

## HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the



Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women reasserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially

composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

# HISTORY OF RISBOROUGH RANGERS FC



## Club History 1971–Aug 2025

Risborough Rangers Football Club began in 1970 as a team of 12-year-olds eager to play competitive football, inspired and organised by Life Presidents Tony Elsey and Derek Wallace. Derek was instrumental in forming the Wycombe Star League, which now provides opportunities for hundreds of young players in the Wycombe area. Today, Rangers run sides from Under-10 to Under-16 in that league.

In 1975/76 the previous season's Under-16s entered the Wycombe & District League as a men's team and, in only their second adult campaign, won Division Three. That side subsequently folded, and the club focused solely on boys' football until the 1979/80 Under-16s—fresh from winning the United-Carr Cup—spent two seasons in the Reading Youth League before moving into the Wycombe & District League. They achieved back-to-back promotions and were followed two years later by the next cohort as a reserve team, who matched those feats and progressed into the Ercol Senior League and then the FA Walters Premier League. Around this time the club moved to Windsors, the current home ground and former base of the now-defunct Princes Risborough Town FC, founder members of the Hellenic League in 1953. Within a few years, volunteers significantly improved the facilities, including building the clubhouse.

In 1989 Risborough joined the South Midlands League Division One. The first two seasons were challenging—finishing second from bottom and requiring re-election—but fortunes improved in 1991/92 with an 8th-place finish as the club celebrated its 21st anniversary. In 1994/95, under manager Frank Carter, Rangers were promoted to the newly formed Senior Division after finishing 4th and consolidated with a mid-table finish the following year. The mid-1990s also saw Bob Rayner's first spell as manager and the establishment of a robust youth policy, including an Under-18 team in the Wycombe & South Bucks Youth League. During this period Rangers reached the Senior Division Cup semi-final and the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy quarter-final. Rayner later departed to manage Brackley Town in the Southern League.

Assistant Jon Franklin took charge at the start of 1998/99, maintaining steady performances before a downturn led to relegation to Division Two. In 2005 chairman Richard Woodward persuaded Bob Rayner to return after his time at Thame United. Fourth-place finishes in his first two seasons were followed by a patient rebuild rooted in the club's junior ranks. Progress became evident in 2010/11 with a 5th-place league finish and a Challenge Trophy semi-final (a 2–0 defeat to eventual winners and Premier Division champions Chalfont St Peter). En route, Rangers defeated four higher-division opponents, including Division One champions Berkhamsted Town.

The 2011/12 campaign brought a late surge to claim league runners-up and a first cup final in over 20 years—the Anagram Records Trophy—narrowly lost 1–0 to Baldock Town (Hertfordshire County Senior League). The following season produced two strong cup runs: Rangers again met Baldock in the Anagram Records Trophy, this time in the semi-final, losing by the same scoreline, and reached a second final in two years—the Division Two Cup—falling 2–0 to Aston Clinton. Rangers finished 4th in the league, while off the pitch the club secured funding for floodlights, installed in time for 2012/13.

Silverware finally arrived in 2016 with a 2–1 (AET) victory over United Counties League side Olney Town in the Berks & Bucks Intermediate Cup. Bob Rayner retired after 2016/17 and his son, Jamie, took over, guiding the club to 6th and a Berks & Bucks Intermediate Cup semi-final (defeat on penalties to eventual winners Woodley United). The 2017/18 season began promisingly but faded to an 8th-place finish. A memorable Challenge Trophy run included wins over Premier Division clubs Leighton Town, Oxhey Jets, Edgware Town and London Colney before a 3–1 defeat in the final to fellow Division One side Broadfields United at Colney Heath.

In October 2018 Jamie Rayner stepped down due to work commitments. Following a strong response to the vacancy, the Board appointed Mark Eaton (formerly Hemel Hempstead Town, Arlesey Town, Leighton Town, Aylesbury United and Aylesbury FC). When Eaton arrived, Rangers sat 19th in Division One with a heavy

negative goal difference; by season's end they had climbed to 7th with a positive goal difference and lifted the Spartan South Midlands League Division One Cup, beating London Lions 2–0 in the final at Leverstock Green.

Owing to the ongoing restructuring of non-league football, the club moved laterally to the Hellenic League Division One East for 2019/20. Rangers went unbeaten and topped the table by 14 points with a game in hand over second-placed Abingdon United after 23 of 32 fixtures.

In 2021/22 the FA promoted Rangers to the Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division based on results from the curtailed 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons. The Step 5 debut was impressive: from early October the club never dropped below second place. A two-horse title race with New Salamis culminated in a final-day showdown at the BEP Stadium, where New Salamis won 2–0 to take the championship. Rangers finished second, 10 points clear of third-placed Hadley, but were subsequently denied promotion to Step 4 due to failing the ground-grading, with Hadley taking the Step 4 place.

The 2022/23 season was one of contrasts: early cup exits and indifferent league form left Rangers mid-table, but after a weather-enforced break the side reset and surged to finish 3rd, three points behind second-placed Stotfold.

For 2023/24 Rangers were moved laterally to the Combined Counties Football League Premier Division North. Midway through the campaign, Mark Eaton stepped aside from first-team duties to become the club's Director of Football. After 5+ years and 214 competitive matches—135 wins, 36 draws and 43 losses—he departed as arguably the club's most successful manager. Former Wycombe Wanderers forward Mark West, previously manager at Thame United, took over in mid-February 2024 and guided the team to a mid-table finish before leaving at season's end.

Mark Jones (ex-Oxford City, Hemel Hempstead Town and Banbury United) was then appointed. A significant overhaul followed: by December 2024 only one player remained from the squad 12 months earlier. Results deteriorated and the club parted company with Jones. Kevin Christou (formerly Tring Athletic, Oxhey Jets, Royston Town and F.C. Romania) took charge on 21 December 2024 to arrest the slide, but despite his efforts Rangers finished 18th of 20, avoiding relegation on goal difference by a single goal. Christou left at the end of the season.

The club was deeply saddened during the campaign by the sudden passing of three stalwarts: Colyn Makepeace, Chairman Richard Woodward, and Peter Boland.

In the close season Rangers appointed Gary Meakin (formerly Northwood, Rayners Lane and Beaconsfield Town) as manager and received a lateral move back to the Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division. After a turbulent period, the club now looks ahead to the 2025/26 season with renewed focus and optimism.

## THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Risborough Rangers, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, referee Ben Twitchings and assistants Mike Davis and Frank Van der Wens.

Recent postponements have seen our fixture list rejigged and this was the case following Tuesday nights Premier Division Cup game at Colney Heath which due to a waterlogged pitch has been rearranged for Tuesday 27th January 7.45pm kick off. With less opportunities of free weeks starting to take place it would be good if that game is looking doubtful it could be switched to Coles Park, as unless there is snow, we can almost certainly guarantee it taking place.

Tuesday night we have a London Senior Cup 3rd round game against Cheshunt, it is a 7.45pm kick off and as we are expected to split the admission money it will be a paid game with prices the usual £10 adults, £5 concessions and Under 18's free.

Last Saturday we had a disappointing result and performance against Dunstable Town, despite controlling most of the game we could not find a winner, after coming from behind to equalise through Jonathan Hippolyte. Along with Keir Dickson I felt Jonathan was our best player on the day and was always an attacking threat. It was definitely two points dropped as despite Dunstable belying their position in the league, as they were very organised and played with confidence, we rarely looked like conceding a second. Onto today's game and along with Kempston Rovers and Aylesbury Vale Dynamos we have yet to play Risborough Rangers this season. Currently sitting in the last play off spot in fifth in the league, we have played the same number of games but we are three points behind, which makes today's game hugely important. Their forward Elliott Buchanan is the third top league goalscorer with 15 only behind Harry Scott of Winslow United who has 17 and the top marksman Louie Collier of Kings Langley who has an impressive 22 from 21 games.

It's been a fairly busy admin week, what with dealing with pitch inspections and all the communications that go around that, we have also signed a couple of players. Coming in is Jakai Bascoe-Fisher who is a forward previously with Arsenal's U18s, I'm sure he'll be made to feel very welcome in N17, just remember our Tufnell Park roots! And a popular player from a couple of seasons back Stefanos Georgiou rejoins from Harlow Town. In our game against them earlier in the season Stef scored one and I felt and said in a previous programme, he was the best player on the pitch that night. Let's hope we are saying that frequently and it is a happy return. Welcome back Stef.

Away from the pitch albeit related to the pitch on Thursday night there was a fans forum, Aki was keen to arrange a meeting to make supporters aware of the current struggles in obtaining a lease to allow the continuation of football at Coles Park. Having had a football team playing here since 1930 we obviously want that to continue for many more years to come. At the meeting Aki ran through his history with the club and the refurbishments that he has overseen and funded, as always, he spoke with passion and his love for the club was clear. In response Haringey Council were positive that they wanted the club to remain at Coles Park but there were changes to the proposed structure of the newly formed Community Benefit Society that they would like to see. The outcome was that documentation will be sent to the Council for review and a meeting held to progress the lease. All of the people I spoke with after felt it was a positive meeting but were keen to see the lease signed and the concerns for the club alleviated. Thank you to everyone that attended, the turnout was excellent and those representing Haringey Council at the meeting cannot have failed to see and hear what a special club we have and what the club means to so many in their community.

Finally, a big thank you to John Plachetka who has been taking photos at matches over the last few weeks, always good to have photos to use for the programme and for marketing purposes. Much appreciated John. Let's get behind the team today. Come on Boro

## THE (FORMER) SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

RISBOROUGH RANGERS and Borough have met just once and that was on 12th September 2006 when they visited Coles Park for a Spartan South Midlands League Trophy game which Borough won 6-1. Formed originally in 1971 as a Club for 12 year old boys they became a mens Club as well in 1975/76. It was not until 1989/90 that they played in Senior Football when they gained admission to the South Midlands League- staying on as a founder member of the combined Spartan and South Midlands Leagues and they have played in that League ever since except for four seasons, firstly 2019/20 and 2020/21 - the two ruined by the Covid crisis - when they were members of the Hellenic League and then in 2023/24 and 2024/25 when an FA sideways switch put them into the Combined Counties League. They were then switched back to the SSML for 2025/26. Although Borough were also in the SSML for a 16 year spell during that period this is the first season the Clubs have ever been in its same Division. But Risborough are not entirely strangers to Coles Park having been here on three other occasions to play our then ground-sharers - Brimsdown on 22nd October 2016, and again on 28th April 2018 and lastly New Salamis on 16th October 2021. They won those matches by 5-1, 6-1 and 3-0 respectively.

LIAM Hughes has always been one of those players who is a pleasure to interview.

Part of Cambridge United's double winners in 2014 – they beat Gosport in the FA Trophy and Hughes scored in the promotion final victory over Gateshead – it feels like he's been around for ages.

Since then he's had spells at north of the border with Inverness as well as a few more Non-League stops including Barrow, Guiseley and Matlock among others.

Last week he moved to Cleethorpes Town after a hugely successful period helping Worksop Town rise from Step 4 to the National League North with 95 goals in 145 games. He even copped the NLP's Step 3 / 4 player of the year at our National Game Awards in 2023.

Over the years he's become a huge outspoken advocate for mental health and trying to help younger players navigate the pitfalls of a football career.

And it's that bigger impact he highlighted when chatting to us about moving onto Cleethorpes and looking back on his time at Worksop.

"The stats speak for themselves and you don't get that from an unhappy player but I like to look at the wider picture," Hughes, who won a promotion-FA Trophy double with Cambridge United in 2014, said. "The whole community feel, the relationship I had with fans, supporting people with issues on the mental health side that I am a big advocate for.

"I always say this, there is a bigger picture than just a game of football. It's how you integrate with people, how to communicate with fans and make the whole place feel like you're all in it together.

"That's something I want to try and achieve at Cleethorpes as well. I don't just see myself as a cog in a machine on a football pitch, there is more to what I hope to bring to a football team than just knocking in a goal every now and then.

"It's bringing people together, sharing success together. Having that impact off the pitch is something I am really excited to try and bring to Cleethorpes."

And Hughes is steadfast in his belief of the power of Non-League football and the people involved.

"For me, it's why you make sacrifices, travel up and down the county," Hughes said. "Non-League football is the epitome of togetherness. It's the backbone of English football. Die hard fans who play their hard earned money to support you.

"When you're trying to achieve things it's sometimes easy to forget why you do it. Non-League is why we love the game. It brings people together.

"Someone could be going through some of the hardest things in your life and that togetherness on a Saturday or Tuesday night, whatever it may be, is enough sometimes to break the back of some really difficult times.

"It certainly saved my life – having a goal to achieve and work towards with my friends and family supporting me.

"It's something I am really passionate about. Non-League football is bigger than just a game. It's people's lives, volunteers sacrificing their time to make a football club what it is. If we can repay that a little bit on the football pitch I am absolutely here for it.

"The reason I play the game is for my friends, my family and all the fans who dedicate their lives to the club. That's not just the Cleethorpes Towns and the Worksops, it's every Non-League supporter across the country. My hat goes off to you! It's amazing."

# SIN BINS

Temporary Dismissals - otherwise known as 'sin bins' - are mandatory for acts of dissent across all of grassroots football.

## HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



### EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

## DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:  
**1st half:** Continues into the 2nd half  
**2nd half:** Continues into extra time  
**Extra time:** Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

## THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent



Dissent caution:  
Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline



Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted



A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play



If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

**Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!**



His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.



**DANIEL AWOKERE** – Joined Boro in the Summer of 2025, Daniel is a defender who normally plays centre half, previous clubs include Welling United.



**DILLON BARNES** – Dillon returns to the Boro after a season away playing for Dulwich Hamlet. An excellent goalkeeper Dillon started his career at Queens Park Rangers. During the 2023/2024 season Dillon made 43 appearances for the Boro.








**JOHNVILLE RENEE** – A full back Johnville has played for several non-league clubs including Braintree Town, Hornchurch and Enfield Town.




