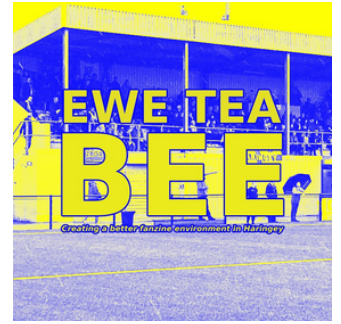


SO LONG AND THANKS FOR ALL THE FISHLOCK

I travelled to Cardiff to watch Wales take on Australia in Jess Fishlock's international swansong.

Fishlock's accomplishments speak for themselves - ten league titles across seven countries and three continents, multiple UEFA Women's Champions League wins, league player of the season awards in England, the USA and Australia. She also won 166 caps and scored 48 goals for Wales - more than any other man or woman - a record made all the more astonishing that Wales have only played 247 official matches in their history.



At the same time, those achievements have flown somewhat under the radar: by plying her trade mostly in the NWSL - where a single club rarely dominates for more than season or two, rather than a major European club where players can pad their stats by racking up the score against no-hopers; by playing internationally for Wales, who until this summer had never reached a major tournament - she has rarely been talked about as one of the game's greats.

The global plaudits, the awards, the big (or even medium) money endorsements favoured the games' more visible stars - those from internationally competitive countries like Germany, Spain, England, France and the USA.

Being overlooked extended to her omission from the Team GB Olympic Football Team, for which she missed out on selection in 2012 (a year she was named FA WSL Players' Player of the Season) and 2021 (when she won NWSL MVP).

As unjust as such omissions were, Jess Fishlock always was cult-hero rather than swaggering galactico - 5 foot 2 inches of scrappy underdog, whose gifts seemed stemmed as much from her tenacity, resilience, her ability to raise the standards of those around her and drag her team through sticky patches through sheer force of will as they did from her undoubted vision, creativity and ability to produce moments of magic.

And it was with Wales that she shone brightest - at least for those of us who were there to watch. She would circle the globe to play in a behind-closed-doors friendly and treat it like the world cup final. But for all her accomplishments, the prize she really wanted - to represent Wales at a major tournament - eluded her for much of her career; last game of the campaign defeats to Scotland, Ukraine and England; a head-to-head away goal tie-breaker against Northern Ireland; a play-off defeat to Switzerland. It felt like it would never come.

Of all her great performances in a Wales shirt (and it would probably be easier to identify which of the 166 matches she wasn't the best player on the pitch) the performance that sticks out to me was France away in 2021. One-nil down, and down to ten players, Fishlock produced one of the great Welsh performances; a one-woman blur of controlled intensity that rattled France to their core in a game they by rights should have comfortably seen out.

For as many years as I've been watching Wales it seemed like Jess Fishlock would drag Wales, kicking and screaming, out of whatever hole they were in. Her glorious cushioned volley in the World Cup playoff against Bosnia; a threaded through ball to feed Ffion Morgan when all looked lost in Poprad.

But the flipside of that was that Wales looked lost without Fishlock - during her ACL enforced absence they twice failed to beat a vastly inferior Northern Ireland side who eventually qualified for Euro 2022 at Wales' expense.

At least, until Dublin. Last December Wales travelled to the Aviva Stadium in Dublin to play Ireland. Fishlock started, but limped off after an hour. It felt ominous - the Fishlock era ending in the most heartbreaking of circumstances. But Wales extended their lead and held on to qualify for Euro 2025 - and Fishlock crowned her international career with the major tournament she had so desperately craved.

OUR HISTORY

Although Haringey Borough FC was formed in 1973, the Women's team wasn't formed until the start of season 1999/2000 and played only occasional "friendlies" in that first season.

In the summer of 2000 we merged with Mill Hill United and were accepted into Division 2 of the Eastern Region League for season 1999/2000, gaining promotion to Division 1 as runners-up to Saffron Walden Town while based at the rather bleak Donkey Lane Playing Fields in Enfield.

The merged Club adopted the name of Haringey Borough and re-located to the Coles Park stadium of the Spartan South Midlands League club, founded in 1907, in White Hart Lane, Tottenham.

2000/2001 – 16 unbeaten League matches but finished third on goal difference. Eliminated two Greater London League sides in the Women's FA Cup.

2001/2002 – 9 unbeaten League games and promotion to the Premier Division as runners-up. The League Plate was garnered with a 4-1 victory over Cottenham United and a regional 5-a-side trophy.

2002/03 – we led the League for two weeks in mid-season, before finishing a comfortable 4th, retaining the regional 5-a-side trophy.

2003/04 – the team were rocked by a sudden spate of long-term injuries and departures of erstwhile regular players but with a late burst succeeded in preserving its Premier Division status.

2004/05 – the team appeared in the finals of five small sided competitions and finished in a safe mid-table position.

2005/06 – the Club progressed through two preliminary rounds of the Women's FA Cup finishing mid-table again and were finalists in the League Cup losing by a late goal against the League Champions Norwich City Canaries.

2006/07 – the team finished third despite a slow start and early dismissal from all knock-out competitions.

2007/08 – the team lost three long serving players to National Premier Division sides and played most of the season with a very small squad. Despite that the team had three London County Cup victories including victory over local rivals Tottenham Hotspur in the quarter final. We went on to reach another semi-final in the League Cup.

2008/09 – an extraordinary season where in mid-March relegation looked a likely outcome but an astonishing turnaround saw the team suffer only one defeat in the remaining 12 games and had that game been won, the runners-up spot would have been secured instead of 4th place.

2009/10 – notable for the 5-match run in the Women's FA Cup. In December, the team led the Premier Division and looked favourites to win the Championship but an unexpected deterioration in form finally resulted in a mid-table finish.

OUR HISTORY CONTINUED...

2010/11 – a very challenging season including loss of established players and a series of long-term injuries. The team saw several successful rounds in the Women's FA Cup but the lack of depth in the squad meant that relegation could not be avoided.

2011/12 – a slow start in Division One but as our campaign gathered pace we eventually finished second and thus earned promotion back to the Premier Division at the first attempt.

2013/14 – a major development took place when the Club was struggling midway through this season with the appointment of Steve Browne as Manager and he brought with him his highly successful S & T Academy Girls who in their mid and late teens were becoming too old to continue in Youth football.

2015/16 – mid-table position was easily secured.

2016/17 – the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course at Christmas by the tragic early death of Manager Steve Browne on New Year's Day. After a shaky period we re-asserted ourselves to win the League Championship on the last day of the season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League. We followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win to complete the double.

2017/18 – several of the top players were lost to USA Scholarships and other Premier League teams and a torrid time ensued in Division One South-East and the team returned to the Eastern Region League.

2018/19 – the team began to rebuild only to see the newly appointed manager accept a role in his home Country of Greece at Christmas. A new manager was appointed and the coronavirus pandemic put a premature end to the season with results being deemed null and void.

2019/20 – The appointment of Bob Cato, formerly of Derby County Ladies, Leicester City WFC and a former Haringey Borough player, has brought about much needed leadership and strategy to the team's play. A refreshed side with new players brought in through partnership with Haringey Girls Academy means that there is now a full pathway from Wildcats to Women's football and much needed depth in the squad with 30+ players at training every week.

2022/23 – the season started strong with a team consisting of predominantly under 18s. Borough remain a contender to win the league as well as reaching the quarter finals of the Capital Women's Cup having beaten tier 4 side London Seaward en-route. Borough narrowly lost out to tier 3 side London Bees whose clinical finishing in front of goal proved to be the deciding factor.

































2023/24 - another strong season saw Borough finish 3rd place in the league convincingly beating league winners Real Bedford and Capital Womens Senior Cup runners up in addition to winning the 106 Yeomanry Regiment Royal Artillery Community 6-a-side Cup in the summer break.



























2024/25 - an early exit from the WFA Cup meant a focus on league games. Despite injury, Boro finished 4th with striker Shawna Harvey scoring 25 goals. Boro also won the Harry Garrett 5 aside tournament in the close season.
