HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name



was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way guite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women reasserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Playoff position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF COCKFOSTERS FC

The EARLY YEARS: The Club was originally formed as Cockfosters Athletic in 1921 by local residents and the ground allocated to the Club by Lady Bevan, from her family estate.

Season 1938/39 saw first of two "trebles" in the Club's history, winning the Wood Green League's Premier Division, League Cup and the Barnet Cup. After the war the

1st Team moved to the strong local league of that time - the Northern Suburban Intermediate, whilst the Reserves played in the Wood Green, Southgate & District League.

The 1960s saw a re-awakening of the Club. 1960/61: 1st Team win Northern Suburban League's 1st Division and the next campaign win Premier Division. Barnet Cup and the Barnet Charity Cup finals were reached regularly with both trophies being won on a couple of occasions.

The 1970s: This decade was one of the most successful in the Club's history. 1970/71: 1st Team win London FA Intermediate Cup and finalists in Herts County League's Aubrey

1978/79: 1st Team win 'treble' of HC League Premier Division, Aubrey Cup and Herts FA Intermediate Cup; 'A' Team win the NSI Lge.

The 1980s:

1980/81: Former Barnet FC player Jeff Voyce appointed 1st Team Manager and the side claim their second Premier Division title.

1983/84: Colin Bell takes over as Manager and 1st Team win HSCL Premier Division for a third time. Colin decides to resign at the end of the campaign

1984/85: Former Arsenal player Glyn MacDonald appointed as 1st Team Manager. Team win the HSCL's Aubrey Cup and are Premier Division Runners-up.

1989/90: 1st Team win London FA Intermediate Cup.

The 1990s: 1990/91 sees the Club gain "Senior Status" the 1st Team leave for the London Spartan League Premier Division, bringing an end of 25 seasons of membership in the Herts Senior County League - all, but the first having been in the top flight - a period that saw the 1st Team as Premier Division Champions 3 times, London FA Intermediate Cup winners twice, the Herts FA Intermediate Cup winners once and finalists on 3 other occasions, HSCL Aubrey Cup winners twice and finalists twice.

2000 to Present Day: Youth football was re-introduced to the Club starting with an Under 18 side and later teams at Under 13 and Under 15 age groups.

2002/03: The Club introduce an Under 18 Youth side managed by Paul Boxer and competing in the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League.

2007/08: With the elevation into the Spartan South Midlands League's Premier Division the Club accepted into the FA Challenge Cup for the first time in their history.

2013/14: The season proved to be another successful one, with a very creditable 8th place & both the SSML's Challenge Trophy and the South Midlands Floodlight (Senior) Cup won.

The Under 18s, managed by Paul Boxer and assisted by Steve Foot, won the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League's Nemean Division and were runners-up in the League's Divisional Winners Play-Off Final.

2013, the season saw our Youth Section enhanced with a get together with Whetstone Wanderers. The Wanderers' Under 15 & Under 16 teams were to play under the Cockfosters FC's name in the Eastern Junior Alliance League. This new 'affiliation" expected to be a great benefit to both clubs and would provide a continuity of players moving up into our Under 18's, Reserves and hopefully our 1st Team.

2014/15: The season's one bright spot being the displays of our Youth Section. The U18s were Southern Counties Floodlit Youth Lge. Olympian Division winners, beating Luton Town in the SCFYL's Divisional Winners Play-off Final.

2015/16: The U14's made a clean sweep of everything, winning the EJA's Herts (Brown) Division, the EJA U14 Divisional Play-Off Final, the EJA U14 Challenge Cup and the Middlesex FA County FA's U14 Cup.

2016/17: After a very successful campaign, which saw the 1st Team finish 3rd (its' highest ever position) in the SSML Premier Div. and the Reserves as R/up in the U25 Development Div.

2017/18: The U18s were Runners-up in the SCFYL's Delphian Division. The U13s won the EJA Herts (Green) Div. and also won the AFA County Youth Cup and were runners-up in the London FA Sunday Youth Cup.

2018/19: Ryan Wade appointed as 1st Team manager with Nick Mountford assistant / coach, both having played at a higher level of football. The campaign was disappointing, but the last 15 minutes of the season's final league game saw us score 3 times to win 3-2 & avoid the drop.

The youth sides continued to do well - Vas Chiotis' U14s, winning the EJA division & reaching 2 County Youth Cup finals & Brett Cahill's U17s also reached a County Youth Cup final.

2019/20 The FA moved us laterally from the Spartan South Midlands League's top division to that of the Essex Senior League,

With the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons both curtailed by Covid19 season.

2021-2022 has been a season of change. At the end of January Ryan Wade stepped down as Manager and the highly experienced Gavin Kelsey was appointed bringing in Glenn Draper as his assistant. The 1st team reached the final of the Errington Challenge Cup Final but were unfortunately defeated 3-2 by Enfield FC.

The club continue to enter youth teams in the EJA at U13 – U18 (17). The Under 18s also continued to compete in the midweek Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League. The season brings success yet again with our U18s clinching the EJA Black Division title and the Under 15s winning the London County Cup.

Our strategy of competing in the SCFYL and the EJA at U18 continues to prove a success with many of our lads featuring in the senior squads, both representing the reserves and the 1st team

Season 2022-2023 saw Gavin Kelsey remain in charge with Glen Draper as his assistant and Phil Lovell also joining the management team. Cockfosters FC were laterally moved back to the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division and finish in 5th position.

The Reserve team continues in the Herts Senior County League with the majority basis of the squad being the youth product of our own environment. The Under 18s remain in the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League & Eastern Junior Alliance League

The season proved to be an extremely successful one for the U18 under the guidance of club chairman Vas Chiotis. The squad clinch the quadruple, winning the SCFYL Olympian division with a 100% win campaign. They also had a clean sweep on the county cups winning the U18 Middlesex Senior Cup, U18 London FA County Cup and U17 London FA County Cup.

Season 2023-2024 continued under the stewardship of Gavin Kelsey with Glen Draper, Phil Lovell being joined by head coach Ant Burns.

The first team finished well up the table but a gruelling 11 games in 22 days ultimately cost the team a spot in the play offs.

On a positive we have reached our 2nd final in in 2 years and the players and staff will be doing their utmost to be successful on the day and secure some silverware for the club!

The U18s almost repeat the success of last season with Club Chairman Vas Chiotis guiding them to another league title. They were crowned champions on the 4th April with a 100% win record. A great achievement to secure their place in all 3 county cup finals again, only this time to be beaten on penalties in all 3 competitions. Season 2024/2025 saw the management team of Gavin, Glen, Phil and Ant all in place and this continuity ensured a tremendous season for the first team, culminating in a third place finish in the table and a play off semi final against London Lions which went to penalties but Lions won and secured promotion beating Wormley Rovers in the final.

The Reserves again under the stewardship of Jason Hobbs finished mid table and reached a Cup Semi Final Chairman & Under 18s Manager Vas Chiotis achieved a phenomenal success as his charges won their third consecutive League title, maintaining a tremendous feat of being unbeaten at Chalk Lane for three years running. The team rounded of the season by beating Chesham United in a great final to be crowned Champion of Champions for the season.

We go into the new season again under the management of Gavin and have welcomed Tommy Burns, twin brother of Anthony to the club as Phil Lovell has hung up his coaching boots.

Hopes are high that the 1st team will be there or thereabouts at the end of the season.







With regard to our recent relegations, it is relevant for you, the supporter, to know that the non-league football landscape has changed enormously over the past few years, particularly since the Covid pandemic. The monetary side of non-league football has had an impact throughout the pyramid in a similar way to the top end of league football, and that filters down even to our level.

You only have to look at the professionalism of the National League and the number of professional teams now in the National League North and South. That has impacted on clubs you would never expect to see at Step 3 – teams like Dartford, St Albans City and Welling United.

At the other end of the spectrum, you have clubs that have recently had major financial injections – teams like Brentwood Town, Billericay Town and Chatham Town. The list goes on.

Even at Step 4, you have owners taking over clubs and injecting large sums of money, with a view to climbing through the divisions. Maldon & Tiptree are the latest of such clubs.

Please do not misunderstand what I am saying. This is not a criticism of any of those clubs, and several others who have experienced ups and downs over the past few years. But it is the reality of the situation and it has implications for us. We have our place and we all participate within the same framework.

The very purpose of what I am saying is to highlight to those of you who are not aware how difficult it is for clubs to maintain their positions in their respective leagues, owing to the quality of the opponents they face week-in, week-out.

I always knew we were punching well above our weight in the Isthmian Premier League. We loved our time going to such great clubs and playing in front of hundreds and sometimes thousands of fans. I very much hope that we will again be able to participate at such a level again.

But, in the meantime, I still thoroughly enjoy the current level that we are playing at, and I am so pleased to see that you, the fans, have stood by the club despite events of the past two seasons. In perhaps a perverse way, I truly believe we have become stronger as a fanbase.


We are travelling together to new grounds, meeting new people, and engaging with other like-minded committee members and fans, which reminds us of the true ethos and togetherness of non-league football. We all want to win and have won more this season than in the recent past, which happily leads us to experiencing once again the Saturday nights "where all I want is someone to talk to about the Haringey".






HISTORY CORNER Our visitors were formed as Cockfosters Athletic in 1921, playing at the Cockfosters Sports Ground in Chalk Lane as they still do, but dropped the "Athletic" suffix in 1968. They played in Junior and Intermediate Leagues, twice winning the London Intermediate Cup in 1970/71 and 1989/90 and the Hertfordshire Intermediate Cup in 1978/79. Senior status followed the second London Cup win when they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1991 and many tussles with them have since occurred. In 1992/93 they won a Preliminary Round FA Cup tie at Chalk Lane by 2-0. Individual results are shown in the chart below. Matches have also taken place between our respective Under 18 and 23 teams and those too are included.

Temporary Dismissals - otherwise known as 'sin bins' - are mandatory for acts of dissent across all of grassroots football.

HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:

1st half: Continues into the 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent

Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play

If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!






