshire Senior Cup beating Kent Athletic 4-0 with goals from John Coley 2, Adey Bascombe 2. Crawley were denied the treble when they lost a penalty shoot out to Dunstable Town in the League Cup Final.

2005-06 Neil Tattersall takes over as 1st Team Manager

2006-07 6 pts deducted (ineligible player), costing the Club runners up spot

2007-08 Started ground share with Barton Rovers FC. Spartan South Midlands League Division Two runners up to Kings Langley. Promoted to Division One

2009-10 Bedfordshire Senior Trophy Winners. Beat Potters United 5-4 in a penalty shoot-out. Scores finished 1-1 after extra time. Ryan Smith (pen). Successful penalty takers Rian MacNabola, John Cooper, Jermaine Hall, Ryan Smith and Phil Cusack

2011-12 First Team Manager Neil Tattersall steps down after 6 seasons in charge and is replaced by Darren Salton. Darren Salton resigns in September after only 1 win in 10 games. Mark Smith is appointed manager in October 2011 with Assistant Terry Shrieves.

Bedfordshire Senior Trophy finalists - lost 0-1 to Ampthill Town.

Spartan South Midlands League Division One Cup winners. Beat Kings Langley 2-1 with goals from Courtney Massey and Chris Gibson

2013-14 First Team reaches the final of the Bedfordshire Senior Trophy but loses 2-3 to Bedford. Scorers Sean Downey and Jon Butler.

2015-16 1st Team – Runners-Up Division One – promoted to Premier Division.

1st Team winners – Division One League Cup. Beat Edgware Town 2-1 with goals from Fabio Buffano and Aaron Browne.

Reserves–Winners Reserve Challenge Trophy. Beat Hoddesdon Town 2-1 with goals from James Potter and Andy Randell.

Reserves lose Beds Intermediate Cup Final to Sundon Park Rangers 6-5 in a penalty shoot out after game finished 2-2. Scorers own goal and Rob Newman (pen).

2016-17 1st Team finish a creditable 11th in the their first season in the Premier Division. Manager Mark Smith steps down to spend more time with his family. Dean Bull takes over and Richard Smith joins as Assistant Manager.

2nd Team move to the Bedfordshire County League and finish 4th and move up to the Premier Division.

2017-18 Dean Bull and Richard Smith step down after 22 games in charge. They are replaced by new manager Chris Devane and his assistant Craig Meyrick.

2018-19 Craig Bicknell joins the 1st Team as coach and Bobby Males steps down and joins the Committee.

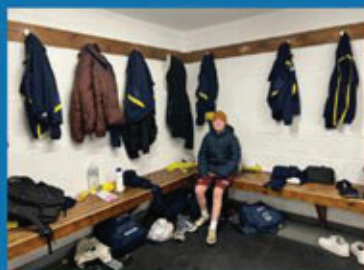

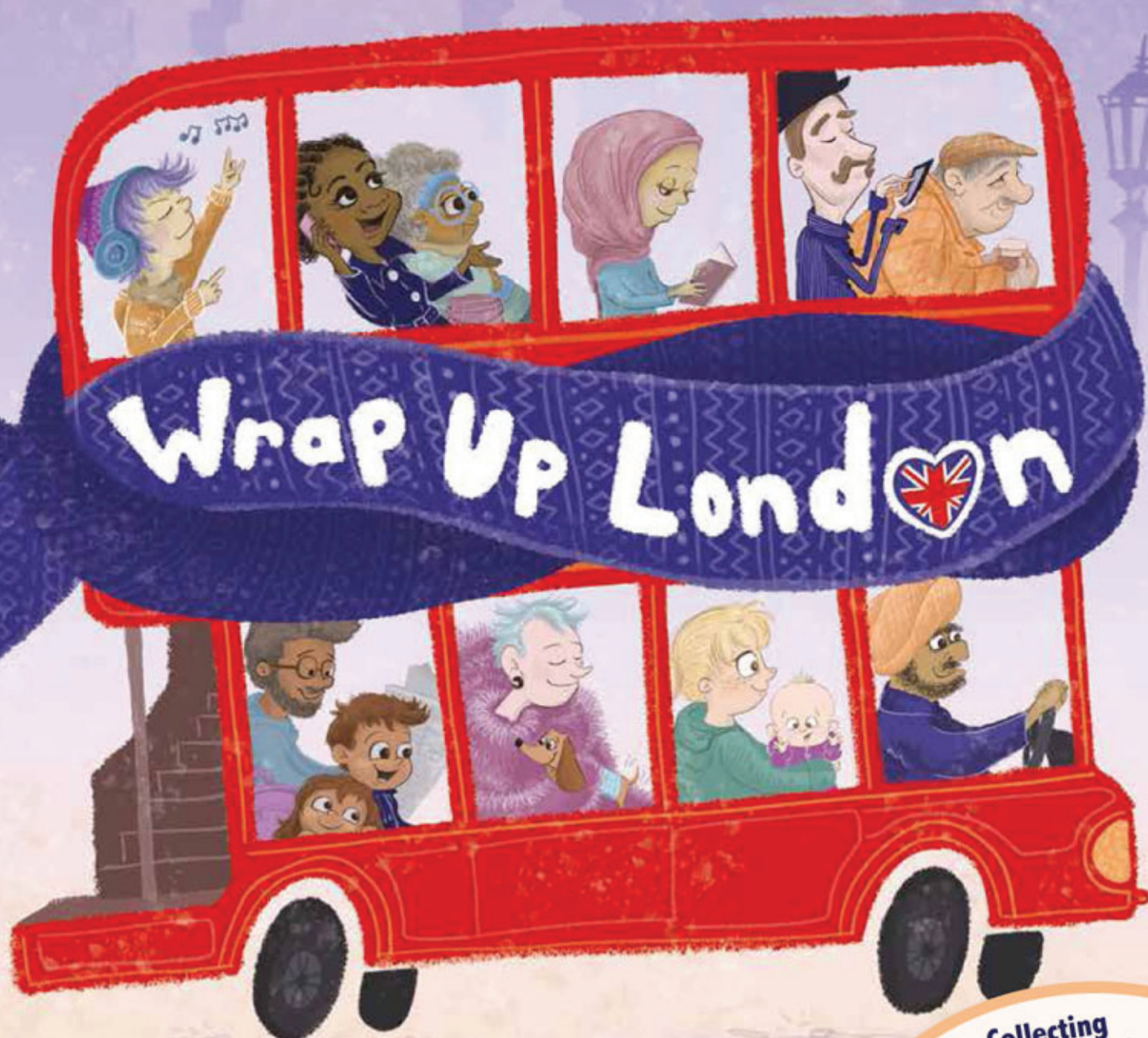

CHAIRMAN'S ADDRESS

I wish to start these notes by expressing my gratitude to all of you for the incredible support you give to a club that I can safely say is your club.

While you all see me on a regular basis, and we all engage whenever we can, it has been some time since I actually put pen to paper and updated you all on where we currently stand as a club and how I see the club moving forward under my stewardship – notably, there are two issues of great significance:

- 1.The two consecutive relegations from the Isthmian Premier League at Step 3 to the South Midlands Spartan League in Step 5
- 2.The threat to our very existence, brought about by the actions of the London Borough of Haringey, who own the freehold land at Coles Park

With regard to our recent relegations, it is relevant for you, the supporter, to know that the non-league football landscape has changed enormously over the past few years, particularly since the Covid pandemic. The monetary side of non-league football has had an impact throughout the pyramid in a similar way to the top end of league football, and that filters down even to our level.

You only have to look at the professionalism of the National League and the number of professional teams now in the National League North and South. That has impacted on clubs you would never expect to see at Step 3 – teams like Dartford, St Albans City and Welling United.

At the other end of the spectrum, you have clubs that have recently had major financial injections – teams like Brentwood Town, Billericay Town and Chatham Town. The list goes on.

Even at Step 4, you have owners taking over clubs and injecting large sums of money, with a view to climbing through the divisions. Maldon & Tiptree are the latest of such clubs.

Please do not misunderstand what I am saying. This is not a criticism of any of those clubs, and several others who have experienced ups and downs over the past few years. But it is the reality of the situation and it has implications for us. We have our place and we all participate within the same framework.

The very purpose of what I am saying is to highlight to those of you who are not aware how difficult it is for clubs to maintain their positions in their respective leagues, owing to the quality of the opponents they face week-in, week-out.

I always knew we were punching well above our weight in the Isthmian Premier League. We loved our time going to such great clubs and playing in front of hundreds and sometimes thousands of fans. I very much hope that we will again be able to participate at such a level again.

But, in the meantime, I still thoroughly enjoy the current level that we are playing at, and I am so pleased to see that you, the fans, have stood by the club despite events of the past two seasons. In perhaps a perverse way, I truly believe we have become stronger as a fanbase.

We are travelling together to new grounds, meeting new people, and engaging with other like-minded committee members and fans, which reminds us of the true ethos and togetherness of non-league football.

We all want to win and have won more this season than in the recent past, which happily leads us to experiencing once again the Saturday nights “where all I want is someone to talk to about the Haringey”.

Our club, and your continued support, help and engagement, means much more than simply winning, but it certainly lifts the spirits when we do.

The growth of the club has been evidenced by the increased uptake this season of the free season ticket and the amazing Borough Juniors section that is flourishing under the guidance of Emma and her team, bringing a whole new section of young supporters, who will become the bedrock of the club moving forward.

I also must express my thanks to the unbelievable group of volunteers, who devote so much time to ensuring the smooth matchday operations. I cannot mention you all by name here, but I can thank you as a group for what has been an ever-growing band of supporters performing their roles admirably to ensure the matchday experience for all is a wonderfully joyous one.

The club is, however, not just about the men's first team. Borough's Women have excelled under the guidance of Bobby, Karla, Adam and others, and their efforts have not gone unnoticed. Likewise, Jamie O'Donoghue

and his Borough Reserves, and the College who run the Borough Under-18s, all playing a vital part in the community engagement of the club.

I should add that, in the new year, there will be an announcement that will provide yet further opportunity for fans to become involved and an integral part of the club's decision-making process going forward.

The delay in such an announcement owes to another matter that I feel I must now raise.

Over the past few years, I have been engaging with the London Borough of Haringey over extending the club's tenure at Coles Park, where the club has been based since the 1930s.

Those negotiations, I believed, and was led to believe by the council, were going well and a new lease was to be executed. However, owing to some very recent developments, that is no longer the case and we are now in direct conflict with the council.

The case is far too complex for me to outline the details here, but I wanted to raise the matter as this is your club and if anything untoward were to happen unannounced I did not want to be accused of saying nothing to you all.

I have always been open and transparent, and wanted to alert you all to a possible looming issue with the council, who seem to want to overlook the significant stature of our club and the important role it plays in the local community.

I want to leave you with an assurance that I am doing everything possible, through legal channels, to extend our tenure at Coles Park for many years to come. My hand has been forced by recent developments where the council have reneged on promises made over several years.

I anticipate holding a general club meeting early in the new year to appraise you all further of developments. In the meantime, I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, and look forward to seeing you all at our home games over the festive period.

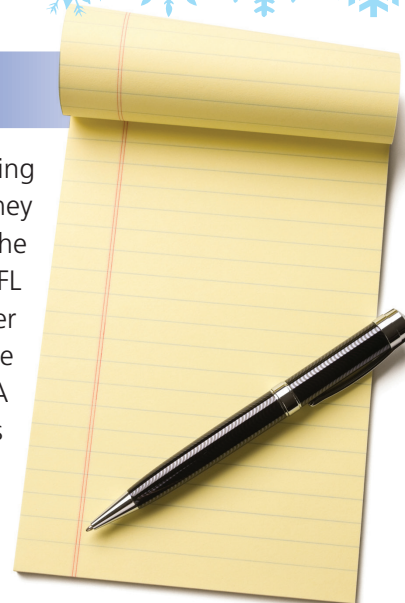

WOMENS TEAM UPDATE

After the disappointing Capital Cup defeat on 16th November the League Fixture against the same visiting Club – Atletico London - gave us an early chance to avenge it which we duly took and in doing so recorded our first “double” of the season. But it was a close run thing as the two Clubs are so very well matched that either game could have gone the other way or been drawn. We scored the only goal of an end to end first half when a corner from the right was steered home by Leila Hadari-Agaev but Atletico equalised in the first minute of the second half with a speculative long cross-cum-shot. The winner came midway through the half when Nia Garwood showed great composure as she shrugged off all defensive efforts to block her run in from the right before slipping it inside the near post from just a yard or so out. The match was far from over and remained on a knife edge throughout with many chances created at both ends but Erica dealt confidently with everything aimed at our goal so 2-1 it finished.

The following week also finished with a 2-1 win suggesting a degree of consistency but that was not really the case as there was no sign of the superb performances which had graced the previous two games. The heavy much dimpled grass pitch was not conducive to our style of play and the home side – Wormley Rovers – obviously more familiar with it took only 3 minutes to go ahead with a scrappy goal in their first attack. Thereafter they defended stubbornly while also creating further chances of their own but fortunately Erica was in fine form and kept their lead down to one. Even so we came within a whisker of an embarrassing defeat but in the closing stages of the second half we finally got the measure of the conditions and began to look like a team playing one from the Division below them. Wormley's massed defence looked like holding out and the best we could do was force a series of corners and with just three minutes left one at last fell kindly for us in the scrambles they generated and Fatima Husein smashed it into the roof of the net from a few yards out. Being a League Plate match extra time followed and we dominated that, although Wormley had their moments too but could find no way past Erica. The deep lying home defence had denied any opportunities for our fast runners to win a race for a long ball over the top but eventually midway through the first period “Nellz” found herself in a one-on-one situation with the ‘keeper and finished confidently and

accurately. Try as we might we could not get the insurance of a clinching goal and although Wormley created chances there was nothing good enough to beat Erica so we survived a nervous twenty minutes to progress into the last 8 of the competition which will bring Dunstable Town Lionesses to Coles Park on 1st February. Next up was a home League game with Watford Development and it was a match of two contrasting halves both dominated by Borough. "Nellz" confidently drove home an early penalty and a few minutes later fired over a perfectly flighted corner from the right which the unmarked Fatima Husein met with an emphatic header from around six yards or so, Watford never looked likely to mount a comeback and the half played out rather sedately. Not so the second half in which Borough put on a sparkling display and added three goals from open play. The first came from Tayla Dennis who took the opportunity to swivel quickly to hook a loose ball over her shoulder into the top corner. Nia finished one of her trademark mazy runs which created a "one on one" with the 'keeper who managed to get a touch but could not stop it trickling into the net. Connie Wakeford finished the scoring as she reacted quickest to blast home a hard low cross from Nia from a few yards out at the far post. The points were obviously in the bag but Borough continued to play attractive football right to the end without further reward for their fine build ups so 5-0 it finished.

An extraordinary match followed last Sunday. Don't really know whether to laugh or cry. It was a match we dominated throughout but lost. Nothing too unusual about that as our teams have a propensity to be the better team only to lose. But this was against the League leaders, Stevenage, whose goal we peppered with near misses and kept their 'keeper busy throughout deservedly taking the lead after about 15 minutes when "Nellz" persistence enabled her to screw the ball in from what seemed an impossible angle and somehow it eluded the keeper at her near post to trundle on slowly and finish over the line. We pounded away at their goal and could have been out of sight before, in one of their far fewer attacks, Stevenage equalised with a swerving shot. Worse was to follow as the final kick of the first half - a penalty - put Stevenage ahead. No complaints about that - this was a rare occurrence - one so obvious that nobody even bothered to protest. We maintained our onslaught in the second half but just could not put a chance away and inevitably one of the visitors pressure relieving sorties put them 3-1 ahead. mid-half. We shrugged off that reverse and still looked quite capable of grabbing a draw but a team of Stevenage's standing took the opportunity to exploit the gaps which inevitably occurred as we abandoned caution and added a fourth to give a 1-4 scoreline best summed up as ridiculous.

Last Wednesday we played out a very entertaining game at Coles Park when National League Barnet (playing name London Bees) visited us for a Combined Counties League Womens Cup game. It was an end to end affair with every attack by both teams looking likely to produce a goal. In fact ten did so (five in each half). Unfortunately seven of them were by "The Bees" but we too gave their defence plenty of cause for alarm. We fell behind after some 10 minutes or so but it was very quickly followed by an equaliser when "Nellz" angled a perfect pass for Nia to race onto from the right, collect and finish low and clinically as she so often does when offered such opportunities. But parity didn't last long as a defensive mix up gave the visitors an unmissable chance to equalise. The rest of the half saw opportunities galore created at both ends with well tested defences holding out until, 3 minutes before the interval, a spell of persistent pressure ended with Vedhika Walia putting us back on terms. Disappointingly, we could not hold on until the interval and with just seconds remaining a striker was given enough room on the edge of the penalty area to blast home a high swerving shot. In the second half our National League opponents stepped up a gear and quickly increased their lead and were 6-2 ahead by mid-half. Although we did not enjoy the same 50/50 possession as in the first half we kept plugging away and deservedly Caitlen Star finished with a powerful shot from the eighteen yard line to the left of the keeper and well out of her reach. Bees were only able to add one further goal in the remaining 20 minutes so 3-7 it finished. The defeat leaves us with just one realistic hope of silverware this season that being in the League Plate in which we have a quarter final tie with Dunstable Town Lionesses at Coles Park on 1st February. Mathematically the League Championship is still possible but it would need a remarkable number of other teams results to finish favourably for us. For this season only, the runner-up has a chance of promotion as the best second placed team from the 8 Regional Leagues will also be promoted to the National League but having dropped 16 points already from our first 12 games it would be a tall order to become the top team as even winning all remaining games would still only result in a points per game average of 2.27. There are just 32 clubs left on the road to Wembley – four more wins is all it takes to reach the big stage in May. In recent seasons we've seen Step 2 clubs make the final and, of course, Hornchurch even won it when they were at Step 3.

Perhaps it's too early still to start dreaming. But we're looking forward to seeing more memories made between now and Non-League Finals Day.

Temporary Dismissals - otherwise known as 'sin bins' - are mandatory for acts of dissent across all of grassroots football.

HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:
1st half: Continues into the 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent



Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline



Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted



A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play



If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!
