HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY



The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially

composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF DUNSTABLE TOWN FC



Dunstable Town FC began life back in 1871 and have been playing at Creasey Park for the past 60 years.

The Club has a rich alumni with the legendary names of George Best, Jeff Astle and Kerry Dixon having played for the Club.

More recently, Peter Kioso helped perfect his trade in the Premier Division of the Southern League back in the 2017 – 18 season.

The Club has a proud record of producing young players who have gone onto play at much higher levels. Axel Piesold our former U18s Captain is now at Luton Town & former U18s player Sam Tabares signed professional terms at Fulham and made his professional debut on the 20th August 2024. Sam following in the footsteps of Eric Ameyaw in 2020 who left the Club to sign terms with Fulham.

In 2021 the Club restructured and became a Community Benefit Society (CBS) and now operates as a social enterprise.

This means that between Monday and Friday the Club concentrates its efforts on the community groups and at weekends we return to being a more conventional football club and get behind all our teams at every level. Proud members of the Football Supporters' Association network of Community Owned Clubs, the Club has pioneered a positive approach to mental health through the mental health & physical well-being programme, Improving the Lives of Others.

This is our fourth season as a CBS. The Club now operates eleven groups every week which offer support for up to 150 people.

As a Community Benefit Society our community groups have equal importance and weighting as our success on the football field. The aim is to provide a long-term sustainable future for the Club.

It's a radical approach to running a football club. The Club is run on democratic lines with supporters able to hold a maximum of one share in the Club and in so doing become co-owners, with no individual financial liability associated with their share ownership.

Our co-owners elect the Club's Board of Directors and vote on issues such as the kit design for the First Team, matchday admission & season ticket prices and even the players' walk-out music.

The Club's positive impact in supporting local people with such a wide variety of physical & mental health conditions was rewarded by the Non-League Paper making the Club their Community Club of the Year 2024.

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Dunstable Town, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, referee Thomas Hood and assistants Anthony Appadoo and Lior Koskas.

Two weeks is a long time to wait for a game but with the postponements of the games at Kings Langley and Aylesbury Vale Dynamos this has been the position we have found ourselves in. The games have been rearranged and will see, weather permitting, us travel to Kings Langley on the 3rd February and to Aylesbury Vale Dynamos on the 10th March.

2025 sadly finished in the same way it started with a home loss, Tilbury on the 1st January, Cockfosters on the 27th December. It was particularly disappointing as we never really offered much in the way of a response to going behind early and when Cockfosters scored in injury time in the first half, it looked a hard task to get something from the game and that is how it proved. Good luck to Cockfosters they came out of the traps quickly and had too much pace and played at a tempo that was too good for us on the day. It was also disappointing to see Coby not come out for the second half he has been struggling for a while with various injuries and given his importance to us, he will be a big loss if out for any period of time. Stating the obvious but if we have any ideas of promotion then we need to go on another unbeaten run, starting today.

In the Christmas programme Aki wrote about the issues we are having with Haringey Council over the granting of a new lease, for us to continue playing at Coles Park. As a result of the struggles to secure our future, Aki has arranged a fans forum to take place this Thursday (15th) where supporters and interested parties can ask questions and find out ways we can provide support. If you are available Thursday, please come to the clubhouse for an 8pm start.



THE (FORMER) SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

Although DUNSTABLE TOWN were formed in 1883 - 24 years before we were as Tufnell Park - the first match between the Clubs seems to have been well after mergers and name changes had morphed us into Haringey Borough and was at Under 18 Level in season 2007/08 in the Colwyn Cup, which was a straight knock out competition run by the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League, and Dunstable won 3-0. The following season paired us together again and this time Borough won 4-0. Both games were at "The Blues" Creasey Park Stadium. It was not until season 2009/10 that both Clubs were in the same Division of the same League, the Premier of the Spartan South Midlands, in which matches were played in that and the following three seasons at the end of which we were moved sideways into the Essex Senior League and Dunstable won promotion to the Southern League as undefeated SSML Champions. As well as the 8 League games there was also an SSML Trophy game in 2010/11. No further meetings occurred until we too had won promotion to Step 4 and were drawn against Dunstable in our first ever FA Trophy game winning 3-1 at Creasey Park. It was not until this season that there was another meeting by which time both Clubs had been relegated back to the SSML and the seasons opener in July was a draw at Creasey Park. Individual dates and scores for all of the above games are shown in the Chart below. In the interim Dunstable had made one visit to Coles Park to play our then ground-sharers New Salamis in 2021/22 leaving as 3-1 losers. Our respective Womens teams will meet for the first time three weeks hence when Dunstable Town Lionesses visit Coles Park for a Quarter Final tie in the Eastern Counties Regional League Plate competition.

IN A WEEK remembered for sudden managerial dismissals, it's somewhat refreshing to hear Alan Dowson talk so enthusiastically after celebrating his 1,000th game in the dugout.

First Enzo Maresca at Chelsea, then Ruben Amorim at Manchester United, swiftly followed by Wilfried Nancy after just eight games in charge of Celtic. The shelf-life of a football manager is as perilous as ever.

Dowson, though, has a sell-by-date far longer-reaching. The aimable Geordie has recently returned for a second spell in charge of Hampton & Richmond Borough where he enjoyed some of his most successful times in a management career that began at Walton & Hersham and also took in Kingstonian and Woking.

Hampton's 2-0 win over Farnborough on Boxing Day marked Dowson's 1,000th game in the dug-out – and the 55-year-old told The NLP that he simply can't get enough of the management madhouse.

"It's f*****g brilliant – I haven't slept for two weeks," he told us in his unmistakable, and unrivalled, jovial spirit. "I don't see the missus anymore – or the kids. I went in the other night and I think they thought I was burgling the house!

"It's great. Four o'clock in the morning and I'm blinking up. I am nervous, I've got anxiety again – it's excellent.

"I love pressure. I love everything about the game. Anxiety, pressure, nerves, happiness.

"On Monday I was driving two hours to watch Chelmsford against Dagenham. It's keeping me on the ball all the time."

And Dowson is not the only manager to have caught the bug.

Back in November, NLP columnist Tony Incenzo told how Pep Guardiola's 1,000th game in management paled into insignificance compared to Ramsbottom United boss Steve Wilkes for example.

An emphatic 8-0 victory at City of Liverpool in the North West Counties League Premier Division was the Preston-base boss' 1,300th game in the dugout having started in August 1997.

Explaining an astonishing story of dedication amidst work and family pressures, Wilkes said: "I'm really proud to hit the 1,300 mark. I've done 28 and a half years now and it is quite a milestone.

"I started out as a manager in the summer of 1997. I had been playing for Darwen when I received a phone call stating the boss was leaving and asking if I could fill the vacancy. I was only 29 and it didn't interest me at all. I had never wanted to go into management or coaching. Even so, Darwen asked me to consider it.

"I was friendly with Sam Allardyce from my professional playing days. I had previously been at Preston while he was at Bolton. So I gave Sam a ring for advice.

"He said: 'Look mate – take the position. Do it for six weeks. If you don't enjoy it, you can quit.'"

Seven years at Darwen, voluntarily and without a budget, proceeded a five-and-a-half year stint with Padiham before Wilkes joined Runcorn Linnets, where he was sacked for the only time in his career after two-and-a-half years.

Twelve months at Ashton Athletic led to him re-joining Padiham in 2012/13 where Wilkes won the North West Counties League title and enjoy a couple of seasons in the Northern Premier League.

Following another five-year stint, he then left the Storks and moved to Northwich Victoria and after leading the club to the FA Vase semi-final, Wilkes, now a grandfather, decided to retire three years ago. That was until Ramsbottom United got back in touch.

"I spoke about it to my wife of 35 years Alison," he explained. "Her exact words were: 'Yes please! I don't want you under my feet on a Saturday!' So my retirement didn't last very long."

And talking of 1,000 games, it's not just the managers achieving extraordinary feats.

Back in October, we sat down with 44-year-old Peter Clarke after making his landmark career appearance when turning out for Prescott Cables in their FA Trophy fixture with Lancaster City.

The former Everton youth defender enjoyed a remarkable career, turning out for the likes of Blackpool (two spells), Southend United, Huddersfield Town, Oldham Athletic and Tranmere over 100 times before enjoying a stellar Non-League career with two seasons at Warrington Town and now Cables after joining in the summer. And only this week, he will be joined on an illustrious 55-man worldwide list – including that of Cristiano Ronaldo, Lionel Messi and littered with top Non-League names such as Paul Bastock, Barry Hayles and Scott McLeish – by veteran winger Kevin Ellison as he too celebrates his 1,000th senior game.

This afternoon, at the age of 46, the Morecambe legend, who also turned out for the likes of Chester City, Rotherham and Tranmere, will reach the milestone playing for Vauxhall Motors against Runcorn Linnets in NPL West.

To mark the occasion, the Motormen are hosting a special celebration, including surprise guests and live entertainment with a big crowd expected.

Players like Clarke and Ellison are a rarity in football as the elite list suggests, but are worth their weight in gold.

More so, managers like Dowson and Wilkes who, as Maresca, Amorim, and Nancy will attest, are the first to carry the can when things don't quite go to plan.

HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:
1st half: Continues into the 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent



Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline



Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted



A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play



If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!





JOHNVILLE RENEE – A full back Johnville has played for several non-league clubs including Briantree Town, Hornchurch and Enfield Town.




