## HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY



The origins of the Club go back to 1907 and the formation of Tufnell Park FC from which the Reserve team broke away in 1911 to form Tufnell Spartans and two name change in 1920 and 1930 saw them playing as Wood Green Town. It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th.in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally. The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North.

The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights which has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. That was also the season when our Free Season Ticket offer was introduced, and will continue for 2025/26, which has increased our then modest attendances to several hundred. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the

Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2. 2024/25 will also long be remembered for similar reasons as it ended with the team in 19th position and so relegated back to the Spartan South Midlands League from which we had departed in 2013. A poor start to the League campaign was camouflaged by early successes in The FA Cup and Trophy competitions but, after elimination from both, league points continued to be scarce until a stirring comeback with an unbeaten run in the last 9 games rekindled hope only to leave us one point from safety. Had just one of several efforts

thwarted by the framework in our last two games found the net we would have been saved. The Under 23s did well to finish 3rd in the Essex Alliance and will play more accurately under the name of "Reserves" this season for there are no age restrictions in that League's Rules. The Women went through the season without drawing a single game and finished 4th with a record of 12 wins and 10 defeats also reaching the Semi-Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup where Arsenal Academy were a little too strong for them. The Under 18s started well especially in Cups but fell away as the season wore on.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all hence the switch to the very well run Essex Alliance.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself. The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially

composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24 and the Semi-final in 2024/25

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Isthmian League after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

## HISTORY OF KEMPSTON ROVERS FC



Kempston Rovers were formed in 1884 and entered the Bedford & District League. Rovers' first league championship was won in 1908 and twelve months later Rovers retained the title while also carrying off the Bedfordshire Senior Cup and North Beds Charity Cup. Rovers joined the South Midlands League in 1927, and while league honours eluded them they continued to enjoy cup success, winning the Senior Cup for a second time in 1938 and winning the Hinchinbrooke Cup in 1926, 1928 and 1932.

The Walnut Boys, the nickname coming from the large walnut orchard in Kempston, joined the United Counties League in 1953 and fortunes took an upturn. After winning the Second Division League and cup double in 1955, Kempston continued to enjoy success as the competition reverted to a single division. Rovers were champions in 1958 and runners-up in 1957 and 1960, while in the Knockout Cup they contested five successive finals between 1957 and 1961, winning the trophy in 1958 and 1960.

When the league returned to a two division format a lack of facilities saw Kempston placed in Division Two. The Hillgrounds facilities were upgraded but after being readmitted to the top flight they suffered instant relegation in 1963 with just five points to their name. A top division place wasn't regained until 1968 when the Rovers finished runners-up in the Second Division.

1973 saw the start of a new era as Kempston relocated to a new ground further down Hillgrounds Road. A magnificent season saw the Walnut Boys storm to the Premier title losing only once in 32 games. A golden period in the club's history saw League Cup successes in 1975 and 1977; the Beds Senior Cup was again captured in 1977 while the Walnut Boys reached the last 16 of the FA Vase in 1975. The club nearly folded in the early eighties and were relegated in 1983, but they bounced back to the top flight in 1986 before moving to the current ground, their third in the same road.

Kempston won the Beds Senior Cup in 1992 and the Hunts Premier Cup and North Beds Charity Cup in 2000. In 2002 Kempston Rovers and Kempston Colts began an alliance to pool resources/personnel under the name AFC Kempston but, unfortunately, the club suffered a fourth relegation from the top flight in 2003. The beginning of 2005 saw the start of major re-developments at Hillgrounds Road with the building of new changing facilities and the building of an artificial training pitch. On the grass, the club fortunes on the pitch turned around which saw The Walnut boys only just missed out on promotion at the end of the 2005/06 season.

The new ground facilities were completed in 2006 and along with a new stand; on-going ground improvements and the existing clubhouse due for refurbishment shortly, AFC Kempston now have some of the best facilities in the area for non-league football.

In 2007 Rovers finished third in division one and the club gained promotion to the Premier Division after spending four seasons in division one. Unfortunately Rovers stay in the premier division was short lived and we were relegated back to Division one after just one season.

The summer of 2008 saw The Walnut Boys completely reshaping the management team, with closer links with Bedford College Football Academy, Dave Randall was appointed 1st team manager with John Guiney acting as assistant, John also managing our midweek Under 18 team and successfully winning The Bedfordshire FA U18 Midweek Challenge Cup beating a strong Stotfold side 3 – 1, for the first time in the clubs history. The senior team also reached the Final of The Bedfordshire FA Senior Trophy losing to 61FC Luton. During the 2010-11 campaign we were fortunate to be winners of Division 1 and also win the Hinchinbrooke Cup for the first time since 1932, which was an extremely proud moment for many Club members and one we hope can be replicated in the near future.

Midway through the 2013-14 Season James Stoyles and Gary Flinn took over the 1st Team duties, ably assisted by our Physio Andy White.

2015-16 Rovers won the UCFL Premier League, with a thrilling final win on the last day of the Season; this saw us move into the Evostik Southern League Central which represents the highest level we have attained within the FA pyramid system so far.

All at Hillgrounds are looking forward to the new season with both excitement and trepidation, and hope you will continue to support the Teams as and when you can.

We hope the future continues to bring rewards both on and off the Pitch, thus enhancing the experience for all our local Partners both old and new.

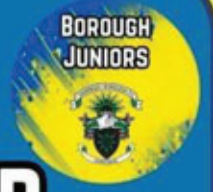

## THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Kempston Rovers, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, referee Joanne Horwood, and assistants Lewis Parkins and Peter Parkins.

On Saturday we achieved a hard fought three points at Wormley. With the windy conditions not helping either team, a curling free kick just after half time that bounced just in front of the keeper and then up and in, settled the game. It's fair to say that no game is safe at 1-0 and despite some nerves in the crowd the team saw the game out. As welcoming as the three points was news that Aylesbury Vale Dynamos had beaten Winslow 3-2 with a winner deep into injury time.

Given the result from Winslow on Monday when they beat Biggleswade United 8-2 it is looking more likely that we will be contesting in the play-offs rather than winning the league. Whilst there are still two games to go Winslow have favourable fixtures both at home against middle of the table teams.

After today's game we have two fixtures arranged away to Cockfosters in the league on Thursday 16th April and the Premier Division Cup Final also against Cockfosters on Wednesday the 22nd April at Stotfold FC. The play off dates are Wednesday 29th April for the semi-finals and Monday 4th May for the final. With two games left if we were to win both, we would guarantee finishing second in the league and guarantee the semi final would be played at Coles Park and if we were to win that, the final would be at home as well.

I'm writing the remainder of these notes prior to the Wormley game as the three games back to back against Biggleswade, Winslow and Risborough for importance are three of the most enjoyable sequence of results I can remember since the play-off games of 2018. The Biggleswade game was covered in the Winslow programme but it is still worthy of a mention in terms of getting to a final, shuffling the team to give rest to players and the result being the perfect preparation for the top of the table clash against Winslow.

Going into the Winslow game I cannot remember a game where there has been such confidence of gaining a victory, considering the opposition were top of the table. Everyone I spoke to was expectant of three points. I don't know if that was because we had already beaten them twice this season or because it was still out of our hands even with a win, so the pressure was released. I don't know. As it was an incredible crowd of 752 saw a totally dominant first half performance, 2-0 up at half time wasn't a true reflection. Goals from Herson a near post flick following a lovely ball played in by Keir and a Jonathan Cash close range finish were the goals, but Matt and Cliff both inexplicably missed gilt edged chances from close range which made for a nervy second half. The nervousness increased when in the 70th minute Winslow scored to make it 2-1 and for the remainder of the game we were very much penned in our own half and despite chances being at a premium it was still too close for comfort and there was much relief at full time. Special mention must go to Dillon Barnes who was uber cool, easily the calmest person in Coles Park. It may not be what he wants to hear but after his foray upfront and at the heart of the defence, Dillon Barnes is a superb goalkeeper and that it where he should stay.

The following Tuesday, 24th March we travelled to Prince Risborough a very grand sounding place to play Risborough Rangers, at the time they were fourth in the league and as was very similar to the Kings Langley away game early in March, it felt it was a must win. Holding our own for the first twenty minutes we had a chance that wasn't taken and then Risborough went the length of the field to score and make it 1-0 and that's how it was at half time. I'm not aware of what was said at half time but whatever it was the team came out a totally different animal, chasing down every ball, harrying the centre backs whenever they were in possession and it was through that tactic a mistake from Risborough was made and Johnny Cash levelled, soon after Herson made it 2-1 after 55 minutes and in torrential rain the Boro were leading. The lead didn't last long with Risborough equalising with a fine goal from the left wing from a tight angle. There's something about this team though that they don't allow themselves to be defeated or down and that was true in this game when Herson, again, scored to make it 3-2. We saw the game out well and went home with all three points so the end of the trilogy, where you had to doff your cap to the team and say well done, what an eight days.

Whilst this won't be our last programme of the season should we finish second or third, I would still like to say thank you to a number of people. Firstly, thank you to Aki, for what he does for the club and the struggles he is having securing a lease for his future involvement has been tough, he gave me the opportunity to get more involved in the club and I'm genuinely thankful for that. He is our number one fan and for everyone

that has had to answer someone that has asked, "who is that guy going crazy over there?", "That's our Chairman!!", we've all been there. Thank you to Johnny Fitsiou, the go-to person, always provides quick responses and as I'm an impatient person that is a key. Given the past few seasons, it's been great to see the smile back on Tom's face, always approachable to us, Tom wears his heart on his sleeve and to see him back laughing and joking has been great. The same is true, albeit he is always smiling, of Tucker. Supporting them they have Lys Demetriou the kit manager, Courteney Foster our physio and our very own and very popular Trevor, our goalkeeping coach. Thank you also to Dave Cumberbatch always good to get Dave's view on players and his thoughts on the team. I would love the season to end successfully for them all, given the amount of time and effort they all invest in making Haringey Borough what it is.

I know football folk turn their noses up at us having a digital programme but a lot of work still goes into producing it, thank you to Richard Brickell, our programme editor, to John for his contributions and to Gerard for the travel and pubs section. Happy for others to contribute if you have ideas.

Thank you to those that create the match day experience for not only the fans but for the opposition, Alan, Dave, Harry and Vinny in the board room, the volunteers, Dewi, Gerard, Jenny, Kenny, Lawrence, Marco, Rick, Trey, Scott and Soulla. Thank you to the social media team of Dave and Leo, for keeping us up to date with everything, also, if it wasn't for them listing the substitutions and the time of events, I'd actually have to take note of what was going on in the game! Dave has been particularly helpful in creating content and organising photographers, I know how much time he invests and how much he wants to promote the club. He has also been instrumental alongside Ben Bloom in the introduction of the Borough Bulletin, thank you Ben, an excellent initiative, and Dave top notch for everything you do!

The Women's team held together by the amazing Karla Parker continues to go from strength to strength with a Plate final still to come in May. Bobby Cato and Adem Ali have done a great job over the past few seasons creating a team to be proud of. I still remember Karla giving a speech at a presentation night approx. 7-8 years ago about the struggles of the team that almost had us all in tears, the team have come a long way since then.

Our men's reserve team have given opportunities to young players and players returning from injury, there is always a fine line between developing a winning team and providing a platform for players irrespective of the result, under the leadership of Jamie O'Donoghue, Junior Fenton and Michael Smith the team have had a mixed season but should be proud of providing players such as Marco Magunga, who has featured regularly for the first team this season.

The same dilemma about results versus progress is true of the U18s, with James Edgerley, Reuben Durate and Glen Hicks overseeing the college team, it has been a tough season but again giving opportunities to young men starting their football careers.

After a few disappointing seasons it has been lovely to see our hardcore Haringey Borough stalwarts playing so well and in a successful side. Scott, Jorge, MoD and Matt. Complemented with a few returning heroes, Sami, Coby, Dillon and Stef. What has been amazing is how the new players, Cashey, Keir and Herson have thrown themselves into the cause and bonded with the supporters. I do want to give special mention to Adrian Clifton, who in my opinion has had a massive influence on the team and the club, his will to win, his professionalism and the way he plays has dragged us from licking our wounds into a proper football team. I've thoroughly enjoyed watching Cliff this season and I hope we see him for many more seasons to come.

There is so much to what makes this club great and there are so many people involved in creating and setting the welcoming environment that is Haringey Borough. The growth of the Junior Boro section has been amazing, the hard work that both Emma O'Donoghue and Chloe have put in to making it a successful is fantastic, to see the number of children on the pitch at the end of games, is truly wonderful. The initiative of having a mascot as every game and the joy that brings is fantastic and then there is the half time penalty shootout, where the pantomime villain Trevor makes you earn the right to score past him, there's no gimmies with Trev in goal. If you've not seen the half time penalties it's probably because you're being served by Apples and Gina running the bar, thank you both, for looking after us all.

A lot of people give up their time and invest it in the Boro, it is difficult to express how much there is to do and to be done in the running of a football club. Setting the standard for devotion to the club is John Bacon. Not only in still keeping his hand in with the admin of the Women's and Reserve fixtures but his dedication in attending Reserve games on a Friday night, first team games on a Saturday and Women's team games on a

Sunday, he must be able to do the drive from his home to Coles Park blindfolded and his car could probably drive itself the number of times he has undertaken the journey.

Finally, thank you goes to you the fans, to see so many familiar faces week in week out and the friendship bonds that have been formed through coming to watch the Boro is very special, there isn't a day that goes by without interacting with someone I've met through Haringey Borough, I suppose that is what makes football so brilliant bringing people together. The crowds that we have generated both home and away have been a joy to see and I expect there will be a big crowd today, let's try and actually enjoy the rest of the season and see what it brings.

Enjoy the game, let's get behind the team and let's help get the three points on offer. Come on Boro.

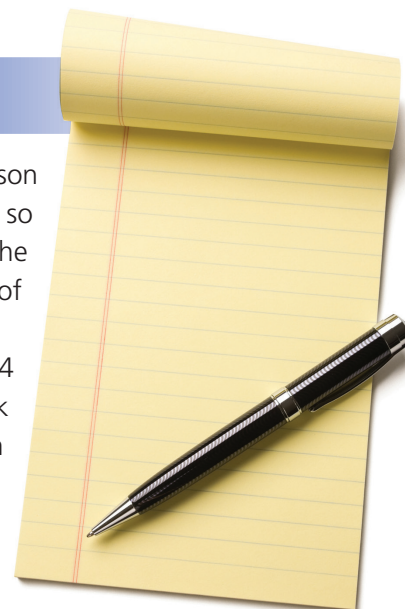

## THE (FORMER) SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

Although formed in 1884, making them 23 years older than us, this season is the first in which both Clubs First Teams have been in the same League so our visit to their Hillgrounds Stadium on 14th February, which we won by the game's only goal, was the first between teams playing under the names of Kempston Rovers and Haringey Borough

But the Rovers played under the name of AFC Kempston Rovers from 2004 to 2016 and there were two meetings during that time both at Coles Park in the Extra Preliminary Round of the FA Cup with Borough winning 2-0 on 20th August 2011 and Rovers winning 3-1 on 11th August 2012.

During their AFC period our respective Womens teams, for one season, were both in the Premier Division of the Eastern Region Womens League – the first meeting being Borough's 8-0 win at Coles Park on 1st October 2006 with the return game at Hillgrounds on 10th December 2006 ending 4-4



## WOMENS TEAM UPDATE

Their League campaign has long since become a "just complete the fixtures" affair. The yield from the last 7 games has been only 2 points and had that haul been replicated throughout the season relegation would have been the outcome. Fortunately at the end of 2025 we already had 19 points from 11 games so the 7 points collected in the first 3 games of 2026 were sufficient to avoid that fate but had those 3 been lost we would have been in a dog fight, ultimately just successful, with Hutton and Enfield Town to avoid the drop. We finish our League matches tomorrow with a visit to Clarence Park to meet St. Albans City with a mid-table finish already guaranteed. That mention should be made of "mid-table" is astonishing bearing in mind that there was a time in the autumn when hopes of the Championship were not entirely wishful thinking; but congratulations to unbeaten Stevenage who have already clinched that with 2 games still to play

# SIN BINS

Temporary Dismissals - otherwise known as 'sin bins' - are mandatory for acts of dissent across all of grassroots football.

## HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



### EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

## DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:  
**1st half:** Continues into the 2nd half  
**2nd half:** Continues into extra time  
**Extra time:** Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

## THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent



Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline



Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted



A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play



If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

**Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!**

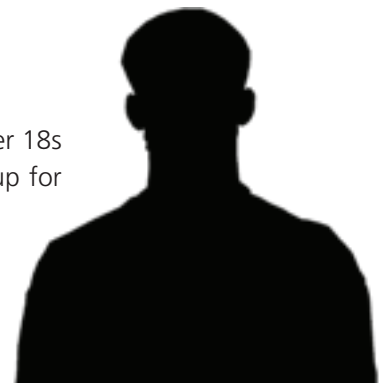

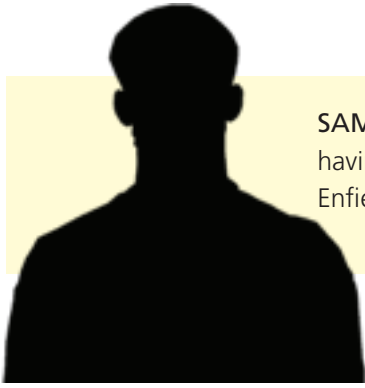
**DANIEL AWOKERE** – Joined Boro in the Summer of 2025, Daniel is a defender who normally plays centre half, previous clubs include Welling United.

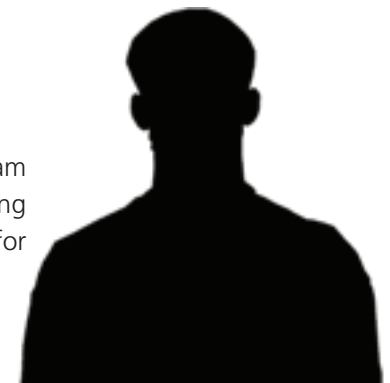

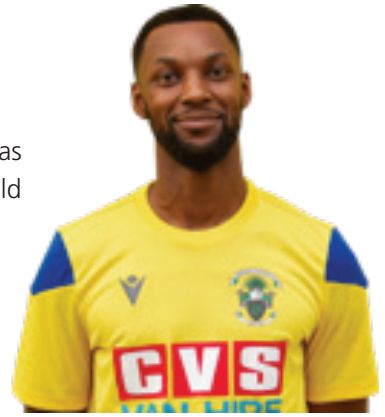


**STEFANOS GEORGIU** – Stef rejoins from Harlow Town following a successful spell for us for two seasons from 2022, making over 50 appearances.

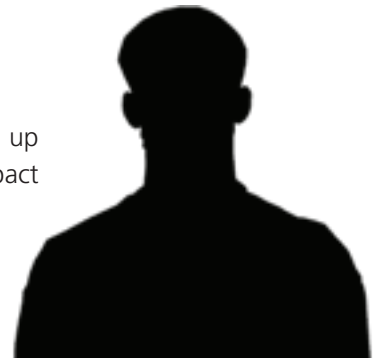

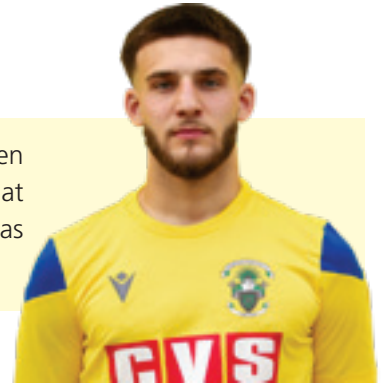
